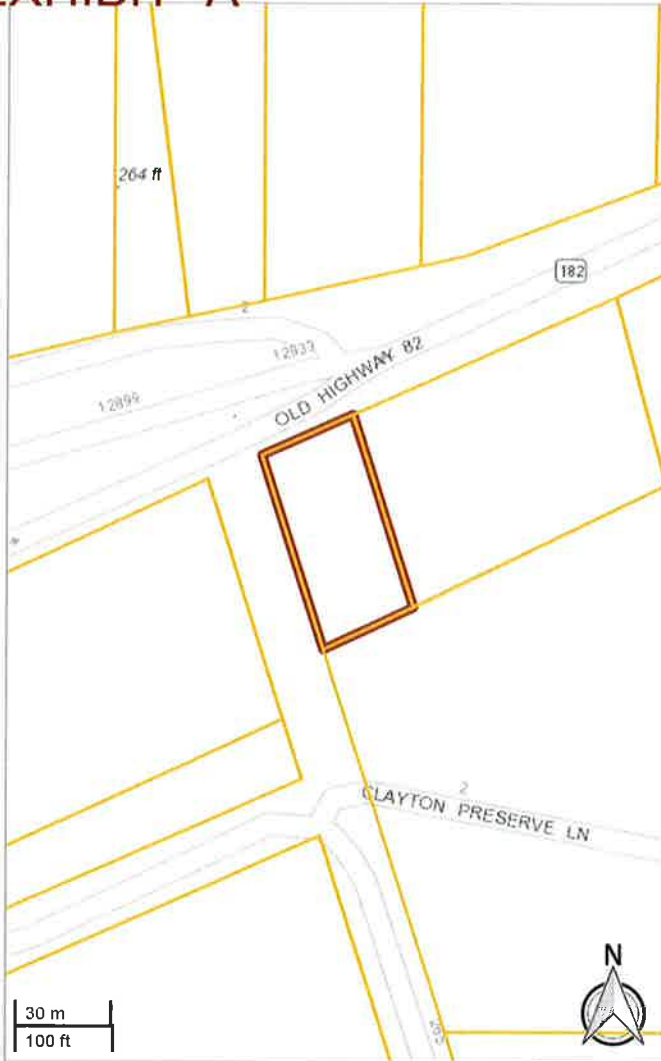

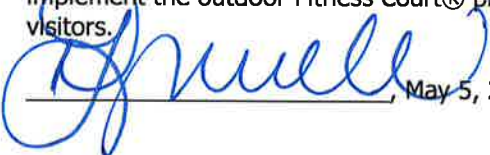

Any additional information that is not physically observable, such as size, depth, or material, will only be depicted on the survey if such information is provided to the surveyor by others.



RIGHT-OF-WAY SURVEY:

Neel-Schaffer, Inc. will establish right-of-way lines throughout the project area utilizing the Official Map of the City of Starkville, subdivision plats and deed research. Side lines of private property that join and lie adjacent to the right-of-way will be established by survey. Current owners/parcel numbers will be labeled per tax records. This scope of work does not include individual boundary surveys of the entire parcels lying inside or touching the project area.

**AGREEMENT FOR ENGINEERING AND PROFESSIONAL SERVICES
BY AND BETWEEN

This AGREEMENT made this 19th day of December, 2024, by and between CITY OF STARKVILLE, after this called "OWNER", and NEEL-SCHAFFER, INC., having its principal place of business at 1115 Stark Road, Starkville, Mississippi 39760, after this called the "ENGINEER".

I. DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES

OWNER intends to engage the ENGINEER to provide engineering and professional services. It is anticipated that the engineering and professional services will be performed by individual task orders and will consist of the following three general types of work:

Type 1: Hourly rate services as directed by OWNER, no fee limitations: Engineering and professional services may be provided in conjunction with, but not limited to, project planning, engineering analysis and evaluations, reports of findings and presentations, grant application planning and submittals, surveys and project layouts, design engineering, construction engineering, cost estimates, mapping, master plan studies and preparation, interaction with regulatory agencies, general consulting services and any other professional services deemed appropriate by the OWNER. These tasks will be undertaken with direction by the OWNER's representatives. The ENGINEER will document the type 1 tasks in the monthly invoice. The OWNER can engage the ENGINEER for Type 1 services in any verbal or written communication.

Type 2: Such services shall typically consist of the same services described under Type 1 services. The ENGINEER will document Type 2 service requests with a written scope of services and estimated man-hours. E-mail can be used for written documentation and approval. Type 2 services can be engaged by the OWNER's Representatives

Type 3: Such services shall typically consist of the same services described under Type 1 services. The ENGINEER will prepare a task order with a defined scope of work, schedule, hourly rate not-to-exceed or lump sum fee, and is to be approved by the OWNER before work begins.

II. ADDITIONAL SERVICES

ENGINEER will provide services in accordance with the Exhibit A, "General Terms and Conditions" attached to and made a part of this AGREEMENT. The OWNER will pay ENGINEER for additional services not specified as Types 1, 2, or 3 on the same basis as for Types 1, 2, or 3 services. For services of independent professional associates and consultants employed by ENGINEER, OWNER will pay ENGINEER the amount billed to ENGINEER times a factor of 1.0. Performance of Additional Services and employment of independent professional associates and consultants by ENGINEER will require prior written authorization from OWNER. ENGINEER will submit monthly statements for services rendered.

III. PAYMENT FOR SERVICES

OWNER will pay **ENGINEER** for Type 1, 2, and 3 services on the actual labor rate for the individuals involved times a labor mark-up (LMU) of 2.9. Reimbursable expenses will be billed in addition to the labor costs. Subconsultant expenses and independent professional associate expenses will be billed to **OWNER** at their actual cost to **ENGINEER** times a factor of 1.0. Other reimbursable expenses will be billed to **OWNER** at the **ENGINEER**'s actual cost. Type 3 services may also be negotiated and paid for on a lump sum basis.

Direct Labor Costs used as basis of payment shall mean salaries and wages (basic and incentive) paid to all **ENGINEER**'s personnel engaged directly on the Project including, but not limited to, engineers, surveyors, designers, technicians, inspectors, secretaries, and all other professional, technical and administrative classified personnel; but does not include indirect payroll related costs or fringe benefits.

Both **OWNER** and **ENGINEER** recognize that certain occasions may arise for which the methods of payment to **ENGINEER** set forth in this **AGREEMENT** may not be appropriate or fair to either or both parties. On these occasions, the methods of payment will be negotiated separately, and terms agreed to will be stated on the individual task orders which will supersede the methods of payment specified in the **AGREEMENT**.

IV. TIME SCHEDULE

This **AGREEMENT** shall remain in effect for one year from the date of the contract being executed by both parties and will be automatically renewed annually or will terminate when a new contract is executed.

V. CHANGES TO AGREEMENT

This **AGREEMENT**, along with Exhibit A, "General Terms and Conditions", consisting of five pages represent the complete **AGREEMENT** between **OWNER** and **ENGINEER** and may only be amended, supplemented, modified or canceled by a duly executed written instrument.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

1. **Relationship between Consultant and Client.** Neel-Schaffer, Inc. ("Consultant") shall serve as the Client's professional consultant in those phases of the Project to which this Agreement applies. The relationship is that of a buyer and seller of professional services and it is understood that the parties have not entered into any joint venture or partnership with the other. Consultant shall not be considered to be the agent or fiduciary of the Client.
2. **Responsibility of Consultant.** Consultant will perform services under this Agreement in a manner consistent with that standard of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the profession currently practicing in the same locality under similar conditions (the "Standard of Care"). No other representation, warranty or guarantee, express or implied, is included or intended in this Agreement or in any report, opinion, document, or otherwise.
3. **Responsibility of the Client.** Client shall provide all information and criteria as to its requirements for the Project, including budgetary limitations. Client shall arrange for Consultant to enter upon public and private property and obtain all necessary approvals required from all governmental authorities having jurisdiction over the Project. Client shall give prompt written notice to Consultant whenever Client observes or otherwise becomes aware of any development that affects the scope or timing of Consultant's services.

The Client shall promptly report to the Consultant any defects or suspected defects in the Consultant's services of which the Client becomes aware, so that Consultant may take measures to minimize the consequences of such a defect. Should legal liability for the defects exist, failure by the Client to notify the Consultant shall relieve the Consultant of any liability for costs of remedying the defects above the sum such remedy would have cost had prompt notification been given when such defects were first discovered.
4. **Construction Phase Services.** If Consultant's scope of services includes the observation and monitoring of work performed by Client's separate contractors, Consultant shall provide personnel to observe and monitor the work in accordance with the Standard of Care in order to ascertain that it is being performed, in general, in accordance with the plans and specifications. Consultant shall not supervise, direct, or have control over the contractor's work. Consultant shall not have authority over or responsibility for construction means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures or for safety precautions and programs in connection with the work of the contractor. Consultant does not guarantee the performance of the construction contract by the contractor and does not assume responsibility for the contractor's failure to furnish and perform its work in accordance with the plans and specifications.
5. **Designation of Authorized Representatives.** Each party shall designate one or more persons to act with authority on its behalf with respect to appropriate aspects of the Project. The persons designated shall review and respond promptly to all communications received from the party.
6. **Ownership of Documents.** All reports, notes, drawings, specifications, data, calculations, and other documents, including those in electronic form prepared by Consultant are instruments of Consultant's service that shall remain Consultant's property. The Client agrees not to use Consultant generated documents for projects other than the project for which the documents were prepared by Consultant, or for future modifications to the Project, without Consultant's express written permission. Any reuse or distribution to third parties without such express written permission or project-specific adaptation by Consultant will be at the Client's sole risk and without liability to Consultant or its employees, subsidiaries, and subconsultants.
7. **Opinion of Costs.** When required as a part of its scope of services, Consultant will furnish opinions or estimates of construction cost on the basis of Consultant's experience and qualifications, but Consultant does not guarantee the accuracy of such estimates. The parties recognize that Consultant has no control over the cost of labor, material, equipment, or services furnished by others or over market conditions or contractors' methods of determining prices.
8. **Changes or Delays.** In the event new developments or circumstances beyond the control of Consultant require a change in the scope of services or schedule, Consultant shall be entitled to an equitable adjustment to the fee and/or schedule. Such events include, but are not limited to, unreasonable delays caused by Client's failure to provide specified direction or information, delays caused by Client's other contractors or consultants, or if Consultant's failure to perform is due to any act of God, labor shortage, fire, inclement weather, act of governmental authority, failure of transportation, accident, power failure, or interruption or any other cause beyond the reasonable control of Consultant.

9. **Suspension of Services.** Client may, at any time, by written notice, suspend further services by Consultant. Upon receipt of such notice, Consultant shall take all reasonable steps to mitigate costs allocable to the suspended services. Client, however, shall pay all reasonable and necessary costs associated with such suspension including the cost of assembling documents, personnel and equipment, rescheduling or reassignment costs necessary to maintain continuity and the staff required to resume the services upon expiration of the suspension. Consultant will not be obligated to provide the same personnel in the event the period of any suspension exceeds 30 days.
10. **Termination.** This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon 30 days' written to the other party. Upon such termination, Client shall pay Consultant for all services performed up to the date of termination. If Client is the terminating party, Client shall pay Consultant all reasonable cost and expenses incurred by Consultant in effecting the termination, including but not limited to non-cancellable commitments and demobilization costs, if any.
11. **Indemnification.** Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless Client from and against those damages and costs (including reasonable attorneys' fees) that Client incurs as a result of third party claims for personal injury or property damage to the extent caused by the negligent acts, errors or omissions of Consultant.
12. **Legal Proceedings.** In the event Consultant or its employees are required by Client to provide testimony, answer interrogatories, produce documents or otherwise provide information in relation to any litigation, arbitration, proceeding or other inquiry arising out of Consultant's services, where Consultant is not a party to such proceeding, Client will compensate Consultant for its services and reimburse Consultant for all related direct costs incurred in connection with providing such testimony or information. This provision shall not apply in the event Client engages Consultant to provide expert testimony or litigation support, which services shall be the subject of a separate agreement or an amendment to this Agreement.
13. **Successors and Assigns.** The terms of this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and assigns; provided however, that neither party shall assign this Agreement in whole or in part without the prior written consent of the other party.
14. **Insurance.** Consultant agrees to maintain the following insurance coverage with the following limits of insurance during the performance of Consultant's work hereunder:
- (a) Commercial General Liability insurance with standard ISO coverage and available limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 general aggregate;
 - (b) Automobile Liability insurance with standard ISO coverage and available combined single limits of \$1,000,000 per accident;
 - (c) Worker's Compensation insurance with limits as required by statute and Employer's Liability insurance with limits of \$1,000,000 per employee for bodily injury by accident/\$1,000,000 per employee for bodily injury by disease/\$1,000,000 policy limit for disease; and
 - (d) Professional Liability insurance covering Consultant's negligent acts, errors, or omissions in the performance of professional services with available limits of \$1,000,000 per claim and annual aggregate.
- Consultant shall provide evidence of procuring the above insurance coverages by delivering a certificate of insurance to Client prior to the start of Consultant's work and annually upon renewal of coverage. Consultant shall cause Client to be named as an additional insured on Consultant's commercial general liability policy, which shall be primary and noncontributory.
15. **Information Provided by the Client.** Consultant shall be entitled to rely upon, without liability, the accuracy and completeness of any and all information provided by Client, without the obligation of independent verification.
16. **Omitted.**
17. **Payment.** Unless agreed to otherwise, Consultant shall submit monthly invoices to the Client. Payment in full shall be due upon receipt of the invoice. Payment of any invoices by the Client shall be taken to mean that the Client is satisfied with the Consultant's services to the date of the payment and is not aware of any deficiencies in those services. If payments are delinquent after 45 days from invoice date, the Client agrees to pay interest on the unpaid balance at the rate of one percent (1%) per month. If the Client fails to make payments; then Consultant, after giving seven (7) days written notice to the Client, may suspend services until the Client has paid in full all amounts due for services, expenses, and other related charges without recourse to the Client for loss or damage caused by such suspension. The Client waives any and all claims against the Consultant for any such suspension. Payment for Consultant's services is not contingent on any factor, except the Consultant's ability to provide services in a manner consistent with

- that Standard of Care. Payment of invoices shall not be subject to any discounts, set-offs or back-charges unless agreed to in writing by both parties. If the Client contests an invoice, the Client may withhold only that portion so contested and shall pay the undisputed portion, after the Client has notified Consultant in writing within 30 days of receiving the invoice and shall identify the specific cause of the disagreement and the amount in dispute.
18. **Force Majeure.** Neither Client nor Consultant shall be liable for any fault or delay caused by any contingency beyond their control, including but not limited to, acts of God, wars, strikes, walkouts, fires, natural calamities, or demands or requirements of governmental agencies.
19. **Compliance with Laws.** To the extent they apply to its employees or its services, Consultant shall exercise due professional care to comply with all applicable laws, including ordinances of any political subdivisions or governing agencies.
20. **Invalid Terms.** If any provisions of this Agreement are held to be invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and binding as if the unenforceable provisions were never included in the Agreement.
21. **Governing Law.** This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the state where the services are performed.
22. **Dispute Resolution.** All disputes, controversies or claims, of whatever kind or character, between the Parties, their agents and/or principals, arising out of or in connection with the subject matter of this Agreement shall be litigated in a court of competent jurisdiction.
23. **Additional Services.** Consultant shall be entitled to an equitable adjustment of its fee for services resulting from significant changes in the general scope, extent or character of the Project or its design including, but not limited to, changes in size, complexity, Client's schedule, construction schedule, character of construction or method of financing; and revising previously accepted studies, reports, design documents or other documents when such revisions are required by changes in laws, rules, regulations, ordinances, codes or orders enacted subsequent to the preparation of such studies, reports or documents, or are due to any other causes beyond Consultant's control.
24. **Amendment.** This Agreement may only be amended in writing and where such amendment is executed by a duly authorized representatives of each party.
25. **Entire Understanding of Agreement.** This Agreement represents and incorporates the entire understanding of the parties hereto, and each party acknowledges that there are no warranties, representations, covenants or understandings of any kind, matter or description whatsoever, made by either party to the other except as expressly set forth herein. Client and Consultant hereby agree that any purchase orders, invoices, confirmations, acknowledgments or other similar documents executed or delivered with respect to the subject matter hereof that conflict with the terms of this Agreement shall be null, void and without effect to the extent they conflict with the terms of this Agreement.
26. **Survival of Provisions.** The provisions of this Agreement shall continue to be binding upon the parties hereto notwithstanding termination of this Agreement for any reason.
27. **Nonwaiver.** No waiver by a party of any provision of this Agreement shall be deemed to have been made unless in writing and signed by such party.
28. **Identity of Project Owner.** Within ten (10) days of the entry of this Agreement, Client, if Client is not the Project Owner, shall provide to Consultant the Project Owner's full legal name; Project Owner's physical address; Project Owner's mailing address; and the name, physical address and mailing address of the Client's point of contact with the Owner for the Project.
29. **Conflicting Terms.** In the event that there are multiple agreements with varying or conflicting terms and conditions between Client and Consultant, the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement shall supersede and have precedence over any other conflicting terms and conditions contained in any other written or oral agreement.
30. **Course of Dealing.** Client and Consultant agree that these General Terms and Conditions establish a course of dealing between them and shall apply to this and all other services, projects, agreements or dealings between the them, unless Client or Consultant gives the other written notice of objection to any term or condition before commencement of performance in connection with any other provision of services or projects involving the two of them.

COPYRIGHTS

Both the Client and the Consultant will hold joint copyright ownership of all work products, including but not limited to designs, reports, data, and other deliverables created during the course of this project. This shared ownership applies during and after the production process.

PERMISSIONS AND RELEASES

The Client agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Consultant against any and all claims, costs, and expenses, including attorney's fees, due to materials included in the Services at the request of the Client for which no copyright permission or previous release was requested or uses which exceed the uses allowed pursuant to a permission or release.

BILLING AND PAYMENT POLICIES

In contracting with the Consultant, the Client warrants that sufficient funds are available to compensate the Consultant for work performed during the next billing cycle based on the agreed hourly rate. These funds are neither encumbered nor contingent upon subsequent approvals, permits, or financing commitments.

The Consultant will submit monthly invoices to the Client. Invoices are due and payable upon receipt and become delinquent if not paid in full 30 calendar days after their invoice date. The Client must notify the Consultant of any dispute regarding invoices received within seven calendar days of receipt of invoice. Only the disputed portion of the payment may be withheld. Interest charges will be applied at rate of 1.5% to delinquent accounts.

Account delinquency longer than 60 calendar days will result in the stoppage of work by the Consultant and any subconsultants. Seven calendar days' notice must be given prior to stoppage of work to enable accounts to be brought current. Work will recommence upon payment of all fees and service charges due. In some cases, additional fees may be required to stop and start work because of account delinquency.

TERMINATION

This Agreement may be terminated for cause upon seven calendar days' written notice, as follows:

The Client may terminate for their sole convenience.



The Client may terminate in the event of the cancellation of funds, a change of priorities, or cancellation of a program with no right of appeal available to the Consultant.

The Client or Consultant may terminate for failure of the other party to perform substantially in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

The Consultant may terminate if the project is suspended for more than 90 calendar days.

When this Agreement is terminated, the Client shall reimburse the Consultant for work actually and properly performed by the Consultant up to the date of termination.

The Client has the right to monitor performance, certification, and any subsequent recourse available in the event of default or non-performance by the Consultant.

DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Mediation

If a dispute arises between the parties to this Agreement, the Client and the Consultant agree that the dispute will be subject to mediation as a condition precedent to binding dispute resolution. If such matter relates to or is the subject of a lien arising out of the Consultant's services, the Consultant may proceed in accordance with applicable law to comply with the lien notice or filing deadlines before resolution of the matter by mediation or by binding dispute resolution.

The Client and the Consultant will endeavor to resolve claims, disputes, and other matters in question between them by mediation, which, unless the parties mutually agree otherwise, will be in accordance with the United States Arbitration & Mediation Rules of Arbitration. A request for mediation must be made in writing, delivered to the other party to this Agreement, and filed with the person or entity administering the mediation. The request may be made concurrent with the filing of a complaint or other appropriate demand for binding dispute resolution but, in such event, mediation will proceed in advance of binding dispute resolution proceedings, which will be stayed pending mediation for a period of 60 calendar days from the date of filing, unless stayed for a longer period by agreement of the parties or court order. If an arbitration proceeding is stayed pursuant to this Section 13.A, the parties may nonetheless proceed to the selection of the arbitrator(s) and agree upon a schedule for later proceedings.



The parties will share the mediator's fee and any filing fees equally. The mediation must be held in the place where the Project is located unless another location is mutually agreed upon. Agreements reached in mediation will be enforceable as settlement agreements in any court having jurisdiction.

If the parties do not resolve a dispute through mediation, the method of binding dispute resolution will be Arbitration as specified in Section 13.B below.

Arbitration

If the parties have selected arbitration as the method for binding dispute resolution in this Agreement, any claim, dispute, or other matter in question arising out of or related to this Agreement subject to, but not resolved by, mediation will be subject to arbitration, which, unless the parties mutually agree otherwise, will be in accordance with the United States Arbitration & Mediation Rules of Arbitration. A demand for arbitration must be made in writing, delivered to the other party to this Agreement, and filed with the person or entity administering the arbitration.

A demand for arbitration may not be made earlier than concurrently with the filing of a request for mediation, but in no event may it be made after the date when the institution of legal or equitable proceedings based on the claim, dispute or other matter in question would be barred by the applicable statute of limitations. For statute of limitations purposes, receipt of a written demand for arbitration by the person or entity administering the arbitration will constitute the institution of legal or equitable proceedings based on the claim, dispute, or other matter in question.

The foregoing agreement to arbitrate, and other agreements to arbitrate with an additional person or entity duly consented to by parties to this Agreement, shall be specifically enforceable in accordance with applicable law in any court having jurisdiction thereof.

The award rendered by the arbitrator(s) will be final, and judgment may be entered upon it in accordance with applicable law in any court having jurisdiction.

Consolidation or Joinder

Either party, at its sole discretion, may consolidate an arbitration conducted under this Agreement with any other arbitration to which it is a party provided that (1) the arbitration agreement governing the other arbitration permits consolidation; (2) the arbitrations to be consolidated substantially involve common questions of law



or fact; and (3) the arbitrations employ materially similar procedural rules and methods for selecting arbitrator(s).

