The changes are as follows:

Addition of N Montgomery from Greenfield to E Garrard Rd

This street was originally slated to be on the street improvement list for 2024 but was removed as we believed this street would be improved via the SS4A Grant. After preliminary study for the SS4A grant, it was apparent that N Montgomery did not meet the required criteria to qualify for SS4A funds. Due to the roads current condition, we feel it is imperative to improve the street as soon as possible.

Addition of E Lee Blvd Striping

This consists of striping center line, edge and parallel parking along the City’s portion of E Lee Blvd. The parallel parking striping will be pay-for-parking via ParkMobile as seen in other parts of the City.

Removal of S Washington St from W Lampkin St to RR Bridge

Unexpected drainage problems were encountered on this street. Several runs of storm pipe will need to be replaced prior to any road rehabilitation. This street is intended to be part of the 2025 Street Improvement Project.

Removal of Colonel Muldrow Ave

“The Landing” development on the corner of Colonel Muldrow Ave and University Dr is currently under construction. This development includes construction which may damage the road. We think it would be wise to wait on rehabilitating this road this year in order to not have the new overlay damaged by the adjacent construction. This street is intended to be part of the 2025 Street Improvement Project.

Removal of Winterset Dr and Heritage Place

These roads were originally slated for crack sealing & microsurfacing. The condition of these roads was worse than anticipated upon further investigation. These roads should be overlaid in the near future.

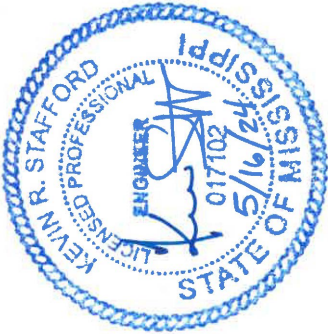

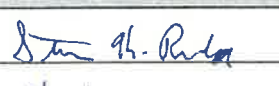