Either party, at its sole discretion, may include by joinder persons or entities substantially involved in a common question of law or fact whose presence is required if complete relief is to be accorded in arbitration, provided that the party sought to be joined consents in writing to such joinder. Consent to arbitration involving an additional person or entity will not constitute consent to arbitration of any claim, dispute or other matter in question not described in the written consent.

The Consultant and Client grant to any person or entity made a party to an arbitration conducted under this Section 13 Dispute Resolution, whether by joinder or consolidation, the same rights of joinder and consolidation as the Owner and Architect under this Agreement.

The provisions of this Section 13 Dispute Resolution will survive the termination of this Agreement.

MISCELLANEOUS

This Agreement is governed by the law of the place where the Project is located.

This scope of work outlines a planning and schematic design effort to transform Lee Boulevard into a safe, comfortable, and inviting multimodal corridor connecting residential areas to the Mississippi State University campus. The project will emphasize improved conditions for walking, bicycling, and other micromobility means, while maintaining appropriate vehicular access. The resulting plans, graphics, and cost estimates will support a competitive application for Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) funding for final design and construction.

- Conduct project kickoff meeting with the City of Starkville and Mississippi State University

- Review opportunities, constraints, and corridor priorities
- Develop consensus on preferred multimodal strategies and key connections

- Prepare schematic-level plan drawings in CAD for Lee Boulevard
- Include:
 - Final long-term design concept

 - Hardscape elements (sidewalks, crossings, curb extensions, etc.)
 - Traffic striping and lane configurations
 - Landscape and streetscape elements

b. Construction Cost Estimate

- Develop an opinion of probable construction cost based on the schematic design

GENERAL INFORMATION:

1. Survey limits will consist of the area shown below.
2. Scale shall be as large as possible to fit on 22 x 34 sheets.
3. Title block shall include name of client (owner); name, address, and registration number of Engineer/Surveyor; date and Engineer's/Surveyor's file number.
4. Hard copy of the original drawing, .pdf and/or a CD or email of the complete site survey with Neel-Schaffer, Inc. title block in AutoCAD 2025 format shall be provided.
5. Final survey shall bear the appropriate seal of the licensed individual responsible for the accuracy.

TOPOGRAPHIC SURVEY:

1. Location and description of a minimum of two horizontal/vertical control points/benchmarks.
2. Contours at 1-foot intervals. 3d Surface will be provided in the CAD file.
3. Spot elevations to be taken on an approximate 25'x 25' grid spacing. Spot grades will not be shown on the face of the plat, but data will be provided in the electronic CAD file. Raw point files can be provided upon request.
4. Drainage items to include but not limited to open gutter, culverts, pipes, inlets, swales and ditches with size, type and depth.

This AGREEMENT made this 19th day of December, 2024, by and between CITY OF STARKVILLE, after this called "OWNER", and NEEL-SCHAFFER, INC., having its principal place of business at 1115 Stark Road, Starkville, Mississippi 39760, after this called the "ENGINEER".

I. DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES

OWNER intends to engage the ENGINEER to provide engineering and professional services. It is anticipated that the engineering and professional services will be performed by individual task orders and will consist of the following three general types of work:

Type 1: Hourly rate services as directed by OWNER, no fee limitations: Engineering and professional services may be provided in conjunction with, but not limited to, project planning, engineering analysis and evaluations, reports of findings and presentations, grant application planning and submittals, surveys and project layouts, design engineering, construction engineering, cost estimates, mapping, master plan studies and preparation, interaction with regulatory agencies, general consulting services and any other professional services deemed appropriate by the OWNER. These tasks will be undertaken with direction by the OWNER's representatives. The ENGINEER will document the type 1 tasks in the monthly invoice. The OWNER can engage the ENGINEER for Type 1 services in any verbal or written communication.

Type 2: Such services shall typically consist of the same services described under Type 1 services. The ENGINEER will document Type 2 service requests with a written scope of services and estimated man-hours. E-mail can be used for written documentation and approval. Type 2 services can be engaged by the OWNER's Representatives

Type 3: Such services shall typically consist of the same services described under Type 1 services. The ENGINEER will prepare a task order with a defined scope of work, schedule, hourly rate not-to-exceed or lump sum fee, and is to be approved by the OWNER before work begins.

II. ADDITIONAL SERVICES

ENGINEER will provide services in accordance with the Exhibit A, "General Terms and Conditions" attached to and made a part of this AGREEMENT. The OWNER will pay ENGINEER for additional services not specified as Types 1, 2, or 3 on the same basis as for Types 1, 2, or 3 services. For services of independent professional associates and consultants employed by ENGINEER, OWNER will pay ENGINEER the amount billed to ENGINEER times a factor of 1.0. Performance of Additional Services and employment of independent professional associates and consultants by ENGINEER will require prior written authorization from OWNER. ENGINEER will submit monthly statements for services rendered.

III. PAYMENT FOR SERVICES

OWNER will pay **ENGINEER** for Type 1, 2, and 3 services on the actual labor rate for the individuals involved times a labor mark-up (LMU) of 2.9. Reimbursable expenses will be billed in addition to the labor costs. Subconsultant expenses and independent professional associate expenses will be billed to **OWNER** at their actual cost to **ENGINEER** times a factor of 1.0. Other reimbursable expenses will be billed to **OWNER** at the **ENGINEER**'s actual cost. Type 3 services may also be negotiated and paid for on a lump sum basis.

Direct Labor Costs used as basis of payment shall mean salaries and wages (basic and incentive) paid to all **ENGINEER**'s personnel engaged directly on the Project including, but not limited to, engineers, surveyors, designers, technicians, inspectors, secretaries, and all other professional, technical and administrative classified personnel; but does not include indirect payroll related costs or fringe benefits.

Both **OWNER** and **ENGINEER** recognize that certain occasions may arise for which the methods of payment to **ENGINEER** set forth in this **AGREEMENT** may not be appropriate or fair to either or both parties. On these occasions, the methods of payment will be negotiated separately, and terms agreed to will be stated on the individual task orders which will supersede the methods of payment specified in the **AGREEMENT**.

IV. TIME SCHEDULE

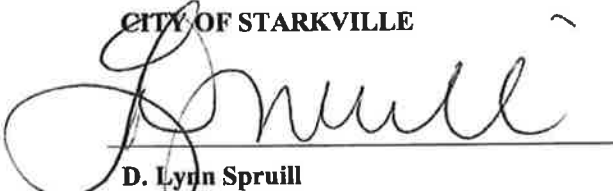
This **AGREEMENT** shall remain in effect for one year from the date of the contract being executed by both parties and will be automatically renewed annually or will terminate when a new contract is executed.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

1. **Relationship between Consultant and Client.** Neel-Schaffer, Inc. ("Consultant") shall serve as the Client's professional consultant in those phases of the Project to which this Agreement applies. The relationship is that of a buyer and seller of professional services and it is understood that the parties have not entered into any joint venture or partnership with the other. Consultant shall not be considered to be the agent or fiduciary of the Client.
2. **Responsibility of Consultant.** Consultant will perform services under this Agreement in a manner consistent with that standard of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the profession currently practicing in the same locality under similar conditions (the "Standard of Care"). No other representation, warranty or guarantee, express or implied, is included or intended in this Agreement or in any report, opinion, document, or otherwise.
3. **Responsibility of the Client.** Client shall provide all information and criteria as to its requirements for the Project, including budgetary limitations. Client shall arrange for Consultant to enter upon public and private property and obtain all necessary approvals required from all governmental authorities having jurisdiction over the Project. Client shall give prompt written notice to Consultant whenever Client observes or otherwise becomes aware of any development that affects the scope or timing of Consultant's services.

The Client shall promptly report to the Consultant any defects or suspected defects in the Consultant's services of which the Client becomes aware, so that Consultant may take measures to minimize the consequences of such a defect. Should legal liability for the defects exist, failure by the Client to notify the Consultant shall relieve the Consultant of any liability for costs of remedying the defects above the sum such remedy would have cost had prompt notification been given when such defects were first discovered.
4. **Construction Phase Services.** If Consultant's scope of services includes the observation and monitoring of work performed by Client's separate contractors, Consultant shall provide personnel to observe and monitor the work in accordance with the Standard of Care in order to ascertain that it is being performed, in general, in accordance with the plans and specifications. Consultant shall not supervise, direct, or have control over the contractor's work. Consultant shall not have authority over or responsibility for construction means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures or for safety precautions and programs in connection with the work of the contractor. Consultant does not guarantee the performance of the construction contract by the contractor and does not assume responsibility for the contractor's failure to furnish and perform its work in accordance with the plans and specifications.
5. **Designation of Authorized Representatives.** Each party shall designate one or more persons to act with authority on its behalf with respect to appropriate aspects of the Project. The persons designated shall review and respond promptly to all communications received from the party.
6. **Ownership of Documents.** All reports, notes, drawings, specifications, data, calculations, and other documents, including those in electronic form prepared by Consultant are instruments of Consultant's service that shall remain Consultant's property. The Client agrees not to use Consultant generated documents for projects other than the project for which the documents were prepared by Consultant, or for future modifications to the Project, without Consultant's express written permission. Any reuse or distribution to third parties without such express written permission or project-specific adaptation by Consultant will be at the Client's sole risk and without liability to Consultant or its employees, subsidiaries, and subconsultants.
7. **Opinion of Costs.** When required as a part of its scope of services, Consultant will furnish opinions or estimates of construction cost on the basis of Consultant's experience and qualifications, but Consultant does not guarantee the accuracy of such estimates. The parties recognize that Consultant has no control over the cost of labor, material, equipment, or services furnished by others or over market conditions or contractors' methods of determining prices.
8. **Changes or Delays.** In the event new developments or circumstances beyond the control of Consultant require a change in the scope of services or schedule, Consultant shall be entitled to an equitable adjustment to the fee and/or schedule. Such events include, but are not limited to, unreasonable delays caused by Client's failure to provide specified direction or information, delays caused by Client's other contractors or consultants, or if Consultant's failure to perform is due to any act of God, labor shortage, fire, inclement weather, act of governmental authority, failure of transportation, accident, power failure, or interruption or any other cause beyond the reasonable control of Consultant.

9. **Suspension of Services.** Client may, at any time, by written notice, suspend further services by Consultant. Upon receipt of such notice, Consultant shall take all reasonable steps to mitigate costs allocable to the suspended services. Client, however, shall pay all reasonable and necessary costs associated with such suspension including the cost of assembling documents, personnel and equipment, rescheduling or reassignment costs necessary to maintain continuity and the staff required to resume the services upon expiration of the suspension. Consultant will not be obligated to provide the same personnel in the event the period of any suspension exceeds 30 days.
10. **Termination.** This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon 30 days' written to the other party. Upon such termination, Client shall pay Consultant for all services performed up to the date of termination. If Client is the terminating party, Client shall pay Consultant all reasonable cost and expenses incurred by Consultant in effecting the termination, including but not limited to non-cancellable commitments and demobilization costs, if any.
11. **Indemnification.** Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless Client from and against those damages and costs (including reasonable attorneys' fees) that Client incurs as a result of third party claims for personal injury or property damage to the extent caused by the negligent acts, errors or omissions of Consultant.
12. **Legal Proceedings.** In the event Consultant or its employees are required by Client to provide testimony, answer interrogatories, produce documents or otherwise provide information in relation to any litigation, arbitration, proceeding or other inquiry arising out of Consultant's services, where Consultant is not a party to such proceeding, Client will compensate Consultant for its services and reimburse Consultant for all related direct costs incurred in connection with providing such testimony or information. This provision shall not apply in the event Client engages Consultant to provide expert testimony or litigation support, which services shall be the subject of a separate agreement or an amendment to this Agreement.
13. **Successors and Assigns.** The terms of this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and assigns; provided however, that neither party shall assign this Agreement in whole or in part without the prior written consent of the other party.
14. **Insurance.** Consultant agrees to maintain the following insurance coverage with the following limits of insurance during the performance of Consultant's work hereunder:
- (a) Commercial General Liability insurance with standard ISO coverage and available limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 general aggregate;
 - (b) Automobile Liability insurance with standard ISO coverage and available combined single limits of \$1,000,000 per accident;
 - (c) Worker's Compensation insurance with limits as required by statute and Employer's Liability insurance with limits of \$1,000,000 per employee for bodily injury by accident/\$1,000,000 per employee for bodily injury by disease/\$1,000,000 policy limit for disease; and
 - (d) Professional Liability insurance covering Consultant's negligent acts, errors, or omissions in the performance of professional services with available limits of \$1,000,000 per claim and annual aggregate.
- Consultant shall provide evidence of procuring the above insurance coverages by delivering a certificate of insurance to Client prior to the start of Consultant's work and annually upon renewal of coverage. Consultant shall cause Client to be named as an additional insured on Consultant's commercial general liability policy, which shall be primary and noncontributory.
15. **Information Provided by the Client.** Consultant shall be entitled to rely upon, without liability, the accuracy and completeness of any and all information provided by Client, without the obligation of independent verification.
16. **Omitted.**
17. **Payment.** Unless agreed to otherwise, Consultant shall submit monthly invoices to the Client. Payment in full shall be due upon receipt of the invoice. Payment of any invoices by the Client shall be taken to mean that the Client is satisfied with the Consultant's services to the date of the payment and is not aware of any deficiencies in those services. If payments are delinquent after 45 days from invoice date, the Client agrees to pay interest on the unpaid balance at the rate of one percent (1%) per month. If the Client fails to make payments; then Consultant, after giving seven (7) days written notice to the Client, may suspend services until the Client has paid in full all amounts due for services, expenses, and other related charges without recourse to the Client for loss or damage caused by such suspension. The Client waives any and all claims against the Consultant for any such suspension. Payment for Consultant's services is not contingent on any factor, except the Consultant's ability to provide services in a manner consistent with

- that Standard of Care. Payment of invoices shall not be subject to any discounts, set-offs or back-charges unless agreed to in writing by both parties. If the Client contests an invoice, the Client may withhold only that portion so contested and shall pay the undisputed portion, after the Client has notified Consultant in writing within 30 days of receiving the invoice and shall identify the specific cause of the disagreement and the amount in dispute.
18. **Force Majeure.** Neither Client nor Consultant shall be liable for any fault or delay caused by any contingency beyond their control, including but not limited to, acts of God, wars, strikes, walkouts, fires, natural calamities, or demands or requirements of governmental agencies.
19. **Compliance with Laws.** To the extent they apply to its employees or its services, Consultant shall exercise due professional care to comply with all applicable laws, including ordinances of any political subdivisions or governing agencies.
20. **Invalid Terms.** If any provisions of this Agreement are held to be invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and binding as if the unenforceable provisions were never included in the Agreement.
21. **Governing Law.** This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the state where the services are performed.
22. **Dispute Resolution.** All disputes, controversies or claims, of whatever kind or character, between the Parties, their agents and/or principals, arising out of or in connection with the subject matter of this Agreement shall be litigated in a court of competent jurisdiction.
23. **Additional Services.** Consultant shall be entitled to an equitable adjustment of its fee for services resulting from significant changes in the general scope, extent or character of the Project or its design including, but not limited to, changes in size, complexity, Client's schedule, construction schedule, character of construction or method of financing; and revising previously accepted studies, reports, design documents or other documents when such revisions are required by changes in laws, rules, regulations, ordinances, codes or orders enacted subsequent to the preparation of such studies, reports or documents, or are due to any other causes beyond Consultant's control.
24. **Amendment.** This Agreement may only be amended in writing and where such amendment is executed by a duly authorized representatives of each party.
25. **Entire Understanding of Agreement.** This Agreement represents and incorporates the entire understanding of the parties hereto, and each party acknowledges that there are no warranties, representations, covenants or understandings of any kind, matter or description whatsoever, made by either party to the other except as expressly set forth herein. Client and Consultant hereby agree that any purchase orders, invoices, confirmations, acknowledgments or other similar documents executed or delivered with respect to the subject matter hereof that conflict with the terms of this Agreement shall be null, void and without effect to the extent they conflict with the terms of this Agreement.
26. **Survival of Provisions.** The provisions of this Agreement shall continue to be binding upon the parties hereto notwithstanding termination of this Agreement for any reason.
27. **Nonwaiver.** No waiver by a party of any provision of this Agreement shall be deemed to have been made unless in writing and signed by such party.

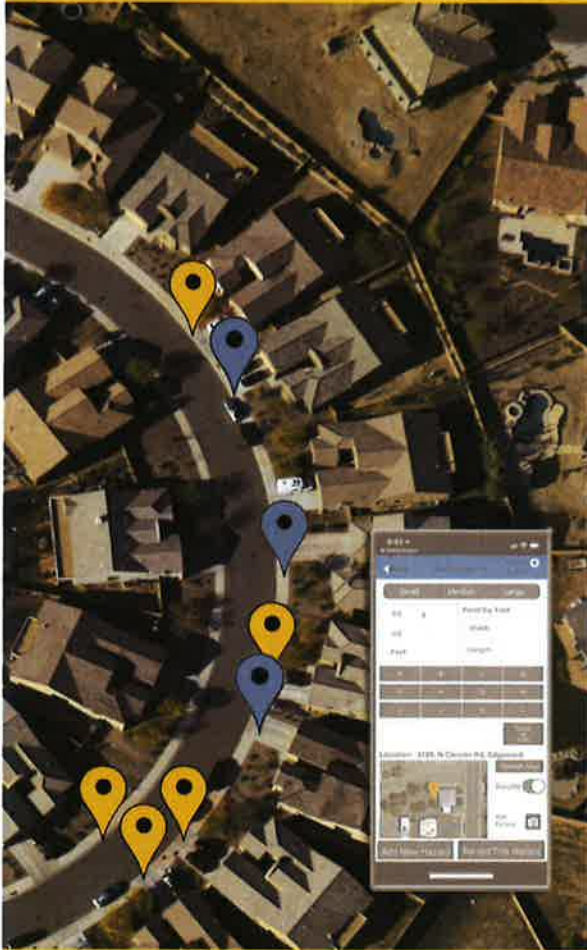

COVER LETTER

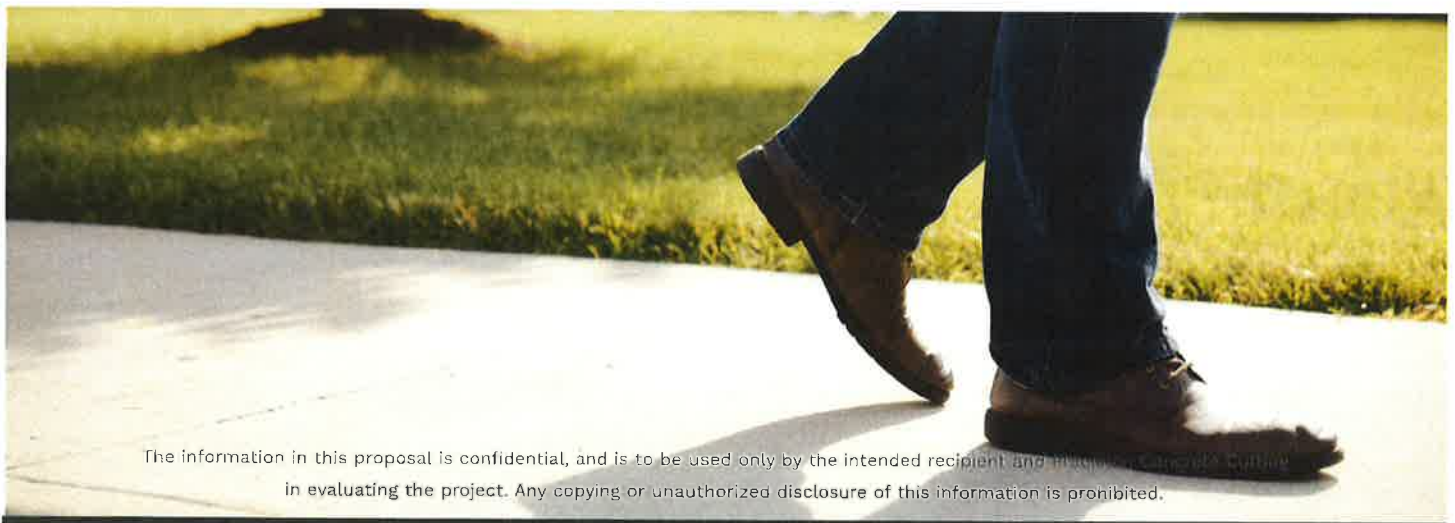

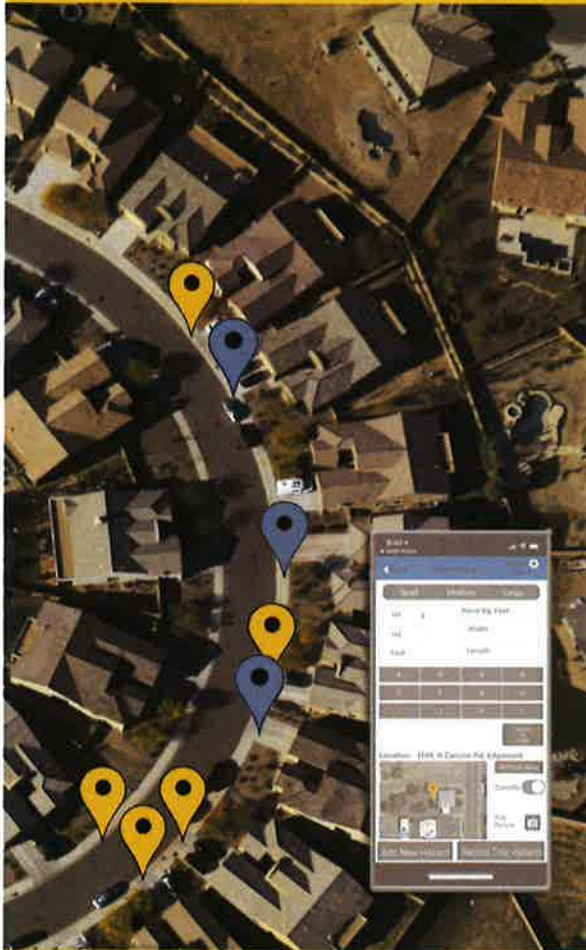

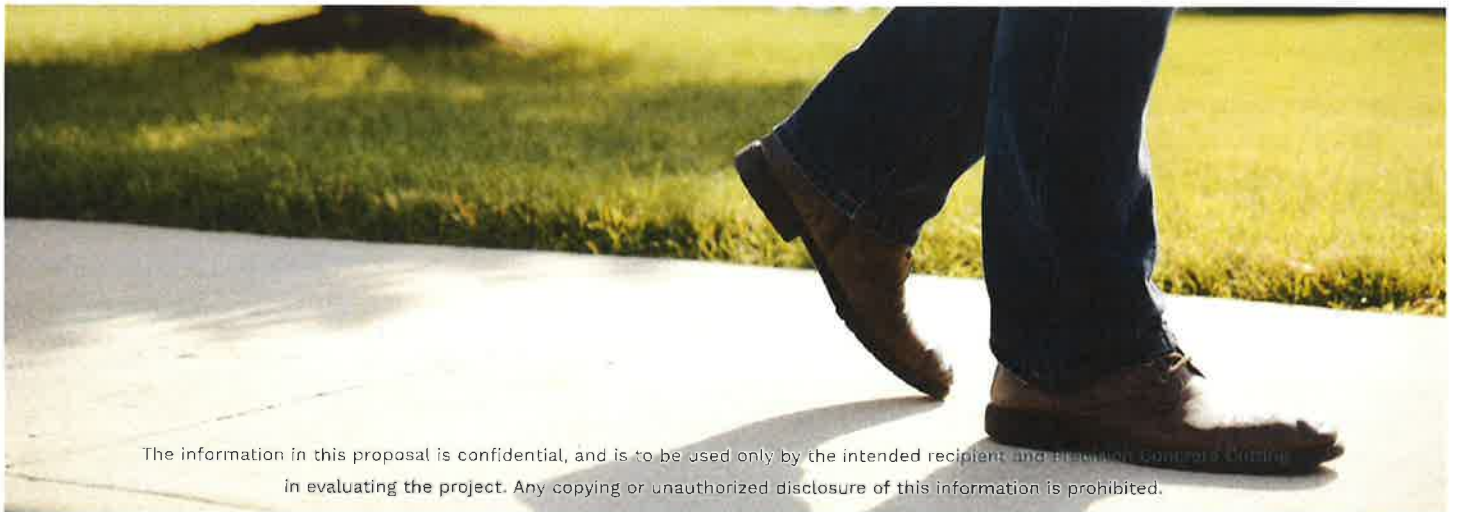

BOARD OF ALDERMEN COMMENTS: Alderman Brooks seconded what the Mayor said about the police department and the way they handled things in the Cotton District with that being his Ward. He noted that he has only heard good things and positive feedback and commends the police department for what they did and how fast they did it. Alderman Brooks stated that we had a very successful Derby and that around \$75,000 were raised for the Humane Society.

Vice Mayor Perkins stated he would like to take a few moments to focus upon the funeral service and visitation service for Mrs. Vickie Hampton, our former Executive Administrative Assistant. He reflected that she did an exceptional and marvelous job for the City of Starkville. He mentioned that he made a timely congratulations to Mrs. Hampton on her retirement. He noted a conversation that he had with Mrs. Hampton regarding her time with the City and how she would be greatly missed. Vice Mayor Perkins noted that the Mayor was going to have a retirement reception for Mrs. Hampton on April 30th. He thanked Mayor Spruill for her excellent comments and tribute at Mrs. Hampton's funeral service and he also recognized former Mayor Parker Wiseman spoke as well. He noted the City Staff that attended funeral service and the visitation service and thanked them for paying their respects to Mrs. Hampton.

CITIZEN COMMENTS: Alvin Turner, Ward 7, noted that Patti Drapala has been having issues with her water going from brown to clear water. Mr. Turner asked if the Police Department could hold a class on how to properly clean a gun. He noted he had lost a friend years ago because they did not know how to properly clean the gun.

Pastor Jerry Jefferson, the NAACP President, spoke about concerns about the incident that happened at the Cornerstone Park the past weekend involving a white sheriff's deputy and a black umpire. He noted that he heard the Board giving the Police Chief accolades for work in the Cotton District and would like the same at the Park and for the Police to do a consistent job. He stated that what happened at the Park is now national news. Vice Mayor Perkins addressed Pastor Jefferson stating that he is confident that the Police Chief will investigate the matter and that we have a zero tolerance for crime in this City. Vice Mayor noted that he would like to see everyone involved arrested and charged with the maximum crime. He stated that he would like for the Police Department to hold a press conference and hold everyone accountable to the law.

Lisa Wilson with the NAACP spoke regarding the incident that happened at the Park during a youth baseball game. She expressed concern about what was captured on video and of the severity of the injuries sustained by Mr. Akins. She noted that reports indicate that Mr. Akins had to be hospitalized and had surgery due to the serious bodily harm that he suffered and that these are not minor injuries and should not be treated as a minor matter. She noted that they acknowledge that the authorities initially classified the incident as a mutual altercation and issued misdemeanor charges, however based on the extent of injuries sustained that the Oktibbeha County NAACP believes that this case warrants a more thorough and elevated legal review. She called upon the appropriate authorities to upgrade the charges to reflect the seriousness of the harm that was inflicted on Mr. Akins. She stated that this community deserves transparency, accountability, and confidence that justice will be applied fairly and equally.

Pam Warcken stated she was here for an issue that was important to her. She noted that she saw on the agenda that a code enforcement officer was being hired and that it would bring the staffing up to what it has been in the past. She noted that she is surrounded by some derelict properties where she lives. She stated that she was here to make a plea to the Board to please keep the staffing of

code enforcement up and have more administrative support for them. She noted that the issue she is having has been on the books for some time through several code enforcement officers and it doesn't get to a point of resolution. She stated she would like to see more fining of people who do not take care of their properties in town.

Cindy Thompson noted that she lives in the same neighborhood as Pam Warken. She noted that they provided the Mayor and Board with copies of the condition of the house and of the HOA restrictions. She stated that the condition of the house is bringing the property values down. She asked for support to do something about the violations.

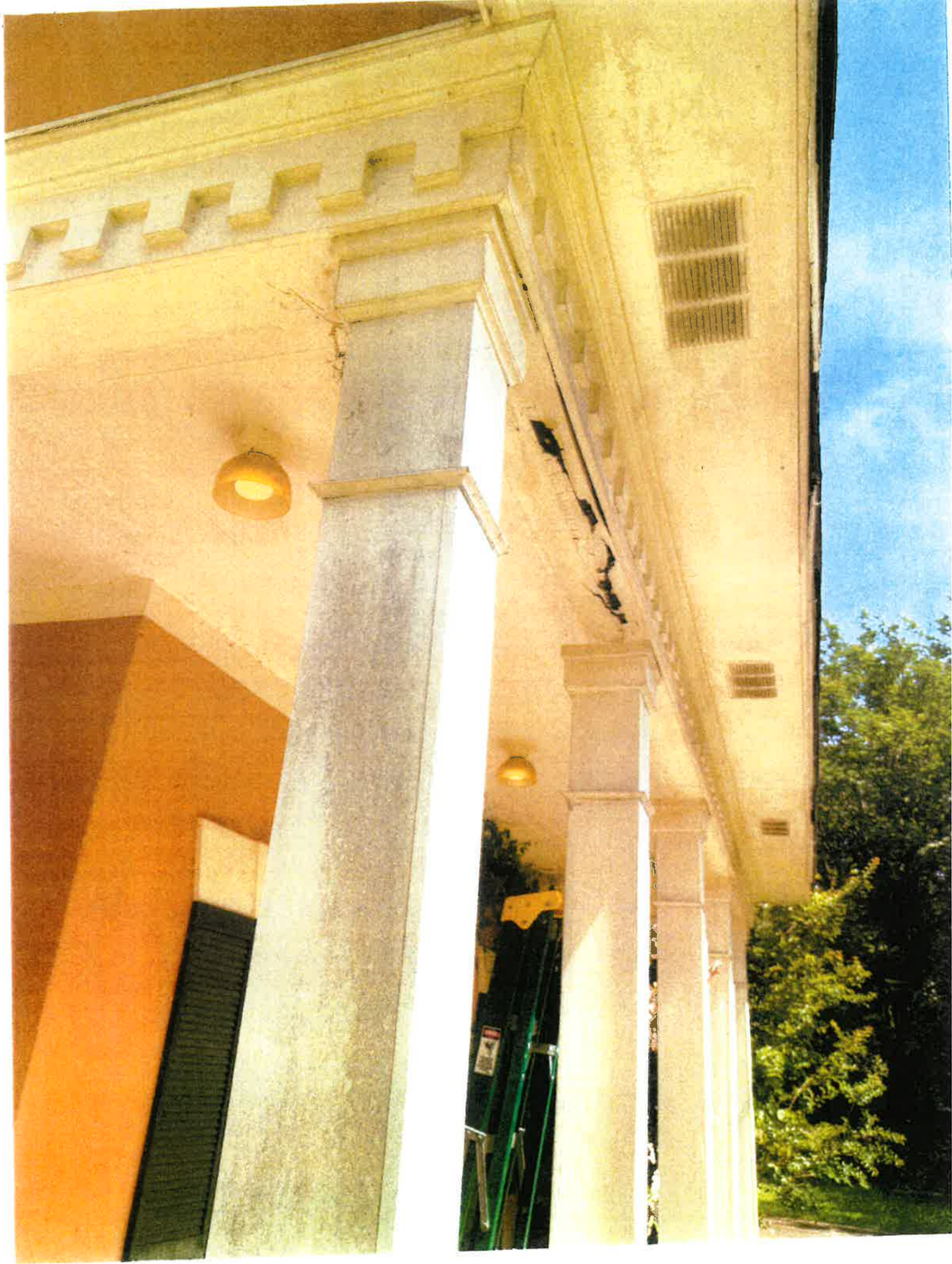

The undersigned, MFW, INC., being the owner of all lots situated in FAIRFIELD COMMONS Second Installment, in the City of Starkville, Mississippi, a subdivision of 2.34 acres of land out of Starkville, Mississippi, as shown by the plat thereof recorded in the Chancery Clerk's Office, Starkville, Oktibbeha County, Mississippi, has restricted and does by these presents restrict the use of said property as follows:

A. RESIDENTIAL PURPOSE

1. This subdivision shall be used for private single-family residences only.
2. Only one residence shall be constructed on each lot. This provision shall not, however, prohibit the construction of a residence on a portion of two or more lots as shown by the plat of the subdivision provided such portion constitutes a home site as defined in the succeeding paragraph.
3. Parts of two or more adjoining lots facing the same street in the same block may be designated as one home site, provided the lot frontage shall not be less than the minimum frontage of lots in the same block facing the same street and the minimum square footage of the lot shall not be less than 10,000 square feet.
4. The term "residential purpose" as used herein shall be held to exclude hospitals, duplex houses and apartment houses, and to exclude commercial and professional uses; and to exclude any development operations or drilling for oil, gas or other minerals or any quarrying or mining or placing or maintaining on the premises of any tanks, wells, shafts, mineral excavations, derricks or structures of any kind incident to any such oil, gas or other mineral operations; any such excluded usage of the subdivision, not otherwise herein authorized, is hereby expressly prohibited.
5. The word "house" or "residence" as used herein with reference to building lines shall include galleries, porches, porte cocheres, projections and every other permanent part of the improvements, except roofs. Steps, terraces and planters outside of building lines will be permitted upon approval by the architectural standards committee hereinafter designated.
6. No garage or outbuilding on this property shall be used as a residence or living quarters. A garage shall be used solely by the owner or occupant of the lot upon which the garage is located.
7. No building materials or temporary building of any kind or character, including, but not limited to, tents, shacks, garages or barns, shall be placed or stored upon the property until the owner is ready to commence improvements, and then such materials or temporary building shall be placed within the property lines of the lot or parcel of land which the improvements are to be erected, and shall not be placed in the streets or between the curb and property line; and any such temporary building or structure of any kind shall not be used other than construction purposes. Any such buildings shall be maintained in neat, attractive and clean conditions.

8. No building or structure upon any lot may be permitted to fall into disrepair. Buildings must at all times be kept in good condition, adequately painted, or otherwise finished.
9. Landscaping of a lot must be completed within one hundred twenty (120) days after the date on which the main structure is 95% complete. No dams shall be constructed, nor any other alteration or change shall be made in the course or flow of any creek crossing, drainage flow of body of water abutting any lot, without the approval of the Architectural Committee.

B. BUILDING SIZES AND CONSTRUCTION

1. The living area of the main house or residential structure constructed as a one story residence on any homesite exclusive of porches and garages, shall be not less than 1,700 square feet and in the case of any residence of more than one story, the requirements as to living area shall be at least 1,700 square feet for both stories. No residence may exceed two stories in height.
2. No garage may be greater in height or number of stories than the residence for which it is built. Garages of sufficient size to accommodate not less than two cars must be provided.
3. All dwellings and outbuildings shall be constructed of brick, stone or stucco or other exterior material which may be approved by the Architectural Standards Committee to the extent of at least 61% of the total outside area. Openings and glass areas shall be considered to be of the material which is on either side of it.
4. All dwellings and outbuildings must have a roof of wood shingles, slate, metal, or tile, unless otherwise approved by the Architectural Standards Committee.

C. BUILDING LOCATIONS

1. No building shall be erected on any lot nearer to the front property line or nearer to the side street property line than the building lines shown on the recorded plat. In any event, no building shall be located nearer than 30' to the property line, or nearer than 10' to any side property line. No building shall be located nearer than 10' feet to any interior side property line.

D. FACING OF RESIDENCES

1. Houses or residences on corner lots shall face the street from which the greater building line setback is shown on the recorded plat, unless alternate facing is authorized by the Architectural Standards Committee.

E. SITING

1. To ensure that buildings and other structures will be located so that the maximum view, privacy and breeze will be available to each building or structure, and that structures will be located with regard to the topography of each property taking into consideration the location of large trees and other aesthetic and environmental considerations, approval by the Architectural Standards Committee is required.

F. FENCES, WALLS AND HEDGES

1. In conjunction with the development of Fairfield Commons Subdivision, the developer intends to, and hereby reserves and retains the right and authority to, construct or cause to be constructed a permanent decorative fence in the vicinity of the fronts of lots and between residences.
2. The type, design, size, appearance, and exact location of this fence shall be determined solely by the developer. After such a fence has been constructed, no change shall be made therein except as approved by the Architectural Standards Committee.
3. No chain link fence, nor other type of wire fence, shall be constructed upon any part of Fairfield Commons Subdivision.

G. DRIVEWAYS

1. Concrete drives shall have expansion joints not more than twenty feet (20') apart, with one joint at the back of the street curb. Width of driveway shall flare to an adequate width (not to encroach past property line) and the curb shall be broken in such a manner that the driveway may be at least six inches (6") thick at its end towards the street paving, and this extreme end shall be poured against a horizontal form board to reduce the unsightly appearance of a raveling driveway. Other material for driveways may be used if approved by the Architectural Standards Committee.

H. WALKS

1. Walks from the street curb to the residence shall have a minimum width of four feet (4').

I. SERVICE YARDS

1. Each Property Owner shall provide a screened area to serve as a service yard area in which garbage receptacles, fuel tanks, or similar storage receptacles, electric and gas meters, air conditioning equipment, clotheslines, and other unsightly objects must be placed or stored in order to conceal them from view from the road and adjacent properties.

J. YARD LIGHTING

1. The design and location of yard lighting shall be subject to the approval of the Architectural Standards Committee.

K. MISCELLANEOUS

1. No household trash, garbage, ashes, refuse, or other waste shall be thrown, dumped, or placed at curbside more than 12 hours before city pick-up.

2. Grass and weeds shall be kept mowed to prevent unsightly appearances. Dead, diseased, or damaged trees which might create a hazard to property, or persons on any lot, or adjacent lot shall be promptly removed or repaired if not removed by owners, then developer or his successors may, but shall not be required to remove such trees at owner's expense and shall not be liable for damage done in such removal.
3. No activity may be carried on or allowed to exist upon any lot which may be noxious, detrimental, or offensive to any other lot or to the occupants of any lot.
4. No animals, livestock, or poultry of any kind, shall be raised, bred, kept, staked, or pastured on any lot, except that not more than a total of three (3) dogs, cats, or other household pets may be kept, provided they are not kept, bred, or maintained for any commercial purpose.
5. No owner shall permit anything or condition to exist upon his lot which shall induce, breed, or harbor infectious plant diseases or noxious insects. Each owner shall keep all shrubs, trees, hedges, grass and landscaping of every kind on his lot, including any setback areas, areas between lot lines and adjacent sidewalks and/or street curb, neatly trimmed, properly cultivated, and free of trash, weeds, and other unsightly material. No trees, hedges, shrubs, or other landscaping shall be planted or permitted to remain on any lot unless the foliage line is maintained at a proper height to prevent obstruction of safe cross-visibility of traffic approaching an intersection or driveway. Easements for installation and maintenance of utilities and drainage facilities are reserved as shown on the recorded plat. The easement area of each lot and all improvements in it shall be maintained continuously by the owner of the lot, except for those improvements for which a public utility company or authority is responsible.
6. Each owner of a lot agrees for himself, his heirs, assigns, or successors in interest that he will not in any way interfere with the established drainage pattern over his lot from adjoining or other lots in said tract1 and he will make adequate provisions for proper drainage in the event it becomes necessary to change the established drainage over his lot. For the purpose hereof, "established drainage" is defined as the drainage which occurred at the time that the overall grading of said tract was completed by Grantor.
7. Each owner of a lot in the subdivision agrees for himself, his heirs, assigns, or successors in interest that he will permit free access by owners of adjacent or adjoining lots, when such access is essential for the maintenance of drainage facilities.
8. No exterior speaker, horn, whistle, bell or other sound device, except security devices used exclusively for security purposes, shall be located, used, or placed upon a lot.
9. No signs or advertising device of any kind may be placed or kept on any lot other than one name and/or number plate not exceeding 120 square inches in area and one sign for sale purposes not exceeding 8 square feet in area. The latter sign must be a sign furnished or approved by the Committee.
10. No outside clothes lines or other outside clothes drying or airing facilities shall be maintained except in an enclosed service area, not visible to the public.

11. No flag pole shall be permanently erected on any property unless approval has been obtained in writing from the Committee.
12. No tent, mobile home, trailer of any kind, or similar structure, and no truck, camper, or boat shall be kept, placed, maintained, constructed, reconstructed or repaired, nor shall any motor vehicle be constructed, reconstructed or repaired, other than in a garage. The doors of garages, housing trucks, campers and/or boats shall be closed at all times except for actual entry or exit. The provisions of this paragraph shall not, however, apply to emergency vehicle repairs or temporary construction shelters or facilities maintained during and used exclusively in connection with the construction, reconstruction or repair of any work or improvements.
13. No junk of any kind or character, or any accessories, parts or objects used with cars, boats, buses, trucks, trailers, house trailers, ATVs, golf carts, or the like, shall be kept on any lot other than in the garage, or other structures approved by the Committee.
14. No privy, cesspool or septic tank, or disposal plant shall be erected or maintained on any part of this property.
15. No excavation, except such as is necessary for the construction of improvements, shall be permitted, nor shall any well or hole of any kind be dug on this property without the written consent of the Committee.
16. No antenna for transmission or reception of television signals, radio signals, or any other form of electromagnetic radiation shall be erected, used, or maintained outdoors in view of streets whether attached to a building or structure or otherwise. No radio or television signals nor any other form of electromagnetic radiation shall be permitted to originate from any lot which may unreasonably interfere with the reception of television or radio signals upon any other lot.
17. No lines, wires, or other devices for the communication or transmission of electric current or power, including telephone, television and radio signals, shall be constructed, placed, or maintained anywhere in or upon any lot other than within building or structures unless the same shall be contained in conduits or cables constructed, placed and maintained underground or concealed in or under buildings or other structures. Nothing herein contained, however, shall prevent erection and use of temporary power or telephone services incident to the construction of buildings or other improvements or to restrict the overhead distribution of three-phase primary power supply to the subdivision by the utility company.
18. Each owner of a lot agrees for himself, his heirs, assigns, or successors in interest that he will permit free and reasonable access by the owner of adjacent of adjoining lots containing a divisional wall, when such access is essential for the construction, reconstruction, refinishing, repair, maintenance, or alteration of said divisional wall. The access shall be limited to an area five feet (5') in width along or parallel to the property line. Access shall only be at reasonable times and shall be permitted only after written notice has been given to the lot owner stating the purpose of
19. the access. In no event shall such access be deemed to permit entry into the interior portions of any dwelling. Any damage caused by such access will be repaired at the expense of the owner

causing such damage.

20. Any building or other improvement on the land that is destroyed partially or totally by fire, storm or any other means shall be repaired or demolished within a reasonable period of time, and the land restored to an orderly and attractive condition.
21. No part or parts of the land in this subdivision shall be used in such manner which would increase the hazard of fire on any other part or parts of the land or any property adjoining the land.
22. The invalidity, violation, abandonment, or waiver of any one or more of or any part of the reservations, restrictions, or other provisions hereof, either as to all or any part of the land, shall not affect or impair such reservations, restrictions or other provisions hereof as to the remaining parts of the land and shall not affect or impair the remaining reservation, restrictions or other improvements hereof or parts thereof as to all the land.

M. ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

1. No building shall be erected, placed, or altered on any building plot in this subdivision until two complete sets of building plans and specifications (which shall clearly indicate colors of all exterior materials and paint) and two plot plans of the location of such building shall have been delivered to the Architectural Committee designated as herein after provided, and until such building plans, specifications and plot plan shall have been approved in writing by the Architectural Committee as being in conformity and harmony with the external design and location of the existing structures of the subdivision and in compliance with the restrictions herein contained. One copy of such plans, specifications and plot plan shall be retained by the Architectural Committee, and the second copy shall be redelivered to the owners of the lot with the approval of the Architectural Committee appropriately endorsed thereon. The undersigned, MFW, INC. shall have the authority to appoint the Architectural Committee and to remove without cause any person serving on the Architectural Committee. The Architectural Committee shall consist of not less than three nor more than five members, and MFW, INC. shall also have the authority to fill any vacancies in the Architectural Committee. The Architectural Committee is authorized to delegate to one or more representatives' authority to perform the duties of the Architectural Committee as set forth herein. In the event that the Architectural Committee should at any time fail or refuse to appoint a successor Committee, the owners of a majority of the lots included within said subdivision, as determined on a front footage basis, shall have the right to elect or appoint, from time to time, a successor Architectural Committee. In the event the Architectural Committee, or its designated representative, fails to approve or disapprove any building plans, specifications and plot plans within thirty (30) days after the same are submitted to it, and if all terms contained in these restrictions have been complied with, the Architectural committee shall be deemed to have approved such plans, specifications and plot plan.

The Architectural Committee shall in no event be liable in damages for any action or failure or refusal to act pursuant to the provisions hereof. The Architectural Committee shall receive no fees or compensation for its services. The initial Architectural Committee shall consist of three or more persons to be appointed by MFW, INC.

N. DURATION

1. These restrictions shall remain in full force and effect until January 1, 2027, and shall be automatically extended for successive ten (10) year periods provided, however, that these restrictions may be terminated on January 1, 2027, or on the commencement of any successive ten-year period, by filing for record in the Office of the County Clerk of Oktibbeha County, Mississippi, a written statement of election to terminate these restrictions, executed and acknowledged by the owners of a majority of the area of the lots in the subdivision. Such a statement must be filed prior to the commencement of the ten-year period for which these restrictions would otherwise be in effect.

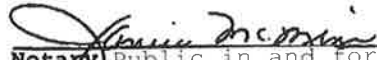

PUBLIC HEARING AND CONSIDERATION OF VA 26-03 A REQUEST FOR A VARIANCE FROM THE FENCE HEIGHT REQUIREMENT IN THE SIDE AND REAR YARD FOR A PROPERTY LOCATED AT 403 EAST GILLESPIE STREET IN A TN-E ZONING DISTRICT.

Community Planner Daniel Havelin presented VA 26-03 a request for a variance from the fence height requirement in the side and rear yard for a property located at 403 East Gillespie Street in a TN-E zoning district.

This is a Variance request by Alice Carol Caldwell for a Variance from fence height requirement in the side and rear yard for a property located at 403 East Gillespie Street in a TN-E zone with the parcel number 102A-00-152.00.

The request exceeds the maximum permitted fence height for residential accessory structures. The maximum fence is 8 feet. This request increases the height by 1-foot. According to the application, the fence is intended to provide privacy and protection from adjacent property conditions, including ongoing construction activity and structural deterioration of neighboring improvements.

Based on the analysis of the criteria contained in Section 3.7.1 staff recommends Approval of the request.

The request was noticed in accordance with Section 3.4.3.E of the Unified Development Code.

1. 13 property owners of record within 160 feet of the subject property were notified directly by mail of the request.
2. A legal ad was published in the Starkville Daily News on April 4, 2026.
3. A sign was posted on the property in a conspicuous location.

As of this date, the Planning Office has received one phone call and one office visit for further information regarding the request.

At the April 22, 2026, Board of Adjustments and Appeals voted 6-1 to recommend approval of the request.

Alderman Vaughn asked was this a normal request. He noted that all his time on the Board he doesn't recall ever approving of this kind of request. He stated if the Board approved this request, it would only set a bad precedent, and others could come asking for higher variance requests. Mr. Havelin stated that with his time with the City that he does not recall another fence request for a variance for height. Mr. Havelin noted that this is a rather unusual circumstance and that the structure next door is one of the oldest in Starkville and that it is right on the property line and almost in her backyard. Alderman Vaughn asked what code enforcement has said about this. Mr. Havelin said he had not been in contact with code enforcement about this. Alderman Sistrunk noted she had a question about the need for the height and that a normal 7-foot fence from the picture would still have a view of the neighbor's property. She asked the applicant was the purpose of this variance to see the views of the inside of the house and the exterior. Alice Carol Caldwell stated that she asked for the variance because of the very old and historic cook house there that is

deteriorating. She noted that the fence would keep it from falling in her yard. She noted that the neighbors had built a wonderful back porch and this would give them both privacy. Vice Mayor Perkins asked Mr. Havelin to confirm the vote was 6-1, Mr. Havelin confirmed. He stated that he has concerns about the height as well because if the Board grants this request the Board will be opening a floodgate to potential requests in the future. He noted that the opposition that was received from the Board was from one of his former colleagues and he was opposed to this request because it sets a bad legal precedent. Vice Mayor Perkins stated that all of the concerns from the petitioner could be rectified by code enforcement. He noted that the City Code uses the words shall be 8-feet and the intent of that was to ensure that it was high enough to shield any site or view that was undesirable. He noted that the legal question this presents is what the legal ramifications are if this is approved. He reference the equal protection clause of the 14th amendment, which means all persons that are similarly situated must be treated similarly. He stated that someone else was to come with a similar request and the Board denied the request it would be arbitrary and capricious.

Mayor Spruill opened the Public Hearing to the public.

Alice Carol Caldwell stated that they have built the fence 6-feet up to the back of the house and the variance request is so they have privacy and protection. Pam Jones, friend of Alice Carol, noted that she has a lot of traffic in and out of her driveway. That a lot of friends come and sit on the back porch. She stated that the neighbors have been saying for years that they would be fixing the cookhouse and they just have never done it and they are not going to do it anytime soon. She stated that it is an eyesore and at the front of the driveway the neighbors have a pile of what she considered debris covered by tarp. She stated that the day before they put up a saw on Alice Carols side of the driveway and the saw dust gets all on Alice Carols front porch. She stated that she would like to see the Board pass the variance for many reasons.

There being no additional comments, the Mayor closed the Public Hearing.

Alderman Moreland stated she did understand Vice Mayor's concerns about the law but she feels this is something the Board can do by a case by case situation. She noted that she does understand why she would want to put a fence up and that it will not be the entire length of the property, that is just at the back portion of the property. Alderman Moreland made the motion to pass the variance, and Alderman Sistrunk seconded the motion. Alderman Sistrunk stated that the Vice Mayor was correct that we do need to be mindful in making variance exceptions. Alderman Vaughn stated the Board needs to understand if we do this then the Board might as well get ready to approve anyone else's request. Mayor Spruill noted that the points were accurate and there is a reason for a variance and we allow for a variance and that this is one of our ways to respond to different circumstances within the community and this would be one of those. The Mayor asked for the City Clerk to do a roll call vote.

Mayor Spruill noted that this helps the community. This is a small measure, and this would round up to the next dollar and if you would like to do more than that you may do so. She stated that this would go to fund that would help assist citizens who are having a difficult time paying for their utility bills. Alderman Sistrunk noted that in the presentation on Friday, that the Starkville Community Foundation gets funding from an assortment of sources. She noted that they have enough funds to help about 5 people per week. She noted they get at least 100 requests per week and in the high usage months they receive around 300 calls per week. If anyone doesn't want to participate all they have to do is make a phone call or come to the office and request to opt out.

Upon the motion of Alderman Sistrunk, duly seconded by Alderman Moreland, and adopted by the Board to approve enrolling all Starkville Utilities' customers in the Power of Change and allowing a voluntary opt out of the program effective July 2026. The Board voted as follows:

The purpose of this report is to provide information regarding Variance request by Alice Carol Caldwell for a Variance from fence height requirement in the side and rear yard for a property located at 403 East Gillespie Street in a TN-E zone with the parcel numbers 102A-00-152.00. Please see attachments 1- 17.

SUMMARY

The applicant is requesting a variance from Section 13.9.1.B.6.b of the Unified Development Code to allow the construction of a 9-foot fence in the side yard between the subject property and the adjacent parcel to the west.

The request exceeds the maximum permitted fence height for residential accessory structures. The maximum fence is 8 feet. This request increases the height by 1-foot

According to the application, the fence is intended to provide privacy and protection from adjacent property conditions, including ongoing construction activity and structural deterioration of neighboring improvements.

Based on the analysis of the criteria contained in Section 3.7.1 staff recommends Approval of the request.

If the request for Variance is recommended for approval, the applicant's requests will be heard by the Board of Aldermen at the May 5, 2026, meeting.

VARIANCE REQUEST FROM

- 13.9.1 Accessory Use or Structures (Excluding Dwellings)
A. Definition: An accessory use or structure that is incidental and subordinate to the principal use of the principal building. Structures with a kitchen area, full bathroom, electricity, and is heated or cooled shall be considered accessory dwellings.
B. Accessory use or structure for residential uses
6. Fences
a. From the street facing facade of any principal building to the right-of-way line of the streets, fences shall not be more than three and a half (3 1/2) feet in height.
b. Fences located behind the front facade of the principal building shall not

exceed eight (8) feet in height.

- c. Razor wire shall not be placed on any fence.
- d. See development standards charts for additional fencing requirements.

CRITERIA FOR VARIANCE REVIEW AND APPROVAL (Section 3.7.1)

3.7.1. Criteria for variance review and approval.

- A. **Special Conditions.** That special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to the land, structure, or building involved, and the same conditions are not applicable to other land, structures, and buildings in the surrounding area.
- B. **Literal Interpretation.** That the literal interpretation of the provisions of this Code would deprive the applicant of rights commonly enjoyed by other properties in the same district under the terms of this Code.
- C. **Hardship.** That the hardship has not resulted from the actions of the applicant.
- D. **Special Privilege.** That granting the variance requested will not confer on the applicant any special privilege that is denied by this Code to other lands, structures, or buildings in the same district.
- E. **Minimum Variance.** That granting the variance is the minimum variance that will make possible the reasonable use of the land, building, or structure.
- F. **Consistency with Comprehensive Plan.** That the granting of the variance will be consistent with the general purpose, intent, goals, objectives, and policies of the Comprehensive Plan and this code and will not be injurious to surrounding areas or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare.

STAFF ANALYSIS OF CRITERIA FOR APPROVAL

- A. **Special Conditions.** There is evidence of unique conditions affecting the property. Adjacent construction activity impacting use of outdoor space. A deteriorating accessory structure on the neighboring parcel leaning toward the subject property.
- B. **Literal Interpretation.** Strict enforcement of the fence height limit would restrict the applicant's ability to mitigate privacy and safety concerns related to adjacent property conditions.
- C. **Hardship.** The hardship is not self-created.
- D. **Special Privilege.** Allowing a 9-foot fence could grant a greater level of enclosure than typically permitted in residential districts. Although other properties in the area may not have the same issues that would create the need for additional fencing.
- E. **Minimum Variance.** No other variance is being requested for the fence
- F. **Consistency with Comprehensive Plan and UDC.** The request does not conflict with broader land use goals of the Comprehensive Plan such as the Preservation of neighborhood character and Protection of residential quality of life.

NOTIFICATION

The request was noticed in accordance with Section 3.7.3.E of the Unified Development Code.

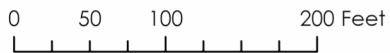

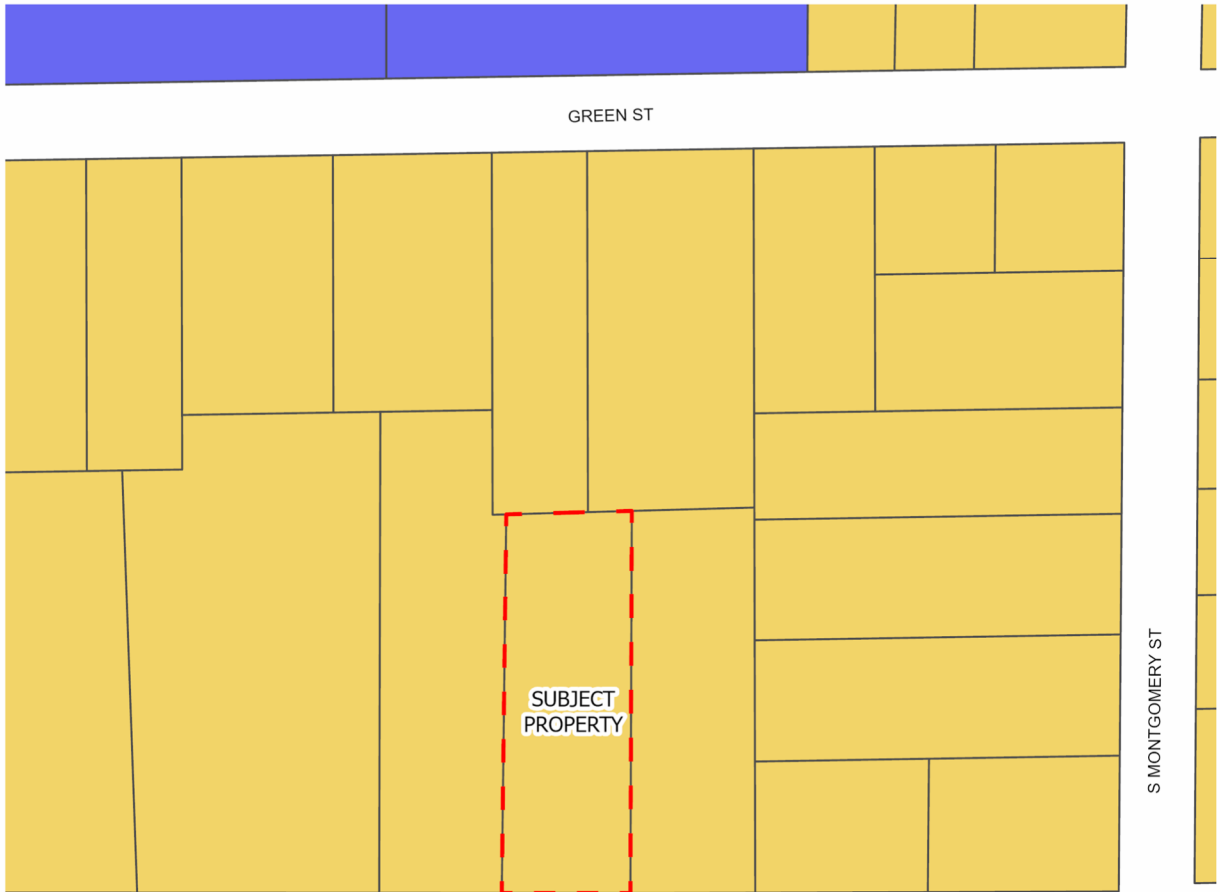
CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Any condition attached to the approval of a variance by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen shall run with the land and shall be binding upon the applicants, their heirs, and successors.

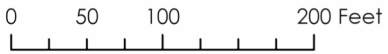
Attachment 1- VA 26-03 Aerial



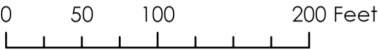

We are Everett and Henri Sue Kennard. We own the property at 401 East Gillespie Street and are currently totally renovating same. We would like to comment on the variance request from Ms Alice Carol Caldwell who resides on the Eastern side of our property at 403 East Gillespie. During the planning for this renovation, one of our main concerns has been to retain the integrity of the Gillespie Street neighborhood. We think we are within sixty days of finalizing the project of the main house.

While we do not know that we are particularly opposed to the variance request for a ten foot fence along this property, we think there are some points that need to be considered before the variance is approved. Ms Caldwell has for the past several years resided part time out of the country, this year returning to her Starkville residence in approximately February. Upon returning, she notified us that her contractor had given her an estimate on building this fence. She gave us the price and we assumed she was asking for us to share in this cost. We immediately asked for a meeting with her to discuss. We informed her that a fence was already in our plans with our contractor at our expense. She would be given an opportunity to look at the plans and comment on the side facing her. Again, we want all of this to aid in the preservation of the neighborhood. We asked her to consider not starting this project until we finished our construction due to several reasons in no particular order.

1. We will be doing dirt work, including an 8 inch pipe drain down the east side of our house, and would need to get equipment into the area, along with room to work. We in no way want to damage her fence.
2. There are two surveys on the property line that are somewhat different. Not by much, but different. She had one done several years ago as did we. I do not claim to know which is correct.
3. The fence is within one foot (12 inches) of an existing structure that we plan to renovate. There will be no room to do any dirt work during this renovation. While this will be inconvenient, the main reason to resolve the property line issue is to get it right. This will eliminate any problems for future generations.
4. We plan to install a fence to cover our air conditioner on this east side to the house. We will have to tie into her structure, and if she is allowed to put a ten foot fence down this side, due to elevation changes, etc. this structure will not be aesthetic.

SUMMARY:

Initial inspection of 201 RUTH RD, STARKVILLE, MS 39759, with the parcel number 159J-00-028.01 was performed by Code Enforcement Officer Michael Harvey on April 8, 2026. This inspection provided evidence that the property contained conditions not suitable for public health and safety, such as significant roof damage with missing shingles and holes in multiple spots of the roof. Both the north and south side of the building there appears to be missing and damaged fascia. There is some overgrown vegetation on the west side of the building. This is causing many issues for the neighboring properties, such as the appearance of the neighborhood and possibly providing a habitat for wildlife that can pose a threat to people living in the area, and the overall upkeep of the property being neglected.

A Notice of Violation was mailed to PRISOCK ROBERTA F ETAL, the owner of 201 RUTH RD, on April 8, 2026 by Ofc. Harvey. A second inspection was conducted on Ofc. Harvey on April 23, 2026.

Notice of the Public Hearing was posted on the front entrance window at City Hall and on the property on April 23, 2026. A Notice of Public Hearing was mailed on April 23, 2026, to the property tax payer/owner, PRISOCK ROBERTA F ETAL. Tax payer/owner information was obtained through the Oktibbeha County Chancery Court where property and valorem tax is collected and through Deed records.

Any structure or equipment, as defined and regulated by the adopted technical codes of Section 17, which is in such a dilapidated condition that it is unfit for human habitation, or kept in such an unsanitary condition that it is a menace to the health of people residing in the vicinity thereof, or presents a more than ordinarily dangerous fire hazard in the vicinity where it is located.
- E. All unauthorized noises and vibrations, including animal noises.
- F. All obnoxious odors and stenches, as well as the conditions, substances or other causes which give rise to the emission or generation of such odors and stenches.
- G. The carcasses of animals or fowl not disposed of within a reasonable time after death.
- H. The pollution of any public well or cistern, stream, lake, canal or body of water by sewage, dead animals, creamery or industrial wastes or other substances.
- I. Any building, structure or other place or location where any activity which is in violation of local, state or federal law is conducted, performed or maintained.
- J. Any accumulation of stagnant water permitted or maintained on any lot or piece of ground.
- K. The creation of dense smoke, noxious fumes, gas, soot, or cinders in unreasonable quantities.

16.1.2 Nuisance Prohibited

It shall be unlawful for any person to cause, permit, maintain or allow the creation or maintenance of a nuisance.

Determination that property or parcel of land is menace; authorized municipal employee may make the determination that property or parcel of land is menace under certain circumstances; notification to property owner; hearing; cleaning private property; cost and penalty as assessment against property; appeal; cleaning certain perpetual care cemetery property; application for reimbursement for costs of cleanup from perpetual care cemetery trust fund.

(1) To determine whether property or parcel of land located within a municipality is in such a state of uncleanliness as to be a menace to the public health, safety and welfare of the community, a governing authority of any municipality shall conduct a hearing, on its own motion, or upon the receipt of a petition signed by a majority of the residents residing within four hundred (400) feet of any property or parcel of land alleged to be in need of the cleaning. Notice shall be provided to the property owner by:

(a) United States mail two (2) weeks before the date of the hearing mailed to the address of the subject property, except where the land or structure(s) is apparently vacant, and to the address where the ad valorem tax notice for such property is sent by the office charged with collecting ad valorem tax; and

(b) Posting notice for at least two (2) weeks before the date of a hearing on the property or parcel of land alleged to be in need of cleaning and at city hall or another place in the municipality where such notices are posted. Any notice required by this section shall include language that informs the property owner that an adjudication at the hearing that the property or parcel of land is in need of cleaning will authorize the municipality to reenter the property or parcel of land for a period of two (2) years after final adjudication without any further hearing if notice is posted on the property or parcel of land and at city hall or another place in the municipality where such notices are generally posted at least seven (7) days before the property or parcel of land is reentered for cleaning. A copy of the required notice mailed and posted as required by this section shall be recorded in the minutes of the governing authority in conjunction with the hearing required by this section.

If, at such hearing, the governing authority shall adjudicate the property or parcel of land in its then condition to be a menace to the public health, safety and welfare of the community, the governing authority, if the owner does not do so himself, shall proceed to clean the land, by the use of municipal employees or by contract, by cutting grass and weeds; filling cisterns; securing abandoned or dilapidated buildings; removing rubbish, abandoned or dilapidated fences, outside toilets, abandoned or dilapidated buildings, slabs, personal property, which removal of personal property shall not be subject to the provisions of Section 21-39-21, and other debris; and draining cesspools and standing water therefrom. The governing authority may by resolution adjudicate the actual cost of cleaning the property and may also impose a penalty not to exceed One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) or fifty percent (50%) of the actual cost, whichever is more. The cost and any penalty may become a civil debt against the property owner, and/or, at the option of the governing authority, an assessment against the property. The "cost assessed against the property" means either the cost to the municipality of using its own employees to do the work or the cost to the municipality of any contract executed by the municipality to have the work done, and administrative costs and legal costs of the municipality. For subsequent cleaning within the one-year period after the date of the hearing at which the property or parcel of land was adjudicated in need of cleaning, upon seven (7) days' notice posted both on the property or parcel of land adjudicated in need of cleaning and at city hall or another place in the municipality where such notices are generally posted, and consistent with the municipality's adjudication as authorized in this subsection (1), a municipality may reenter the property or parcel of land to maintain cleanliness without further notice or hearing no more than six (6) times in any twelve-month period with respect to removing or securing abandoned or dilapidated buildings, slabs, dilapidated fences and outside toilets, and no more than twelve (12) times in any twenty-four-month period with respect to cutting grass and weeds and removing rubbish, personal property and other debris on the land, and the expense of cleaning of the property, except as otherwise provided in this section for removal of hazardous substances, shall not exceed an aggregate amount of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) per year, or the fair market value of the property subsequent to cleaning, whichever is more. The aggregate cost of removing hazardous substances will be the actual cost of such removal to the municipality and shall not be subject to the cost limitations provided in this subsection. The governing authority may assess the same penalty for each time the property or land is cleaned as otherwise provided in this section. The penalty provided herein shall not be assessed against the State of Mississippi upon request for reimbursement under Section 29-1-145, nor shall a municipality clean a parcel owned by the State of Mississippi without first giving notice. Upon written authority from the Secretary of State's office, for state-owned properties, a municipality may forgo the notification process that is prescribed in this subsection and proceed to clean the properties and assess costs as prescribed in this subsection, except that penalties shall not be assessed against the State of Mississippi.

Please take notice, pursuant to Mississippi Code Ann. § 21-19-11, a public hearing shall occur on **MAY 19, 2026** before the Starkville Board of Aldermen at 5:30 PM in the Municipal Courtroom of City Hall located at 110 West Main Street for the purpose of determining whether the property referenced above is in such a state of uncleanness as to be a menace to the public health, safety, and welfare of the community. The property owner and all interested persons are invited and encouraged to attend.

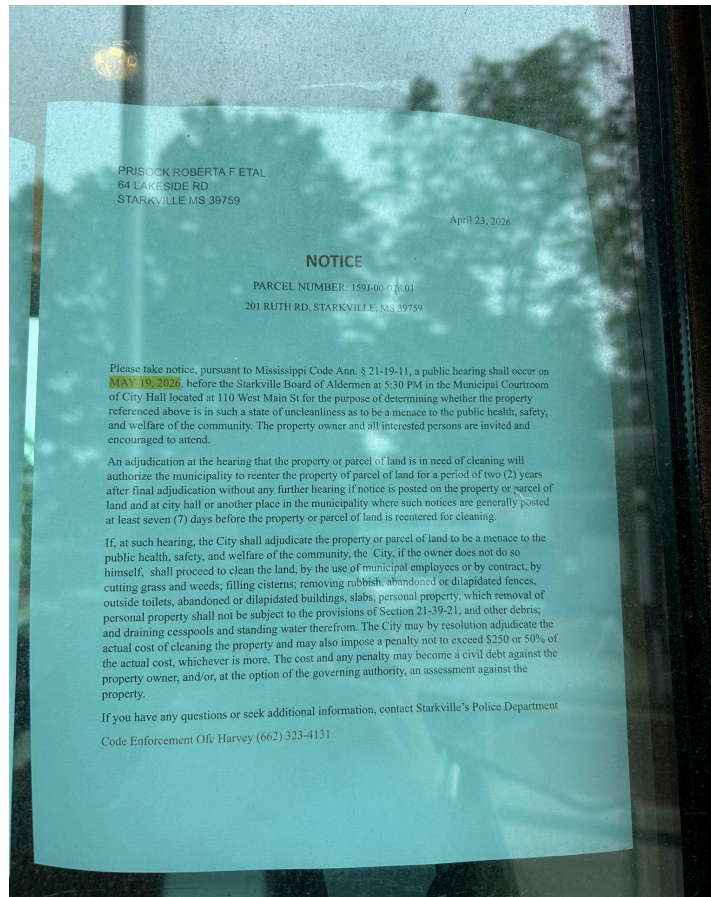
An adjudication at the hearing that the property or parcel of land is in need of cleaning will authorize the municipality to reenter the property or parcel of land for a period of two (2) years after final adjudication without any further hearing if notice is posted on the property or parcel of land and at city hall or another place in the municipality where such notices are generally posted at least seven (7) days before the property or parcel of land is reentered for cleaning.

If, at such hearing, the City shall adjudicate the property or parcel of land to be a menace to the public health, safety, and welfare of the community, the City, if the owner does not do so himself, shall proceed to clean the land, by the use of municipal employees or by contract, by cutting grass and weeds; filling cisterns; removing rubbish, abandoned or dilapidated fences, outside toilets, abandoned or dilapidated buildings, slabs, personal property, which removal of personal property shall not be subject to the provisions of Section 21-39-21, and other debris; and draining cesspools and standing water therefrom. The City may by resolution adjudicate the actual cost of cleaning the property and may also impose a penalty not to exceed \$250 or 50% of the actual cost, whichever is more. The cost and any penalty may become a civil debt against the property owner, and/or, at the option of the governing authority, an assessment against the property.

1. That affiants have good reason to believe and do believe that certain things hereinafter described as now being concealed in or about the following place in this county:

The entire property and house, including any locked or secured rooms or compartments at 201 Ruth Rd, City of Starkville, Oktibbeha County, Mississippi, Parcel #159J-00-028.01, and any out buildings on the property to include a garage and storage buildings.

2. That the place described above is occupied and controlled by:

PRISOCK ROBERTA F ETAL, and unknown persons.

3. That said things particularly described as follows:

Any and all evidence of structural damage and unsanitary health conditions that are unfit for human habitation and a menace to the public health, safety, and welfare.

IN VIOLATION OF STARKVILLE UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE SECTION 16.1.1 SUB SECTION D. (GENERAL NUISANCE), AS WELL AS 2020 MISSISSIPPI CODE 21-19-11 (HEALTH, SAFETY, AND WELFARE).

5. The facts tending to establish the following grounds for issuance of a Search Warrant are set forth in the affidavit with attached sheet headed Underlying Facts and Circumstances, which were reviewed by this court. This court, having examined and considered said affidavit and attachment, and also having heard and considered the evidence in support thereof from the affiants named therein does find that probable cause for the issuance of a search warrant does exist. THEREFORE, you are hereby commanded to proceed at any time in the day or night to the place described above and search forthwith said place for the things specified above, making known to the person or persons occupying or controlling said place, if any, your purpose and authority for so doing, and if the things specified above be found there to seize them, leaving a copy of this warrant and a receipt for the things taken; and bring the things seized before the court instant; and prepare a written inventory of the items seized, and have then and there this writ, with your proceedings noted therein.

6. Do not interpret this writ as limiting your authority to seize all contraband and things the possession of which in itself is unlawful which you find incident to your search, or as limiting your authority to make otherwise valid arrest at the place described above.

SUBJECT:

Public hearing and consideration under Miss. Code Ann. § 21-19-11 to determine whether the property located at 245 RUTH RD, STARKVILLE, MS 39759, with the parcel number 159J-00-028.01 is in such a state of uncleanliness as to be a menace to the public health, safety, and welfare of the community and such that clean up of the property should occur.

SUMMARY:

Initial inspection of 245 RUTH RD, STARKVILLE, MS 39759, with the parcel number 159J-00-028.01 was performed by Code Enforcement Officer Michael Harvey on April 8, 2026. This inspection provided evidence that the property contained conditions not suitable for public health and safety, such as significant roof damage with missing shingles and large holes in multiple spots of the roof. The northeast side of the building damaged fascia and rotten siding along with missing windows. There is overgrown vegetation on all visible sides of the building. This is causing many issues for the neighboring properties, such as the appearance of the neighborhood and possibly providing a habitat for wildlife that can pose a threat to people living in the area, and the overall upkeep of the property being neglected.

A Notice of Violation was mailed to PRISOCK ROBERTA F ETAL, the owner of 245 RUTH RD, on April 8, 2026 by Ofc. Harvey. A second inspection was conducted on Ofc. Harvey on April 23, 2026.

Notice of the Public Hearing was posted on the front entrance window at City Hall and on the property on April 23, 2026. A Notice of Public Hearing was mailed on April 23, 2026, to the property tax payer/owner, PRISOCK ROBERTA F ETAL. Tax payer/owner information was obtained through the Oktibbeha County Chancery Court where property and valorem tax is collected and through Deed records.

SUGGESTED MOTION:

Move to determine the property, located at 245 RUTH RD, STARKVILLE, MS 39759, with the parcel number 159J-00-028.01, is a menace to the public health, safety, and welfare of the community and will be subject to clean up under Miss. Code Ann. § 21-19-11, thus allowing the City of Starkville to clean the site. It is recommended that the city take action to remove the structure on this property.

16.1.3 Nuisance Violation

A nuisance shall be a condition or situation that results in an interference with the use and enjoyment of public and private property. To protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public, maintaining, using, placing, depositing, leaving, or permitting of any item or action classified as a nuisance shall not be permitted.

16.1.1 General Nuisance

Nuisance shall include but not be limited to:

- A. Accumulation of noxious weeds and other rank vegetation.
- B. Accumulations of rubbish, trash, refuse, junk and other abandoned materials, metals, lumber or other things.
- C. Any condition which provides harborage for rats, mice, snakes and other vermin.
- D. Any structure or equipment, as defined and regulated by the adopted technical codes of Section 17, which is in such a dilapidated condition that it is unfit for human habitation, or kept in such an unsanitary condition that it is a menace to the health of people residing in the vicinity thereof, or presents a more than ordinarily dangerous fire hazard in the vicinity where it is located.
- E. All unauthorized noises and vibrations, including animal noises.
- F. All obnoxious odors and stenches, as well as the conditions, substances or other causes which give rise to the emission or generation of such odors and stenches.
- G. The carcasses of animals or fowl not disposed of within a reasonable time after death.
- H. The pollution of any public well or cistern, stream, lake, canal or body of water by sewage, dead animals, creamery or industrial wastes or other substances.
- I. Any building, structure or other place or location where any activity which is in violation of local, state or federal law is conducted, performed or maintained.
- J. Any accumulation of stagnant water permitted or maintained on any lot or piece of ground.
- K. The creation of dense smoke, noxious fumes, gas, soot, or cinders in unreasonable quantities.

16.1.2 Nuisance Prohibited

It shall be unlawful for any person to cause, permit, maintain or allow the creation or maintenance of a nuisance.

16.1.3 Nuisance Violation

Whenever a nuisance is found to exist, the Code Enforcement Officer shall follow the process and procedures for issuance of a code violation as stated in Section 3.19.

Section 21-19-11

Determination that property or parcel of land is menace; authorized municipal employee may make the determination that property or parcel of land is menace under certain circumstances; notification to property owner; hearing; cleaning private property; cost and penalty as assessment against property; appeal; cleaning certain perpetual care cemetery property; application for reimbursement for costs of cleanup from perpetual care cemetery trust fund.

(1) To determine whether property or parcel of land located within a municipality is in such a state of uncleanliness as to be a menace to the public health, safety and welfare of the community, a governing authority of any municipality shall conduct a hearing, on its own motion, or upon the receipt of a petition signed by a majority of the residents residing within four hundred (400) feet of any property or parcel of land alleged to be in need of the cleaning. Notice shall be provided to the property owner by:

(a) United States mail two (2) weeks before the date of the hearing mailed to the address of the subject property, except where the land or structure(s) is apparently vacant, and to the address where the ad valorem tax notice for such property is sent by the office charged with collecting ad valorem tax; and

(b) Posting notice for at least two (2) weeks before the date of a hearing on the property or parcel of land alleged to be in need of cleaning and at city hall or another place in the municipality where such notices are posted. Any notice required by this section shall include language that informs the property owner that an adjudication at the hearing that the property or parcel of land is in need of cleaning will authorize the municipality to reenter the property or parcel of land for a period of two (2) years after final adjudication without any further hearing if notice is posted on the property or parcel of land and at city hall or another place in the municipality where such notices are generally posted at least seven (7) days before the property or parcel of land is reentered for cleaning. A copy of the required notice mailed and posted as required by this section shall be recorded in the minutes of the governing authority in conjunction with the hearing required by this section.

If, at such hearing, the governing authority shall adjudicate the property or parcel of land in its then condition to be a menace to the public health, safety and welfare of the community, the governing authority, if the owner does not do so himself, shall proceed to clean the land, by the use of municipal employees or by contract, by cutting grass and weeds; filling cisterns; securing abandoned or dilapidated buildings; removing rubbish, abandoned or dilapidated fences, outside toilets, abandoned or dilapidated buildings, slabs, personal property, which removal of personal property shall not be subject to the provisions of Section 21-39-21, and other debris; and draining cesspools and standing water therefrom. The governing authority may by resolution adjudicate the actual cost of cleaning the property and may also impose a penalty not to exceed One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) or fifty percent (50%) of the actual cost, whichever is more. The cost and any penalty may become a civil debt against the property owner, and/or, at the option of the governing authority, an assessment against the property. The "cost assessed against the property" means either the cost to the municipality of using its own employees to do the work or the cost to the municipality of any contract executed by the municipality to have the work done, and administrative costs and legal costs of the municipality. For subsequent cleaning within the one-year period after the date of the hearing at which the property or parcel of land was adjudicated in need of cleaning, upon seven (7) days' notice posted both on the property or parcel of land adjudicated in need of cleaning and at city hall or another place in the municipality where such notices are generally posted, and consistent with the municipality's adjudication as authorized in this subsection (1), a municipality may reenter the property or parcel of land to maintain cleanliness without further notice or hearing no more than six (6) times in any twelve-month period with respect to removing or securing abandoned or dilapidated buildings, slabs, dilapidated fences and outside toilets, and no more than twelve (12) times in any twenty-four-month period with respect to cutting grass and weeds and removing rubbish, personal property and other debris on the land, and the expense of cleaning of the property, except as otherwise provided in this section for removal of hazardous substances, shall not exceed an aggregate amount of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) per year, or the fair market value of the property subsequent to cleaning, whichever is more. The aggregate cost of removing hazardous substances will be the actual cost of such removal to the municipality and shall not be subject to the cost limitations provided in this subsection. The governing authority may assess the same penalty for each time the property or land is cleaned as otherwise provided in this section. The penalty provided herein shall not be assessed against the State of Mississippi upon request for reimbursement under Section 29-1-145, nor shall a municipality clean a parcel owned by the State of Mississippi without first giving notice. Upon written authority from the Secretary of State's office, for state-owned properties, a municipality may forgo the notification process that is prescribed in this subsection and proceed to clean the properties and assess costs as prescribed in this subsection, except that penalties shall not be assessed against the State of Mississippi.

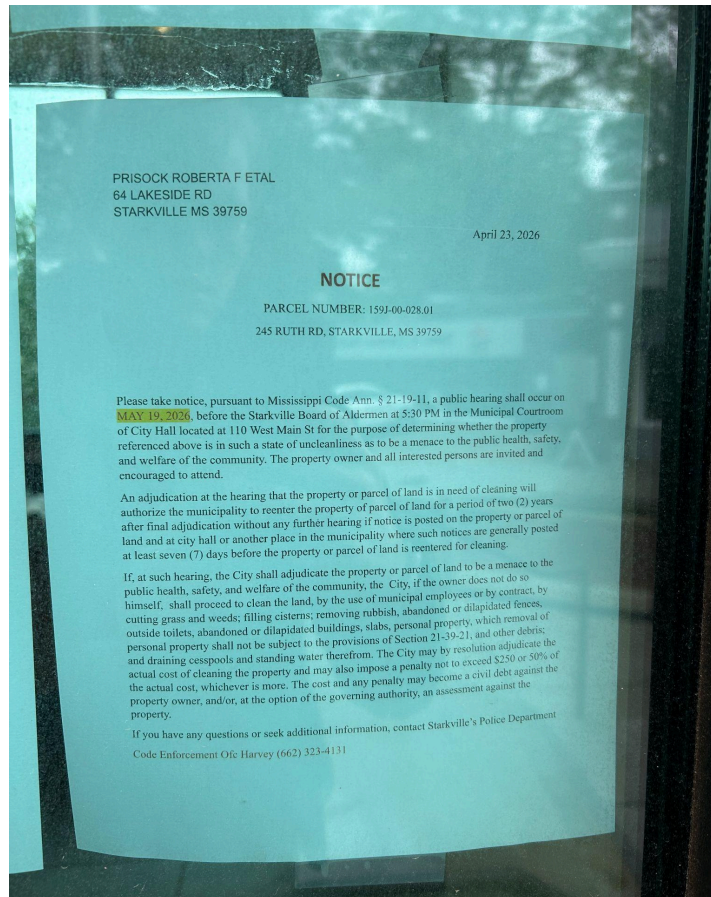

The City may by resolution adjudicate the actual cost of cleaning the property and may also impose a penalty not to exceed \$250 or 50% of the actual cost, whichever is more. The cost and any penalty may become a civil debt against the property owner, and/or, at the option of the governing authority, an assessment against the property.

Public hearing and consideration under Miss. Code Ann. § 21-19-11 to determine whether the property located at 305 RUTH RD, STARKVILLE, MS 39759, with the parcel number 159J-00-028.01 is in such a state of uncleanliness as to be a menace to the public health, safety, and welfare of the community and such that clean up of the property should occur.

SUMMARY:

Initial inspection of 305 RUTH RD, STARKVILLE, MS 39759, with the parcel number 159J-00-028.01 was performed by Code Enforcement Officer Michael Harvey on April 8, 2026. This inspection provided evidence that the property contained conditions not suitable for public health and safety, such as significant damage to the front porch which has damaged shingles and has started to collapse. The north side of the building appears to have damaged fascia and broken siding. There is some overgrown vegetation on all sides of the building. This is causing many issues for the neighboring properties, such as the appearance of the neighborhood and possibly providing a habitat for wildlife that can pose a threat to people living in the area, and the overall upkeep of the property being neglected.

A Notice of Violation was mailed to PRISOCK ROBERTA F ETAL, the owner of 305 RUTH RD, on April 8, 2026 by Ofc. Harvey. A second inspection was conducted on Ofc. Harvey on April 23, 2026.

Notice of the Public Hearing was posted on the front entrance window at City Hall and on the property on April 23, 2026. A Notice of Public Hearing was mailed on April 23, 2026, to the property tax payer/owner, PRISOCK ROBERTA F ETAL. Tax payer/owner information was obtained through the Oktibbeha County Chancery Court where property and valorem tax is collected and through Deed records.

- C. Any condition which provides harborage for rats, mice, snakes and other vermin.
- D. Any structure or equipment, as defined and regulated by the adopted technical codes of Section 17, which is in such a dilapidated condition that it is unfit for human habitation, or kept in such an unsanitary condition that it is a menace to the health of people residing in the vicinity thereof, or presents a more than ordinarily dangerous fire hazard in the vicinity where it is located.
- E. All unauthorized noises and vibrations, including animal noises.
- F. All obnoxious odors and stenches, as well as the conditions, substances or other causes which give rise to the emission or generation of such odors and stenches.
- G. The carcasses of animals or fowl not disposed of within a reasonable time after death.
- H. The pollution of any public well or cistern, stream, lake, canal or body of water by sewage, dead animals, creamery or industrial wastes or other substances.
- I. Any building, structure or other place or location where any activity which is in violation of local, state or federal law is conducted, performed or maintained.
- J. Any accumulation of stagnant water permitted or maintained on any lot or piece of ground.
- K. The creation of dense smoke, noxious fumes, gas, soot, or cinders in unreasonable quantities.

16.1.2 Nuisance Prohibited

It shall be unlawful for any person to cause, permit, maintain or allow the creation or maintenance of a nuisance.

16.1.3 Nuisance Violation

Whenever a nuisance is found to exist, the Code Enforcement Officer shall follow the process and procedures for issuance of a code violation as stated in Section 3.19.

Section 21-19-11

Determination that property or parcel of land is menace; authorized municipal employee may make the determination that property or parcel of land is menace under certain circumstances; notification to property owner; hearing; cleaning private property; cost and penalty as assessment against property; appeal; cleaning certain perpetual care cemetery property; application for reimbursement for costs of cleanup from perpetual care cemetery trust fund.

(1) To determine whether property or parcel of land located within a municipality is in such a state of uncleanliness as to be a menace to the public health, safety and welfare of the community, a governing authority of any municipality shall conduct a hearing, on its own motion, or upon the receipt of a petition signed by a majority of the residents residing within four hundred (400) feet of any property or parcel of land alleged to be in need of the cleaning. Notice shall be provided to the property owner by:

(a) United States mail two (2) weeks before the date of the hearing mailed to the address of the subject property, except where the land or structure(s) is apparently vacant, and to the address where the ad valorem tax notice for such property is sent by the office charged with collecting ad valorem tax; and

(b) Posting notice for at least two (2) weeks before the date of a hearing on the property or parcel of land alleged to be in need of cleaning and at city hall or another place in the municipality where such notices are posted. Any notice required by this section shall include language that informs the property owner that an adjudication at the hearing that the property or parcel of land is in need of cleaning will authorize the municipality to reenter the property or parcel of land for a period of two (2) years after final adjudication without any further hearing if notice is posted on the property or parcel of land and at city hall or another place in the municipality where such notices are generally posted at least seven (7) days before the property or parcel of land is reentered for cleaning. A copy of the required notice mailed and posted as required by this section shall be recorded in the minutes of the governing authority in conjunction with the hearing required by this section.

If, at such hearing, the governing authority shall adjudicate the property or parcel of land in its then condition to be a menace to the public health, safety and welfare of the community, the governing authority, if the owner does not do so himself, shall proceed to clean the land, by the use of municipal employees or by contract, by cutting grass and weeds; filling cisterns; securing abandoned or dilapidated buildings; removing rubbish, abandoned or dilapidated fences, outside toilets, abandoned or dilapidated buildings, slabs, personal property, which removal of personal property shall not be subject to the provisions of Section 21-39-21, and other debris; and draining cesspools and standing water therefrom. The governing authority may by resolution adjudicate the actual cost of cleaning the property and may also impose a penalty not to exceed One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) or fifty percent (50%) of the actual cost, whichever is more. The cost and any penalty may become a civil debt against the property owner, and/or, at the option of the governing authority, an assessment against the property. The "cost assessed against the property" means either the cost to the municipality of using its own employees to do the work or the cost to the municipality of any contract executed by the municipality to have the work done, and administrative costs and legal costs of the municipality. For subsequent cleaning within the one-year period after the date of the hearing at which the property or parcel of land was adjudicated in need of cleaning, upon seven (7) days' notice posted both on the property or parcel of land adjudicated in need of cleaning and at city hall or another place in the municipality where such notices are generally posted, and consistent with the municipality's adjudication as authorized in this subsection (1), a municipality may reenter the property or parcel of land to maintain cleanliness without further notice or hearing no more than six (6) times in any twelve-month period with respect to removing or securing abandoned or dilapidated buildings, slabs, dilapidated fences and outside toilets, and no more than twelve (12) times in any twenty-four-month period with respect to cutting grass and weeds and removing rubbish, personal property and other debris on the land, and the expense of cleaning of the property, except as otherwise provided in this section for removal of hazardous substances, shall not exceed an aggregate amount of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) per year, or the fair market value of the property subsequent to cleaning, whichever is more. The aggregate cost of removing hazardous substances will be the actual cost of such removal to the municipality and shall not be subject to the cost limitations provided in this subsection. The governing authority may assess the same penalty for each time the property or land is cleaned as otherwise provided in this section. The penalty provided herein shall not be assessed against the State of Mississippi upon request for reimbursement under Section 29-1-145, nor shall a municipality clean a parcel owned by the State of Mississippi without first giving notice. Upon written authority from the Secretary of State's office, for state-owned properties, a municipality may forgo the notification process that is prescribed in this subsection and proceed to clean the properties and assess costs as prescribed in this subsection, except that penalties shall not be assessed against the State of Mississippi.

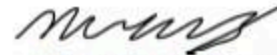

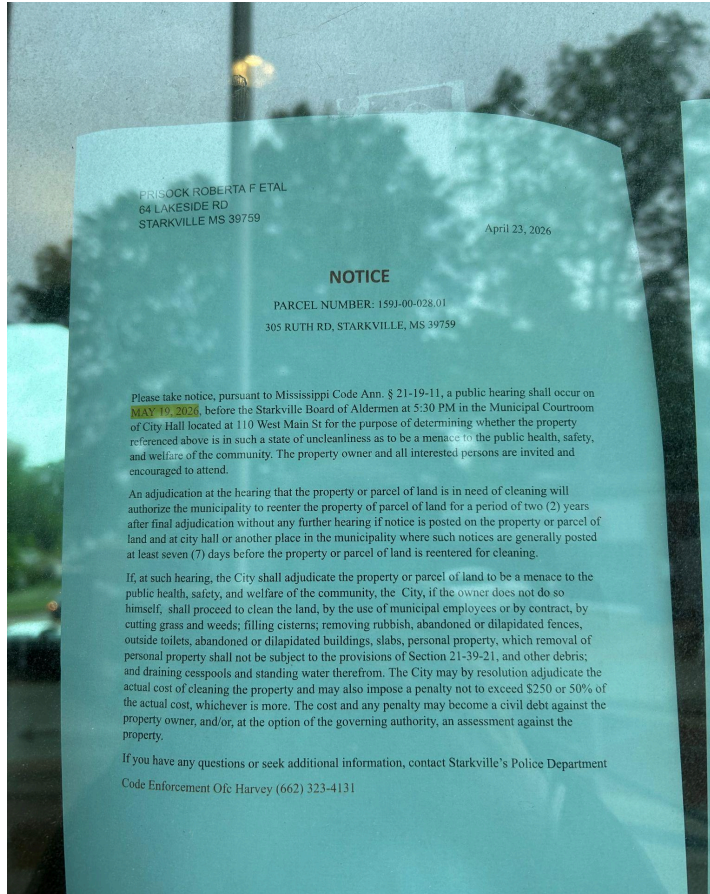

The City may by resolution adjudicate the actual cost of cleaning the property and may also impose a penalty not to exceed \$250 or 50% of the actual cost, whichever is more. The cost and any penalty may become a civil debt against the property owner, and/or, at the option of the governing authority, an assessment against the property.

SUBJECT:

Public hearing and consideration under Miss. Code Ann. § 21-19-11 to determine whether the property located at 325 RUTH RD, STARKVILLE, MS 39759, with the parcel number 159J-00-028.01 is in such a state of uncleanliness as to be a menace to the public health, safety, and welfare of the community and such that clean up of the property should occur.

SUMMARY:

Initial inspection of 325 RUTH RD, STARKVILLE, MS 39759, with the parcel number 159J-00-028.01 was performed by Code Enforcement Officer Michael Harvey on April 8, 2026. This inspection provided evidence that the property contained conditions not suitable for public health and safety, such as significant roof damage with missing shingles and holes in the roof. The north side of the building has what appears to be damaged fascia and rotten siding. There is also some overgrown vegetation on the sides of the building along with a significantly damaged front door awning. This is causing many issues for the neighboring properties, such as the appearance of the neighborhood and possibly providing a habitat for wildlife that can pose a threat to people living in the area, and the overall upkeep of the property being neglected.

A Notice of Violation was mailed to PRISOCK ROBERTA F ETAL, the owner of 325 RUTH RD, on April 8, 2026 by Ofc. Harvey. A second inspection was conducted on Ofc. Harvey on April 23, 2026.

Notice of the Public Hearing was posted on the front entrance window at City Hall and on the property on April 23, 2026. A Notice of Public Hearing was mailed on April 23, 2026, to the property tax payer/owner, PRISOCK ROBERTA F ETAL. Tax payer/owner information was obtained through the Oktibbeha County Chancery Court where property and valorem tax is collected and through Deed records.

16.1.1 General Nuisance

Nuisance shall include but not be limited to:

- A. Accumulation of noxious weeds and other rank vegetation.
- B. Accumulations of rubbish, trash, refuse, junk and other abandoned materials, metals, lumber or other things.
- C. Any condition which provides harborage for rats, mice, snakes and other vermin.
- D. Any structure or equipment, as defined and regulated by the adopted technical codes of Section 17, which is in such a dilapidated condition that it is unfit for human habitation, or kept in such an unsanitary condition that it is a menace to the health of people residing in the vicinity thereof, or presents a more than ordinarily dangerous fire hazard in the vicinity where it is located.
- E. All unauthorized noises and vibrations, including animal noises.
- F. All obnoxious odors and stenches, as well as the conditions, substances or other causes which give rise to the emission or generation of such odors and stenches.
- G. The carcasses of animals or fowl not disposed of within a reasonable time after death.
- H. The pollution of any public well or cistern, stream, lake, canal or body of water by sewage, dead animals, creamery or industrial wastes or other substances.
- I. Any building, structure or other place or location where any activity which is in violation of local, state or federal law is conducted, performed or maintained.
- J. Any accumulation of stagnant water permitted or maintained on any lot or piece of ground.
- K. The creation of dense smoke, noxious fumes, gas, soot, or cinders in unreasonable quantities.

16.1.2 Nuisance Prohibited

It shall be unlawful for any person to cause, permit, maintain or allow the creation or maintenance of a nuisance.

16.1.3 Nuisance Violation

Whenever a nuisance is found to exist, the Code Enforcement Officer shall follow the process and procedures for issuance of a code violation as stated in Section 3.19.

Section 21-19-11

Determination that property or parcel of land is menace; authorized municipal employee may make the determination that property or parcel of land is menace under certain circumstances; notification to property owner; hearing; cleaning private property; cost and penalty as assessment against property; appeal; cleaning certain perpetual care cemetery property; application for reimbursement for costs of cleanup from perpetual care cemetery trust fund.

(1) To determine whether property or parcel of land located within a municipality is in such a state of uncleanliness as to be a menace to the public health, safety and welfare of the community, a governing authority of any municipality shall conduct a hearing, on its own motion, or upon the receipt of a petition signed by a majority of the residents residing within four hundred (400) feet of any property or parcel of land alleged to be in need of the cleaning. Notice shall be provided to the property owner by:

(a) United States mail two (2) weeks before the date of the hearing mailed to the address of the subject property, except where the land or structure(s) is apparently vacant, and to the address where the ad valorem tax notice for such property is sent by the office charged with collecting ad valorem tax; and

(b) Posting notice for at least two (2) weeks before the date of a hearing on the property or parcel of land alleged to be in need of cleaning and at city hall or another place in the municipality where such notices are posted. Any notice required by this section shall include language that informs the property owner that an adjudication at the hearing that the property or parcel of land is in need of cleaning will authorize the municipality to reenter the property or parcel of land for a period of two (2) years after final adjudication without any further hearing if notice is posted on the property or parcel of land and at city hall or another place in the municipality where such notices are generally posted at least seven (7) days before the property or parcel of land is reentered for cleaning. A copy of the required notice mailed and posted as required by this section shall be recorded in the minutes of the governing authority in conjunction with the hearing required by this section.

If, at such hearing, the governing authority shall adjudicate the property or parcel of land in its then condition to be a menace to the public health, safety and welfare of the community, the governing authority, if the owner does not do so himself, shall proceed to clean the land, by the use of municipal employees or by contract, by cutting grass and weeds; filling cisterns; securing abandoned or dilapidated buildings; removing rubbish, abandoned or dilapidated fences, outside toilets, abandoned or dilapidated buildings, slabs, personal property, which removal of personal property shall not be subject to the provisions of Section 21-39-21, and other debris; and draining cesspools and standing water therefrom. The governing authority may by resolution adjudicate the actual cost of cleaning the property and may also impose a penalty not to exceed One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) or fifty percent (50%) of the actual cost, whichever is more. The cost and any penalty may become a civil debt against the property owner, and/or, at the option of the governing authority, an assessment against the property. The "cost assessed against the property" means either the cost to the municipality of using its own employees to do the work or the cost to the municipality of any contract executed by the municipality to have the work done, and administrative costs and legal costs of the municipality. For subsequent cleaning within the one-year period after the date of the hearing at which the property or parcel of land was adjudicated in need of cleaning, upon seven (7) days' notice posted both on the property or parcel of land adjudicated in need of cleaning and at city hall or another place in the municipality where such notices are generally posted, and consistent with the municipality's adjudication as authorized in this subsection (1), a municipality may reenter the property or parcel of land to maintain cleanliness without further notice or hearing no more than six (6) times in any twelve-month period with respect to removing or securing abandoned or dilapidated buildings, slabs, dilapidated fences and outside toilets, and no more than twelve (12) times in any twenty-four-month period with respect to cutting grass and weeds and removing rubbish, personal property and other debris on the land, and the expense of cleaning of the property, except as otherwise provided in this section for removal of hazardous substances, shall not exceed an aggregate amount of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) per year, or the fair market value of the property subsequent to cleaning, whichever is more. The aggregate cost of removing hazardous substances will be the actual cost of such removal to the municipality and shall not be subject to the cost limitations provided in this subsection. The governing authority may assess the same penalty for each time the property or land is cleaned as otherwise provided in this section. The penalty provided herein shall not be assessed against the State of Mississippi upon request for reimbursement under Section 29-1-145, nor shall a municipality clean a parcel owned by the State of Mississippi without first giving notice. Upon written authority from the Secretary of State's office, for state-owned properties, a municipality may forgo the notification process that is prescribed in this subsection and proceed to clean the properties and assess costs as prescribed in this subsection, except that penalties shall not be assessed against the State of Mississippi.

3. Pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. §21-19-11 (1972, as amended), City of Starkville shall charge Owner with the actual cost of lot mowing, including administrative and legal costs of the municipality, and may also impose a penalty of one-half of the actual cost or \$1500.00, whichever is more.

4. The City of Starkville, by and through its Board, at a regularly scheduled meeting held on **May 19, 2026**, adjudicated the actual cost of cleanup to be **\$4,290.64**. This amount is assessed as a lien on the real property described above.

5. This assessment will be enrolled as a judgment lien on the Oktibbeha County, Mississippi judgment roll in the office of the Circuit Clerk of Oktibbeha County, Mississippi by providing a certified copy of this resolution to the Circuit Clerk, and the tax collector of the municipality shall proceed to sell the land to satisfy the lien as now provided by law for the sale of lands for delinquent municipal taxes. 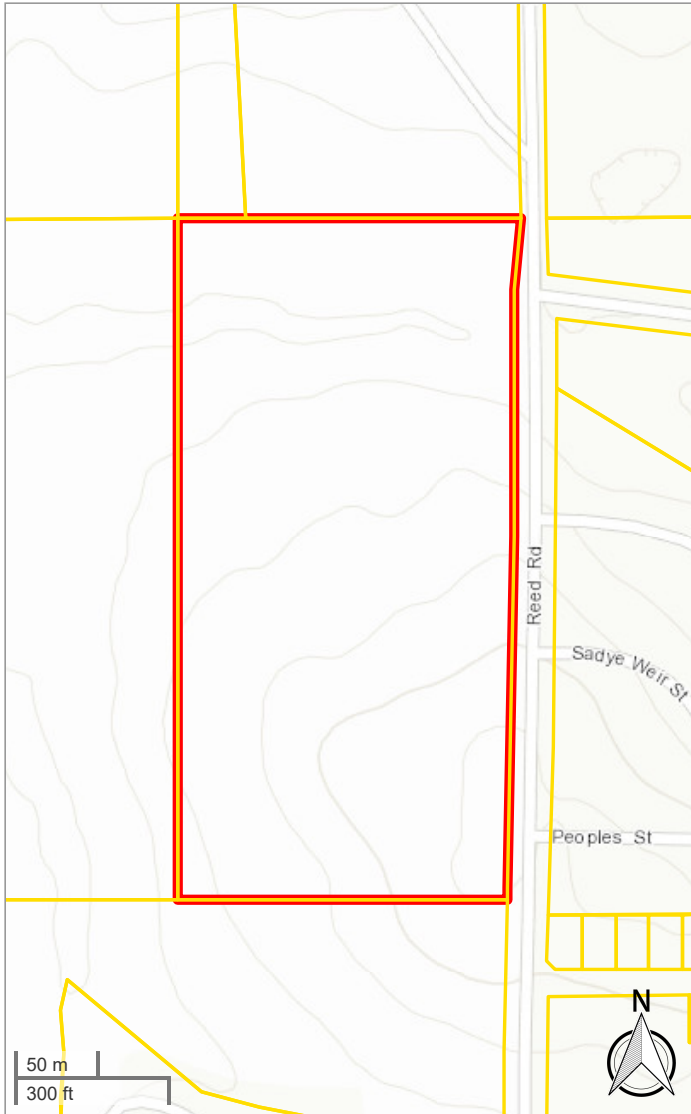

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Starkville, Mississippi (the “Governing Body” of the “Municipality”), acting for and on behalf of the Municipality, hereby finds, determines, adjudicates, and declares as follows:

1. (a) In addition to any words and terms elsewhere defined herein, the following words and terms shall have the following meanings, unless some other meaning is plainly intended:

“Act” shall mean Sections 21-45-1 *et seq.*, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.

“Additional Bonds” shall mean bonds issued on a parity of lien with regard to the pledge of the TIF Revenues with the Bonds pursuant to the requirements of the Bond Resolution.

“Additional Bonds Resolution” shall mean any resolution of the Municipality authorizing and directing the issuance of Additional Bonds.

“Annual Debt Service Requirement” shall mean for any Fiscal Year, the sum of the following with respect to all Outstanding Bonds: (a) all amounts required to pay principal (at maturity or upon mandatory redemption other than mandatory sinking fund redemption payments), (b) the amount of any mandatory sinking fund requirement (including for the Fiscal Year in which such Bonds shall be redeemed from the sinking fund only such amount as was not required to be funded prior to such Fiscal Year), and (c) interest due on all Outstanding Bonds.

“Board” means the Board of Supervisors of the County.

“Bonds” or “Bond” shall mean the Municipality's Tax Increment Financing Revenue Bonds, Series 2026 (HPM Development Project), in one or more series, authorized and directed to be issued in the Bond Resolution. The Bonds shall be in the maximum principal amount of \$1,000,000, but in the actual amount sold and issued pursuant to the Bond Purchase Agreement, out of the total authorized amount of \$1,000,000.

“Bond Counsel” shall mean Watkins & Eager PLLC, Jackson, Mississippi, or any other nationally recognized attorneys on the subject of municipal bonds (a “Nationally Recognized Bond Counsel”).

“Bond Fund” shall mean the Bond Fund (HPM Development Project), including a Reserve Account, if any, as created by Section 2.01 of the Bond Resolution and provided for in the Interlocal Agreement.

“Bond Payments” shall mean payments of principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds, and Paying Agent charges pertaining to the Bonds, and any other payments as are provided for in the Bond Resolution regarding the payment of and security for the Bonds, and specifically including any prepayments of principal on the Bonds.

“Bond Purchase Agreement” shall mean the bond purchase agreement, commitment to finance, term sheet, or other similar agreement to be entered into between the Municipality and the Purchaser for the sale and purchase of the Bonds, attached here to as **Exhibit B**.

“Bond Resolution” shall mean this resolution adopted by the Governing Body authorizing and directing the issuance of the Bonds.

“Bondholder” or any similar term, shall mean any Person who shall be the Registered Owner of any Outstanding Bonds.

“Business Day” shall mean a day of the year on which banks located in the city in which the principal office of the Paying Agent is located are not required or authorized to remain closed.

“Captured Assessed Value” shall mean, with respect to real property within the TIF District, including personal property located thereon, the amount by which the “Current Assessed Value” of such property exceeds the “Original Assessed Value,” as such terms are defined in the Act.

“Chancery Clerk” shall mean the Chancery Clerk of the County.

“City Clerk” shall mean the City Clerk of the Municipality.

“Closing Date” with respect to the Bonds shall mean the date of issuance and delivery of the Bonds to the Purchaser.

“Code” shall mean the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, supplemented, or superseded, and any regulations promulgated thereunder.

“Costs of the Infrastructure Improvements” shall mean any or all of the costs of acquisition and construction of the Infrastructure Improvements for the Project.

“Counsel to the Municipality” shall mean Mitchell, McNutt & Sams, Columbus, Mississippi.

“County” shall mean Oktibbeha County, Mississippi.

“County Ad Valorem TIF Revenues” shall mean 100% of the County’s additional ad valorem tax revenues received by the County resulting from ad valorem taxes on the Captured Assessed Value of real property, including personal property located thereon, within the boundaries of the TIF District, as defined and calculated in the manner set forth in the Act; provided, however, that the amount of the Bonds to be issued will be sized based upon 50% of the County Ad Valorem TIF Revenues.

“Debt Service Reserve Requirement” means the lesser of the following: (i) the maximum amount of principal and interest becoming due in the current or any future Fiscal Year on all Bonds then Outstanding; (ii) 120% of the average Annual Debt Service Requirement for the Bonds; or (iii) 10% of the stated principal amount of the Bonds.

“Developer” shall mean HPM Development, LLC, a Mississippi limited liability company, or any entities related thereto, or any successors or assigns thereof, the developer of the Project.

“Development and Reimbursement Agreement” shall, collectively, mean that certain development and reimbursement agreement between the Municipality and the Developer, approved by the Governing Body on June 16, 2015, and dated June 16, 2015, and that certain amended and restated development and reimbursement agreement between the Municipality and the Developer, approved by the Governing Body on April 21, 2026, and dated April 21, 2026.

“DTC” shall mean The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York.

“Fiscal Year” shall mean the period commencing on the first day of October of one year and ending with the last day of September of the following year.

“Governing Body” shall mean the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Municipality.

“Bondholder” or any similar term, shall mean any Person who shall be the Registered Owner of any Outstanding Bonds.

“Improvement Fund” shall mean the Improvement Fund (HPM Development Project), created by Section 2.01 of the Bond Resolution.

“Infrastructure Improvements” shall mean various public infrastructure improvements, as described further in the TIF Plan, including, but not limited to, installing or constructing various infrastructure improvements for the use or benefit of the Project, which may include but are not limited to, acquiring and constructing improvements, which may include, but not necessarily be limited to, installation, rehabilitation and/or relocation of utilities such as water and sanitary sewer; construction, renovation, demolition or rehabilitation of drainage improvements, roadways, curbs, gutters, sidewalks, and surface parking; demolition of structures; relocation of electrical lines; lighting; signalization; landscaping of rights-of way; related soft costs including, but not limited to, architectural/engineering fees, attorney’s fees, TIF Plan preparation fees, issuance costs, capitalized interest, and other related soft costs.

“Interlocal Agreement” shall mean the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the Municipality and the County, pursuant to the Act and Sections 17-11-1 *et seq.*, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the “Interlocal Act”), approved by the Governing Body of the Municipality on June 16, 2015, approved by the Board of the County on June 24, 2015, approved by the Attorney General of the State on September 16, 2015, filed with the Secretary of State of the State on September 23, 2015, and filed with the Chancery Clerk of the County on October 6, 2015, wherein the Municipality and the County agree to pay a portion of the Bonds from the TIF Revenues, as provided in the Interlocal Agreement.

“Maximum Annual Debt Service Requirement” shall mean, at any given time of determination with respect to the Bonds or any series thereof, an amount equal to the maximum Annual Debt Service Requirement coming due thereon for the then current or any future Fiscal Year.

“Mayor” shall mean the Mayor of the Municipality.

“Municipal Advisor” shall mean Stephens Inc., Ridgeland, Mississippi, the “Independent Registered Municipal Advisor” to the Municipality.

“Municipality” shall mean the City of Starkville, Mississippi.

“Municipality Ad Valorem TIF Revenues” shall mean 100% of the Municipality’s additional ad valorem tax revenues received by the Municipality resulting from ad valorem taxes on the Captured Assessed Value of real property, including personal property located thereon, within the boundaries of the TIF District, as defined and calculated in the manner set forth in the Act; the amount of the Bonds to be issued will be sized based upon 50% of the Municipality Ad Valorem TIF Revenues.

“Original Assessed Value” shall mean with regard to ad valorem taxes of the Municipality and the County, the assessed value of all real and personal property included in the TIF District at the time the TIF Plan was approved by the County on June 24, 2015, and by the City on June 16, 2015, as such term is defined in the Act.

“Outstanding” in connection with the Bonds shall mean, as of the time in question, all Bonds authenticated and delivered pursuant to the Bond Resolution, or any resolution authorizing and directing the issuance of any Additional Bonds, except:

(a) Bonds deemed paid pursuant to Section 9.02 hereof or pursuant to any similar provisions in any resolution authorizing and directing the issuance of any Additional Bonds; and

(b) Bonds in substitution for which other Bonds have been authenticated and delivered pursuant to Sections 3.03(b), 3.04, or 3.05 hereof or pursuant to any similar provisions in any Additional Bonds Resolution.

In determining whether the Bondholders of a requisite aggregate principal amount of Outstanding Bonds have concurred in any request, demand, authorization, direction, notice, consent or waiver pursuant to the provisions hereof, unless all Outstanding Bonds are so held, Bonds which are held by or on behalf of the Municipality or any Person controlling, controlled by or under common control with the Municipality shall be disregarded for the purpose of any such determination.

“Paying Agent” shall mean any bank, trust company, other institution, or the City Clerk, as designated whether herein or hereafter by the Governing Body, to make payments of the principal of and interest on the Bonds, to serve as registrar and transfer agent for the registration of owners of the Bonds, and for the performance of other duties as may be herein or hereafter specified by the Governing Body.

“Payment Date” shall mean such dates as are set out in the Bond Purchase Agreement for the payment of principal and interest on the Bonds.

“Person” shall mean an individual, partnership, corporation, trust, or unincorporated organization and a government or agency or political subdivision thereof.

“Procedures” shall mean the Post Issuance Compliance Procedures, in substantially the form set out in **Exhibit C** hereto.

“Project” shall mean, together, the original development plan of a Chevrolet, Chrysler, Dodge, Jeep, Ram Dealership Complex and mixed use development containing a convenience store, restaurant, 20,000 square feet of office space, and approximately 15 single family housing units, located on 25.68 acres off of Highway 12, Pat Station Road, and Ole West Point Road, representing a private investment in excess of \$21,000,000, and the current development plan of a Chevrolet, Chrysler, Dodge, Jeep Ram dealership and related improvements and further development of an additional dealership as well as a recreational vehicle housing complex and amenities, known as the HPM Development Project, as described more fully in the Development Agreement.

“Purchaser” shall mean the purchaser or purchasers of the Bonds.

“Record Date” shall mean, as to interest payments, the fifteenth day of the calendar month preceding the dates set for payment of interest on the Bonds and, as to payments of principal, the fifteenth day of the calendar month preceding the maturity date thereof.

“Record Date Registered Owner” shall mean the Registered Owner as of the Record Date.

“Redevelopment Plan” shall mean the Municipality’s *Tax Increment Financing Redevelopment Plan of 2026, City of Starkville, Mississippi*, as amended from time to time, approved by the Governing Body of the Municipality on April 4, 2006.

“Registered Owner” shall mean the Person whose name shall appear as the owner of a Bond in the registration records of the Municipality.

“Representation Letter” shall mean the blanket letter of representation to DTC pertaining to book-entry obligations of the Municipality.

“Reserve Account” means the debt service reserve account by that name authorized by Section 2.01 of the Bond Resolution.

“Sales Tax Rebate TIF Revenues” shall mean 100% of the City’s additional municipal sales tax diversion received by the Municipality from sales taxes collected within the boundaries of the TIF District, based upon the “original sales value,” as defined and calculated in the manner set forth in the Act; provided, however, that the amount of the Bonds to be issued will be sized based upon 50% of the Sales Tax Rebate TIF Revenues.

“State” shall mean the State of Mississippi.

“Subsection 148(f)” shall mean Subsection 148(f) of the Code.

“Subsection 148(f) Regulations” shall mean any regulations promulgated from time to time pursuant to Subsection 148(f).

“TIF District” shall mean the tax increment financing district for the Project described in the TIF Plan.

“TIF Plan” shall mean *the Tax Increment Financing Plan, HPM Development Project, Starkville, Mississippi*, adopted by the Governing Body of the Municipality on June 16, 2015, and adopted by the Board of the County on June 24, 2015.

“TIF Revenues” shall mean, together, the County Ad Valorem TIF Revenues, the Municipality Ad Valorem TIF Revenues, and the Sales Tax Rebate TIF Revenues.

(b) Words of the masculine gender shall be deemed and construed to include correlative words of the feminine and neuter genders. Unless the context shall otherwise indicate, words and terms herein defined shall be equally applicable to the plural as well as the singular form of any of such words and terms.

2. The Governing Body of the Municipality has heretofore approved the Redevelopment Plan.

3. The Governing Body of the Municipality has heretofore on June 2, 2015, adopted a resolution declaring its intention to exercise its tax increment financing power pursuant to the Act and the Redevelopment Plan, and called a public hearing on the TIF Plan to be held on June 16, 2015. Notice of the public hearing on the TIF Plan was published in *The Starkville Daily News* on June 5, 2015. The Governing Body held a public hearing on the TIF Plan on June 16, 2015, and following the public hearing, the Governing Body adopted a resolution on June 16, 2015, approving the TIF Plan.

4. The Board of the County adopted a resolution declaring its intention to approve the TIF Plan, pursuant to the Act and the Redevelopment Plan, and called a public hearing on the TIF Plan to be held on June 24, 2015. Notice of the public hearing on the TIF Plan was published in *The Starkville Daily News* on June 11, 2015. The Board held a public hearing on the TIF Plan on June 24, 2015, and following the public hearing, the Board adopted a resolution on June 24, 2015, approving the TIF Plan.

5. The Governing Body of the Municipality hereby confirms and reapproves the adoption of the Redevelopment Plan and the TIF Plan.

6. The TIF Plan and the above proceedings authorize the Municipality to use the proceeds of the Bonds to pay or reimburse all or a portion of the Costs of the Infrastructure Improvements, as detailed in the information attached hereto as **Exhibit E**.

7. On June 16, 2015, and April 21, 2026, the Governing Body of the Municipality adopted a resolution approving the execution of the Development and Reimbursement Agreement pertaining to the Project between the Municipality and the Developer, such Development and Reimbursement Agreement being recorded in the Minutes of the Governing Body.

8. The Developer requested an amendment to the Development Agreement refining the scope of the Project and extending the timeframe in which the Bonds may be issued pursuant to the Development Agreement, and in consideration thereof, the Developer agreed to forego additional series of the bonds and requested that the Municipality proceed to issue one series of the Bonds in a principal amount not to exceed \$1,000,000, which shall be used to reimburse the Developer for all or a portion of certain eligible Infrastructure Improvements. Pursuant to the Development Agreement, the Bonds must be issued within one year of the final adoption of the Development Agreement.

9. The Governing Body of the Municipality has heretofore entered into the Interlocal Agreement with the County to divert a sufficient portion of its Municipality Ad Valorem TIF Revenues and a sufficient portion of its Sales Tax Rebate TIF Revenues to the payment of Bond Payments, as provided for in the Act, in the Interlocal Act, in the Interlocal Agreement, and in the Bond Resolution.

10. The Board of the County has heretofore entered into the Interlocal Agreement with the Municipality to divert a sufficient portion of its County Ad Valorem TIF Revenues to the

payment of Bond Payments, as provided for in the Act, in the Interlocal Act, in the Interlocal Agreement, and in the Bond Resolution.

11. The Ad Valorem Tax Assessment Certificate of the Tax Assessor of the County, dated April 27, 2026, is attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.

12. Diversion Certificates dated April 1, 2026, from the Mississippi Department of Revenue regarding the Sales Tax Rebate TIF Revenues are attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.

13. The Municipality is now authorized pursuant to the provisions of the Act to issue the Bonds to provide funds to pay or reimburse all or a portion of the Costs of the Infrastructure Improvements, the Bonds to be payable solely from the TIF Revenues as provided herein and in the Interlocal Agreement.

14. The maximum aggregate principal amount of the Bonds authorized herein is \$1,000,000. The actual amount issued pursuant to the Bond Resolution shall be such amount as is actually sold and delivered pursuant to the Bond Purchase Agreement. Any authorized but unissued amount may be issued pursuant to subsequent deliberations and actions of the Municipality.

15. The Municipality will size the principal amount of the Bonds or any series thereof so that the principal amount of the Bonds will equal the lesser of (1) such amount as can be paid from the TIF Revenues, as determined by the Municipality in accordance with fact, and (2) \$1,000,000.

16. Pursuant to the Act and the TIF Plan, the Bonds will be secured by (a) a pledge of 100% of the Municipality Ad Valorem TIF Revenues, (b) a pledge of 100% of the Sales Tax Rebate TIF Revenues, and (c) a pledge of 100% of the County Ad Valorem TIF Revenues, further detailed in the Interlocal Agreement, all as pursuant to the Interlocal Agreement between the Municipality and the County.

17. The amount of the Bonds to be issued will be sized based upon 50% of the Municipality Ad Valorem TIF Revenues, 50% of the Sales Tax Rebate TIF Revenues, and 50% of the County Ad Valorem TIF Revenues.

18. Pursuant to the Act, the Municipality is authorized to sell the Bonds at private sale, such sale to be consummated pursuant to the Bond Purchase Agreement, and it is necessary and appropriate for the Municipality to approve and distribute the Bond Purchase Agreement, in substantially the form attached hereto as **Exhibit B**, and to authorize the Mayor to execute the Bond Purchase Agreement on behalf of the Municipality provided that: (a) the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds shall not exceed \$1,000,000, (b) the Bond Purchase Agreement shall be executed within one year of the adoption of the Bond Resolution, (c) the term of the Bonds shall not extend for more than 15 years or not longer than the remaining life of the TIF District, (d) the overall interest rate for the Bonds shall not exceed 11% per annum, and (e) the payments of principal and interest can be made from projected TIF Revenues as provided for in the Bond Resolution and in the Interlocal Agreement.

19. The Code provides that noncompliance with the provisions thereof may cause interest on obligations to become taxable retroactive to the initial date of issuance and provides that

the tax-exempt status of interest on obligations such as the Bonds is contingent on a number of future actions by the Municipality. It is necessary to make certain covenants pertaining to the exclusion of the interest on the Bonds from gross income for purposes of federal income taxation since such exclusion may depend, in part, upon continuing compliance by the Municipality with certain requirements of the Code.

20. The Municipality reasonably expects that not less than 85% of the spendable proceeds of the Bonds will be used to carry out the governmental purposes of the Bonds within a three-year period beginning on the date of issuance of the Bonds. No more than 50% of the proceeds of the Bonds will be invested in non-purpose investments (as defined in Section 148(f)(6)(A) of the Code) having a substantially guaranteed yield for four years or more.

21. The Bonds are not “private activity bonds” as such term is defined in Section 141 of the Code.

22. The Bond Purchase Agreement pertaining to the sale of the Bonds to the Purchaser should be approved by the Governing Body of the Municipality, and copies thereof distributed to prospective purchasers of the Bonds, in substantially the form attached hereto as **Exhibit B**.

23. The Governing Body of the Municipality desires to approve and adopt the Post Issuance Compliance Procedures in substantially the form attached hereto as **Exhibit C**.

24. The Municipality desires to go forward with preparation for the issuance of the Bond and in connection therewith desires to affirm and/or approve the engagement of certain professionals to assist with the issuance of the Bonds by the execution of any required letters of engagement and disclosure attached hereto as **Exhibit D**.

25. The Governing Body does now find and determine that it is necessary, advisable, and in the public interest that the Bonds be prepared, executed, and issued as hereinafter provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF STARKVILLE, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

**ARTICLE I.
STATUTORY AUTHORITY; SALE AND AWARD OF BONDS**

SECTION 1.01. AUTHORITY OF THIS RESOLUTION. The Bond Resolution is adopted pursuant to the authority of and in compliance with the provisions of the Act.

SECTION 1.02. ENGAGEMENT OF PROFESSIONALS. In connection with the issuance of the Bonds for the payment or reimbursement of all or a portion of the Costs of the Infrastructure Improvements for the Project, the Governing Body of the Municipality affirms and/or approves the engagement of certain professionals to assist with the issuance of the Bonds and authorizes the Mayor and/or the City Clerk to execute any necessary letters of engagement and disclosure. The Governing Body of the Municipality affirms or authorizes the engagement of the following: (a) Watkins & Eager PLLC, Jackson, Mississippi, to serve as Bond Counsel; and, (b) Mitchell, McNutt & Sams, Columbus, Mississippi, to serve as Counsel to the Municipality; and (c) Stephens

Inc., Ridgeland, Mississippi, to serve as Municipal Advisor. The Mayor and the City Clerk are authorized to execute any letters of engagement and/or disclosure attached hereto as **Exhibit D**.

SECTION 1.03. SALE OF BONDS PURSUANT TO BOND PURCHASE AGREEMENT.

(a) Sale of the Bonds. The Bonds shall be sold to the Purchaser pursuant to the Bond Purchase Agreement.

(b) Bond Purchase Agreement. The Bond Purchase Agreement, in substantially the form attached hereto as **Exhibit B**, is hereby approved and authorized to be distributed, and the Mayor is authorized to execute and deliver the Bond Purchase Agreement for and on behalf of the Municipality, with such completions, changes, insertions, and modifications as shall be approved by the Mayor and the Purchaser, the execution thereof by the Mayor to be conclusive evidence of such approval by the Municipality, provided that: (a) the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds shall not exceed \$1,000,000, (b) the Bond Purchase Agreement shall be executed within one year of the adoption of the Bond Resolution, (c) the term of the Bonds shall not extend for more than 15 years or not longer than the remaining life of the TIF District, (d) the overall interest rate for the Bonds shall not exceed 11% per annum, and (e) the payments of principal and interest can be made from TIF Revenues as provided for in the Bond Resolution and in the Interlocal Agreement. The Governing Body hereby approves the execution and distribution of the Bond Purchase Agreement in substantially the form set out in **Exhibit B** hereto, to facilitate the sale of the Bonds, with such completions, changes, insertions, and modifications as shall be approved by the officers of the Municipality executing and delivering the same, the execution thereof by such officers to be conclusive evidence of such approval.

ARTICLE II.

ESTABLISHMENT OF FUNDS; APPLICATION OF BOND PROCEEDS

SECTION 2.01. ESTABLISHMENT OF FUNDS. There are hereby affirmed or established the following special funds.

(a) Bond Fund (HPM Development Project). The Bond Fund is hereby authorized and established as a special trust fund of the Municipality. The Bond Fund shall be used only for the deposit of TIF Revenues and the payment of principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds, and related payment expenses, so long as any of the Bonds remain Outstanding.

(1) Reserve Account. If required by the Municipality or the Purchaser in the Bond Purchase Agreement, the Municipality shall establish a “Reserve Account” in an amount and in accordance with the provisions to be set forth in the Bond Resolution. The Reserve Account shall be maintained with a qualified depository.

(b) Improvement Fund (HPM Development Project). The Improvement Fund is hereby authorized and established as a special trust fund of the Municipality. The Improvement Fund shall be held as a special trust fund separate and apart from all other funds and accounts of the Municipality. The moneys in the Improvement Fund shall be used to pay the costs of the authorization, issuance, sale, validation, execution, and delivery of the Bonds and to pay or reimburse all or a portion of the Costs of the Infrastructure Improvements, including without limitation the reimbursements to the Developer for the moneys advanced for the Costs of the

Infrastructure Improvements, pursuant to the Development and Reimbursement Agreement and the Bond Resolution.

(c) The City Clerk and the Mayor are authorized to take such actions as are necessary to open any accounts described herein related to the Bonds with financial institutions, including, but not limited to, the Bond Fund, the Reserve Account, and the Improvement Fund.

SECTION 2.02. APPLICATION OF BOND PROCEEDS. All moneys received from the sale of the Bonds shall, on the date of delivery of the Bonds, be applied as follows:

(a) Bond Fund. A sum equal to the accrued interest, if any, received upon the sale and delivery of the Bonds shall be deposited in the Bond Fund herein established upon receipt thereof, including the:

(1) Reserve Account. If required by the Municipality or the Purchaser in the Bond Purchase Agreement, a sufficient portion of the proceeds of the sale of the Bonds shall be deposited into a Reserve Account, together with any other moneys, if any, available for such purpose, in an amount sufficient to satisfy the Debt Service Reserve Requirement.

(b) Improvement Fund. After the payment of the costs of the authorization, issuance, sale, validation, execution, and delivery of the Bonds and the funding of a Reserve Account, if required by the Municipality or the Purchaser in the Bond Purchase Agreement, the remaining proceeds of the sale of the Bonds shall be deposited into the Improvement Fund to pay the Costs of the Infrastructure Improvements for the Project.

ARTICLE III. AUTHORIZATION, TERMS AND EXECUTION OF THE BONDS

SECTION 3.01. AUTHORIZATION AND TERMS OF THE BONDS; REDEMPTION PRIOR TO MATURITY. (a) In order to finance the payment or reimbursement of all or a portion of the Costs of the Infrastructure Improvements, the Bonds are hereby authorized and directed to be issued. The Bonds shall be issued as fully registered bonds; shall be dated such date specified in the Bond Purchase Agreement; shall be in the actual principal amount specified in the Bond Purchase Agreement; shall be in the denominations specified in the Bond Purchase Agreement; shall be numbered consecutively in numerical order from 1 upward; shall bear interest from the date thereof at the rates specified in the Bond Purchase Agreement, commencing on a date specified in the Bond Purchase Agreement, payable semiannually on such dates in each year as specified in the Bond Purchase Agreement; and shall mature, subject to prior redemption, if so provided in the Bond Purchase Agreement, on the dates and in the years and principal amounts specified in the Bond Purchase Agreement.

(b) The Bonds shall be issued in such actual amount as is specified in the Bond Purchase Agreement and actually sold and delivered. The remaining authorized but unissued Bonds shall then be such amount as equals \$1,000,000 less the amount issued pursuant to the Bond Resolution and the Bond Purchase Agreement.

(c) Mandatory Sinking Fund Redemption. The Bonds may be subject to mandatory sinking fund redemption if so provided in and according to the terms and conditions in the Bond Purchase Agreement.

(d) Optional Redemption.

(1) The Bonds may be subject to optional redemption prior to their respective maturities at the election of the Municipality or the Purchaser if so provided in the Bond Purchase Agreement and according to the terms and provisions as set forth in the Bond Purchase Agreement, either in whole or in part on any date, at the principal amount thereof together with accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption.

(2) Interest shall cease to accrue on any of the Bonds which are duly called for prior redemption on the date set for redemption if payment thereof on the redemption date has been duly made or provided for.

(3) Notice of each redemption, if any, shall be mailed, postage prepaid, not less than 30 days prior to the redemption date, to all Registered Owners of the Bonds to be redeemed at their addresses as they appear on the registration books of the Municipality kept by the Paying Agent. If less than all of the Outstanding Bonds of a maturity are to be redeemed, the particular Bonds to be redeemed shall be selected by the Paying Agent by lot or random selection in such manner as the paying Agent shall deem fair and appropriate. The Paying Agent may provide for the selection of portions of the principal of the Bonds, and for all purposes of the Bond Resolution, all provisions relating to the redemption of the Bonds shall relate, in the case of any Bond redeemed or to be redeemed only in part, to the portion of the principal of such Bond which has been or is to be redeemed.

(4) If less than all of a Bond is to be redeemed, then in such case, upon the surrender of such Bond, there shall be issued to the Registered Owner thereof, without charge therefor, for the unredeemed balance of the principal amount of such Bond, a new Bond or Bonds of like designation, interest rate and maturity in any authorized denomination.

(5) Prior to the date fixed for redemption, if any, moneys shall be placed in trust with the Paying Agent to pay the principal amount thereof together with accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption of the Bonds called for redemption and accrued interest thereon to the redemption date, with irrevocable instructions to apply such funds to such payment on such date. Upon the happening of the above conditions, the Bonds, or portions thereof, thus called for redemption shall cease to bear interest from and after the redemption date, shall no longer be protected by the Bond Resolution and shall not be deemed to be Outstanding pursuant to the provisions of the Bond Resolution.

SECTION 3.02. PAYMENTS OF INTEREST AND PRINCIPAL.

(a) Payments of principal shall be made without the necessity of presentation and surrender of the Bonds then due for payment at the principal office of the Paying Agent to the Record Date Registered Owner in lawful money of the United States of America.

(b) Payment of each installment of interest on the Bonds shall be made to the Record Date Registered Owner thereof. Interest shall be payable in the aforesaid manner irrespective of any transfer or exchange of any such Bond subsequent to the Record Date and prior to the due date of the interest.

(c) Interest on the Bonds shall be paid and, without the necessity of presentation and surrender of the Bonds as set forth in Section 3.02 hereof, principal of the Bonds shall be paid by wire transfer or check or draft delivered to or mailed on the applicable Payment Date to the Registered Owners at the addresses appearing in the registration records of the Paying Agent. Any such address may be changed by written notice from the Registered Owner to the Paying Agent by certified mail, return receipt requested, or such other method as may be subsequently prescribed or allowed by the Paying Agent, such notice to be received by the Paying Agent not later than the fifteenth day of the calendar month preceding the applicable Payment Date to be effective as of such date.

SECTION 3.03. EXECUTION, VALIDATION, AND DELIVERY OF THE BONDS.

(a) The Bonds shall be executed by the manual or facsimile signature of the Mayor and countersigned by the manual or facsimile signature of the City Clerk, with the seal of the Municipality imprinted or affixed thereto; provided, however, all signatures and seals appearing on the Bonds, other than the signature of an authorized officer of the Paying Agent hereafter provided for, may be facsimile and shall have the same force and effect as if manually signed or impressed. In case any official of the Municipality whose signature or a facsimile of whose signature shall appear on the Bonds shall cease to be such official before the delivery or reissuance thereof, such signature or such facsimile shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as if such official had remained in office until delivery or reissuance.

(b) In case any Bond shall become mutilated, stolen, destroyed, or lost, the Municipality shall, if not then prohibited by law, cause to be authenticated and delivered a new Bond of like date, number, maturity, and tenor in exchange and substitution for and upon cancellation of such mutilated Bond, or in lieu of and in substitution for such Bond stolen, destroyed, or lost, upon the Registered Owner's paying the reasonable expenses and charges of the Municipality in connection therewith, and in case of a Bond stolen, destroyed, or lost, his filing with the Municipality or Paying Agent evidence satisfactory to them that such Bond was stolen, destroyed, or lost, and of his ownership thereof, and furnishing the Municipality or Paying Agent with such security or indemnity as may be required by law or by them to save each of them harmless from all risks, however remote.

(c) The Bonds shall be delivered to the Purchaser upon payment of the purchase price therefor in accordance with the terms and conditions of their sale and purchase, together with a complete certified transcript of the proceedings had and done in the matter of the authorization, issuance, sale, validation, execution, and delivery of the Bonds, and the receipt of any approving opinions reasonably required by the Municipality or the Purchaser.

(d) Prior to or simultaneously with the delivery by the Paying Agent of any of the Bonds, the Municipality shall file with the Paying Agent:

(1) a copy, certified by the City Clerk, of the transcript of proceedings of the Governing Body in connection with the authorization, issuance, sale, validation, execution, and delivery of the Bonds; and

(2) an authorization to the Paying Agent, signed by the Mayor or the City Clerk, to authenticate and deliver the Bonds to the Purchaser.

(e) The Paying Agent shall authenticate the Bonds and deliver them to the Purchaser upon payment of the purchase price of the Bonds to the Municipality.

(f) The Paying Agent is hereby authorized upon the written approval of the Mayor and/or the City Clerk to have printed from time to time as necessary additional bond certificates, which certificates may bear the manual or facsimile seal of the Municipality and manual or facsimile signatures of the officials of the Municipality as of the date of the authorization thereof or as of the date of execution.

(g) The Bonds herein directed to be issued may be submitted to validation pursuant to the provisions of Sections 31-11-1 *et seq.*, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, and, to that end, if requested, the City Clerk is hereby instructed to make up, certify, and transmit to the State Bond Attorney a transcript of proceedings and other documents relating to the authorization and issuance of the Bonds.

(h) When the Bonds shall have been validated and executed as herein provided, they shall be registered as an obligation of the Municipality in the office of the City Clerk in a book maintained for that purpose, and the City Clerk shall cause to be imprinted upon or accompany each of the Bonds, over his manual or facsimile signature and impressed or facsimile seal, his certificate in substantially the form set out in Section 3.08 hereof.

SECTION 3.04. INTERCHANGEABILITY OF BONDS. The Bonds, upon surrender thereof at the office of the Paying Agent, together with an assignment duly executed on the Bond by the Registered Owner or his attorney or legal representative, may be exchanged for an equal aggregate principal amount of Bonds of the same series and maturity, of any denomination or denominations authorized by the Bond Resolution, and bearing interest at the same rate.

SECTION 3.05. TRANSFER OF BONDS.

(a) Each Bond shall be transferable only on the books of the Municipality kept by the Paying Agent, upon surrender thereof at the principal office of the Paying Agent, together with a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the Paying Agent duly executed by the Registered Owner or his attorney duly authorized in writing. Upon the transfer of any such Bond, the Municipality shall issue in the name of the transferee a new Bond or Bonds of the same aggregate principal amount and maturity and rate of interest as the surrendered Bond.

(b) The Municipality and the Paying Agent may deem and treat the Person in whose name any Bond shall be registered upon the books of the Municipality as the absolute owner thereof, whether such Bond shall be overdue or not, for the purpose of receiving payment of the principal and accrued interest on such Bond and for all other purposes. All such payments so made to any such Registered Owner or upon his order shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge

the liability of the Municipality upon such Bond to the extent of the sum or sums so paid. Neither the Municipality nor the Paying Agent shall be affected by any notice to the contrary.

(c) In all cases in which the privilege of transferring Bonds is exercised, the Paying Agent shall authenticate and deliver Bonds in accordance with the provisions of the Bond Resolution.

SECTION 3.06. REGULATIONS WITH RESPECT TO EXCHANGES AND TRANSFERS.

(a) In all cases in which the privilege of exchanging or transferring Bonds is exercised, the Municipality shall execute and the Paying Agent, as Bond Registrar, shall authenticate and deliver Bonds in accordance with provisions of the Bond Resolution without expense to the Bondholders.

(b) Neither the Municipality nor the Paying Agent shall be obligated to exchange or transfer any Bond during the 15 days next preceding (i) a Payment Date or (ii) in the case of any proposed redemption of Bonds, the date of the mailing of notice of such redemption.

SECTION 3.07. PROVISIONS CONCERNING THE PAYING AGENT.

(a) The initial Paying Agent for the Bonds, which shall serve as paying agent, registrar and transfer agent, shall be such Person as is designated in the Bond Purchase Agreement. The Paying Agent shall serve as paying agent, registrar, and transfer agent for the Bonds.

(b) So long as any of the Bonds shall remain Outstanding, the Municipality shall maintain with the Paying Agent records for the registration and transfer of the Bonds. The Paying Agent is hereby appointed registrar for the Bonds, in which capacity the Paying Agent shall register in such records and permit them to be transferred thereon, pursuant to such reasonable regulations as may be prescribed, any Bond entitled to registration or transfer.

(c) The Municipality shall pay or reimburse the Paying Agent (other than the City Clerk, if so designated) for reasonable fees for the performance of the services normally rendered and the incurring of normal expenses reasonably and necessarily paid as are customarily paid to paying agents, transfer agents and bond registrars, subject to agreement between the Municipality and the Paying Agent. Fees and reimbursements for extraordinary services and expenses, so long as not occasioned by the negligence, misconduct or willful default of the Paying Agent, shall be made by the Municipality on a case-by-case basis, subject, where not prevented by emergency or other exigent circumstances, to the prior written approval of the Governing Body.

(d) (1) A Paying Agent may at any time resign and be discharged of its duties and obligations as Paying Agent by giving at least 60 days' written notice to the Municipality, and may be removed as Paying Agent at any time by resolution of the Governing Body delivered to the Paying Agent. The resolution shall specify the date on which such removal shall take effect and the name and address of the successor Paying Agent and shall be transmitted to the Paying Agent being removed within a reasonable time prior to the effective date thereof. Provided, however, that no resignation or removal of a Paying Agent shall become effective until a successor Paying Agent has been appointed pursuant to the Bond Resolution.

(2) Upon receiving notice of the resignation of a Paying Agent, the Municipality shall promptly appoint a successor Paying Agent by resolution of the Governing Body. Any appointment of a successor Paying Agent shall become effective on the effective date of the resignation or removal of the predecessor Paying Agent upon acceptance of appointment by the successor Paying Agent. If no successor Paying Agent shall have been so appointed and have accepted appointment within 30 days after the notice of resignation, the resigning Paying Agent may petition any court of competent jurisdiction for the appointment of a successor Paying Agent, which court may thereupon, after such notice as it may deem appropriate, appoint a successor Paying Agent.

(3) In the event of a change of Paying Agents, the predecessor Paying Agent shall cease to be custodian of any funds held pursuant to the Bond Resolution in connection with its role as such Paying Agent, and the successor Paying Agent shall become such custodian; provided, however, that before any such delivery is required to be made, all fees, advances and expenses of the retiring or removed Paying Agent shall be fully paid. Every predecessor Paying Agent shall deliver to its successor Paying Agent all records of account, registration records, lists of Registered Owners and all other records, documents and instruments relating to its duties as such Paying Agent.

(4) Any successor Paying Agent other than the City Clerk appointed pursuant to the provisions hereof shall be a bank, trust company or national banking association having Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation insurance of its accounts, duly authorized to exercise corporate trust powers and subject to examination by and in good standing with the federal and/or state regulatory authorities under the jurisdiction of which it falls.

(5) Every successor Paying Agent appointed hereunder shall execute, acknowledge and deliver to its predecessor Paying Agent and to the Municipality an instrument in writing accepting such appointment hereunder, and thereupon such successor Paying Agent, without any further act, shall become fully vested with all the rights, immunities, and powers, and subject to all the duties and obligations, of its predecessor.

(6) Should any transfer, assignment, or instrument in writing be required by any successor Paying Agent from the Municipality to more fully and certainly vest in such successor Paying Agent the estates, rights, powers, and duties hereby vested or intended to be vested in the predecessor Paying Agent, any such transfer, assignment, and written instruments shall, on request, be executed, acknowledged, and delivered by the Municipality.

(7) The Municipality will provide any successor Paying Agent with certified copies of all resolutions, orders, and other proceedings adopted by the Governing Body relating to the Bonds.

(8) All duties and obligations imposed hereby on a Paying Agent or successor Paying Agent shall terminate upon the accomplishment of all duties, obligations, and responsibilities imposed by law or required to be performed by the Bond Resolution.

(e) Successor as Paying Agent. Any corporation or association into which a Paying Agent may be converted or merged, or with which it may be consolidated or to which it may sell

or transfer its assets as a whole or substantially as a whole, or any corporation or association resulting from any such conversion, sale, merger, consolidation, or transfer to which it is a party, shall be and become successor Paying Agent hereunder and vested with all the powers, discretions, immunities, privileges, and all other matters as was its predecessor, without the execution or filing of any instrument or any further act, deed, or conveyance on the part of either the Municipality or the successor Paying Agent, anything herein to the contrary notwithstanding, provided only that such successor Paying Agent shall be satisfactory to the Municipality and eligible pursuant to the provisions of this Section.

SECTION 3.08. FORM OF THE BONDS. The Bonds shall be in substantially the following form, with such omissions, insertions, and variations as may be approved by the Mayor and City Clerk, execution thereof to be conclusive evidence of such approval:

The Registered Owner hereof may change such address by written notice to the Paying Agent by certified mail, return receipt requested, or such other method as may be subsequently prescribed or allowed by the Paying Agent, such notice to be received by the Paying Agent not later than the fifteenth day of the calendar month preceding the applicable principal or interest payment date.

This Bond is issued pursuant to the authority of the Constitution and statutes of the State, including Sections 21-45-1 *et seq.*, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "Act"), and by the further authority of proceedings duly had by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Municipality (the "Governing Body"), including a resolution authorizing and directing the issuance of the Bonds adopted _____, 20__ (the "Bond Resolution"). Capitalized terms used herein and not otherwise defined shall have the meanings given in the Bond Resolution.

This Bond is one of a series of bonds of like date of original issue, tenor, and effect, except as to denomination, number, rate of interest, and date of maturity, issued in the aggregate authorized principal amount of \$_____ to provide funds to pay or reimburse all or a portion of the Costs of the Infrastructure Improvements (as defined in the Bond Resolution).

The Bonds are limited obligations of the Municipality payable solely from and secured by a pledge of a sufficient amount of the TIF Revenues defined herein below.

"County Ad Valorem TIF Revenues" shall mean 100% of the County's additional ad valorem tax revenues received by the County resulting from ad valorem taxes on the Captured Assessed Value of real property, including personal property located thereon, within the boundaries of the TIF District, as defined and calculated in the manner set forth in the Act; provided, however, that the amount of the Bonds to be issued will be sized based upon 50% of the County Ad Valorem TIF Revenues.

"Municipality Ad Valorem TIF Revenues" shall mean 100% of the Municipality's additional ad valorem tax revenues received by the Municipality resulting from ad valorem taxes on the Captured Assessed Value of real property, including personal property located thereon, within the boundaries of the TIF District, as defined and calculated in the manner set forth in the Act; the amount of the Bonds to be issued will be sized based upon 50% of the Municipality Ad Valorem TIF Revenues.

"Sales Tax Rebate TIF Revenues" shall mean 100% of the City's additional municipal sales tax diversion received by the Municipality from sales taxes collected within the boundaries of the TIF District, based upon the "original sales value," as defined and calculated in the manner set forth in the Act; provided, however, that the amount of the Bonds to be issued will be sized based upon 50% of the Sales Tax Rebate TIF Revenues.

“TIF Revenues” shall mean, together, the County Ad Valorem TIF Revenues, the Municipality Ad Valorem TIF Revenues, and the Sales Tax Rebate TIF Revenues.

This Bond does not constitute an indebtedness of the Municipality within the meaning of any constitutional provision or statutory limitation of the State, and shall never constitute nor give rise to a pecuniary liability of the Municipality or a charge against its general credit or taxing power other than as provided in the Bond Resolution.

The Bonds are registered as to both principal and interest and are to be issued or reissued in the denomination of \$_____ each, or any integral multiple of \$_____ in excess thereof up to the amount of a single maturity.

Bonds maturing after _____ 1, 20__, are subject to redemption prior to their respective maturities at the election of the Municipality on and after _____ 1, 20__, either in whole or in part on any date, with the maturities and principal amounts thereof to be determined by the Municipality, at a price equal to 100% of the principal amount thereof together with accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption.

At least thirty days before the redemption date of any Bonds, the City Clerk shall cause a notice of any such redemption to be filed with the Paying Agent and to be mailed, postage prepaid, to all Registered Owners of the Bonds to be redeemed at their addresses as they appear on the registration books on the date of such mailing, but failure so to file or mail any such notice shall not affect the validity of the proceedings for such redemption. Each such notice shall set forth the date fixed for redemption, the principal and accrued interest to be paid, the place or places at which payment shall be made and, if less than all of the Bonds of any one maturity shall be called for redemption, the distinctive numbers and letters, if any, of such Bonds to be redeemed.

Less than all of a Bond may be so redeemed, and in such case, upon the surrender of such Bond, there shall be issued to the Registered Owner thereof, without charge therefor, for the unredeemed balance of the principal amount of such Bond, a new Bond or Bonds of like series, designation, interest rate and maturity in any authorized denomination.

This Bond may be transferred or exchanged by the Registered Owner hereof in person or by his attorney duly authorized in writing at the principal office of the Paying Agent, but only in the manner provided by and subject to the limitations in the Bond Resolution, and upon surrender and cancellation of this Bond. Upon such transfer or exchange, a new Bond or Bonds of like aggregate principal amount in authorized denominations of the same maturity will be issued.

The Municipality and the Paying Agent may deem and treat the Registered Owner hereof as the absolute owner for the purpose of receiving payment of or on account of principal hereof and interest due hereon and for all other purposes and neither the Municipality nor the Paying Agent shall be affected by any notice to the contrary.

If the date for making any payment or the last date for performance of any act or the exercising of any right, as provided in the Bond Resolution, shall not be a Business Day, such payment may be made or act performed or right exercised on the next succeeding day which is a Business Day, with the same force and effect as if done on the nominal date provided in the Bond Resolution, and no interest shall accrue for the period after such nominal date.

The Municipality in the Bond Resolution has covenanted and agreed that it will perform all duties required by law and by the Bond Resolution and that it will apply the proceeds of the Bonds to the purposes above set forth.

This Bond shall not be valid or become obligatory for any purpose or be entitled to any benefit or security pursuant to the Bond Resolution until the "Certificate of Registration and Authentication" hereon shall have been signed by the Paying Agent.

IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED, RECITED, AND REPRESENTED that all conditions, acts, and things required by law to exist, to have happened, and to have been performed precedent to and in the issuance of the Bonds, in order to make the same legal and binding limited obligations of the Municipality, according to the terms thereof, do exist, have happened, and have been performed in regular and due time, form, and manner as required by law.

**ARTICLE IV.
SECURITY FOR THE BONDS**

SECTION 4.01. BONDS SECURED BY PLEDGE OF TIF REVENUES. The payment of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds shall be secured equally and ratably by a pledge of a sufficient amount of the TIF Revenues required to pay such amounts when due. A sufficient amount of the TIF Revenues is hereby irrevocably pledged to pay the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds and to make the payments into the Bond Fund and all other payments provided for in the Bond Resolution, as the same become due and payable.

SECTION 4.02. PLEDGE OF MONEYS IN CERTAIN FUNDS AND ACCOUNTS. The amounts held in the Bond Fund are hereby pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds. The moneys in the Improvement Fund, to the extent not used for the payment or reimbursement of the Costs of the Infrastructure Improvements, are pledged to the use described in Section 6.01 hereof.

SECTION 4.03. RIGHTS OF REGISTERED OWNERS. The pledges made herein and the covenants and agreements herein set forth to be performed on behalf of the Municipality shall be for the equal benefit, protection, and security of the Registered Owners of any and all Bonds, all of which, regardless of the time or times of their authentication and delivery or maturity, shall be of equal rank without preference, priority, or distinction. Should there be a failure in any year to comply with the requirements of this Article, such failure shall not impair the right of the Registered Owners of any of the Bonds in any subsequent year.

SECTION 4.04. BONDS ARE LIMITED OBLIGATIONS. The Bonds shall not be or constitute an indebtedness of the Municipality within the meaning of any constitutional provision or statutory limitation of the State but shall be payable solely from a sufficient amount of the TIF Revenues, as provided in the Bond Resolution and in the Interlocal Agreement. No Bondholder shall ever have the right to compel the exercise of ad valorem taxing power of the Municipality or taxation in any form of any property therein to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds or the making of any other payments provided for in the Bond Resolution other than to the extent provided herein.

**ARTICLE V.
TIF REVENUES AND APPLICATION THEREOF**

SECTION 5.01. TIF REVENUES. While the Bonds are Outstanding, the TIF Revenues sufficient to provide for the deposits hereinafter required by this Article shall be deposited into the Bond Fund in accordance with this Article and in accordance with the provisions of the Interlocal Agreement; provided, however, that when and so long as no further deposits are required to be made into the Bond Fund, then no further deposits shall be made. The Bond Fund shall constitute a special trust fund for the purposes provided in the Bond Resolution and shall be kept separate and distinct from all other funds of the Municipality and used only in the manner provided for in the Bond Resolution.

SECTION 5.02. BOND FUND; DISCONTINUANCE OF PAYMENTS.

(a) Deposit of Ad Valorem TIF Revenues. County Ad Valorem TIF Revenues received by the Municipality from the County shall be received and deposited into the Bond Fund and those moneys provided for in the Bond Resolution and in the Interlocal Agreement shall be set aside or allocated to and deposited in the Bond Fund to provide for the Bond Payments on each Payment Date. Municipality Ad Valorem TIF Revenues are to be set aside and allocated to the Bond Fund pursuant to the Interlocal Agreement and to the Bond Resolution and shall be deposited in the Bond Fund.

(b) Deposit of Sales Tax Rebate TIF Revenues. Sales Tax Rebate TIF Revenues are to be set aside and allocated to the Bond Fund pursuant to the Interlocal Agreement and to the Bond Resolution and shall be deposited in the Bond Fund.

(c) Pledge of TIF Revenues. A sufficient portion of all TIF Revenues are pledged to the payment of the Bonds and, to the extent needed to provide for the Bond Payments, shall be deposited in the Bond Fund as provided hereinafter.

(d) Bond Fund (HPM Development Project). There shall be deposited into the Bond Fund from available TIF Revenues such amount that, together with moneys on deposit therein, will provide a sum for the payment of principal equal to the amount needed to pay the next installment of principal on the Bonds (including for this purpose any advancement of maturity pursuant to a mandatory sinking fund payment), and a sum for the payment of interest equal to the amount of interest to come due through to the next installment of principal.

(e) Additional Deposits to Bond Fund. In addition to the deposits into the Bond Fund described above in this Section, there shall also be deposited into the Bond Fund:

(1) the accrued interest, if any, received upon delivery of the Bonds as provided in Section 2.02(a) hereof;

(2) any income received from investment of moneys on deposit in the Bond Fund;

(3) any balance remaining in the Improvement Fund following completion of the Infrastructure Improvements for the Project or final reimbursement of the Costs of the Infrastructure Improvements which is transferred to the Bond Fund pursuant to Section 6.01 hereof; and

(4) any other funds available to the Municipality which may lawfully be used for payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds and which the Governing Body, in its discretion, directs to be deposited into the Bond Fund.

(f) No Further Payments. No further payments into the Bond Fund shall be required when the aggregate amount of moneys in the Bond Fund at least equal to the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds then Outstanding, plus the amount of interest then due or to become due on the Bonds then Outstanding, or when the Bonds shall be deemed fully paid within the meaning of Section 9.02 hereof.

SECTION 5.03. INVESTMENT OF MONEYS ON DEPOSIT IN THE FUNDS. The moneys at any time on deposit in any fund provided for by the Bond Resolution, including the Improvement Fund herein established, not immediately required for disbursement for the purposes for which such Funds are established, shall be invested in such instruments or investments as are permissible under applicable law or regulations of the State. The income received on the investment of any such moneys shall be credited to the fund for which such investments are made except as specifically provided in this Article. Provided, however the income received on any investments in the Improvement Fund shall be credited to such Improvement Fund until the Infrastructure Improvements for the Project are complete or final reimbursement of the Costs of the Infrastructure Improvements. Provided, however, that the investment income, if any, from assets held under the Reserve Account, if any, shall be retained in the Reserve Account to the extent of any deficiency in the Debt Service Reserve Requirement.

**ARTICLE VI.
IMPROVEMENT FUND**

SECTION 6.01. IMPROVEMENT FUND (HPM DEVELOPMENT PROJECT). Pursuant to Article II hereof, the proceeds of the Bonds remaining after the deposit to the Bond Fund, if any, shall be irrevocably deposited by the Municipality into the Improvement Fund. Moneys in the Improvement Fund shall be applied solely first to pay the costs of the authorization, issuance, sale, validation, execution, and delivery of the Bonds and then to pay or reimburse all or a portion of the Costs of the Infrastructure Improvements, including without limitation reimbursements to the Developer for the moneys advanced for the Costs of the Infrastructure Improvement. Any balance remaining in the Improvement Fund after completion of the Infrastructure Improvements for the Project or final reimbursement of the Costs of the Infrastructure Improvements shall be transferred to the Bond Fund and applied to the payment of the interest, and then to the payment of principal, on the Bonds on any Payment Date following such transfer.

**ARTICLE VII.
COVENANTS OF THE MUNICIPALITY**

SECTION 7.01. ISSUANCE OF OTHER OBLIGATIONS PAYABLE OUT OF TIF REVENUES. Except upon the conditions and in the manner provided in Article IX hereof, the Municipality will not issue any other obligations payable from the TIF Revenues, nor voluntarily create or cause to be created any debt, lien, pledge, assignment, encumbrance, or any other charge having priority to or being on a parity with the lien of the Bonds and the interest thereon, upon any of the TIF Revenues.

Other than with regard to Additional Bonds, all obligations subsequently issued by the Municipality secured by TIF Revenues shall contain an express statement that such obligations are junior, inferior, and subordinate in all respects to the Bonds as to lien on and source of and security for payment from the TIF Revenues, and in all other respects.

SECTION 7.02. NON-ARBITRAGE COVENANTS REGARDING BONDS.

(a) The Municipality covenants and certifies to and for the benefit of the Registered Owners of the Bonds that it will neither take any action nor omit to take any action nor make any

investment or use of the proceeds from the issue and sale of the Bonds, including amounts treated as proceeds, if any, which will cause the Bonds to be classified as “arbitrage bonds” within the meaning of Section 148 of the Code, and any regulations thereunder as such may be applicable to the Bonds, at the time of such action, investment or use.

(b) (1) The Governing Body has made findings indicating that no rebate relating to the Bonds will be required to be made pursuant to the Code. However, in the event it is subsequently determined for any reason that rebates should be made on the Bonds, then the Municipality hereby covenants that it shall take all actions necessary in order to comply with the requirements of paragraphs (2) and (3) of Subsection 148(f) in order that none of the Bonds shall be treated as an “arbitrage bond” pursuant to paragraph (1) of Subsection 148(f), including payment of all amounts, if any, required to be paid to the United States of America in accordance with and within the time limits prescribed in Subsection 148(f) and the Subsection 148(f) Regulations, the making of any and all calculations, computations and filings required pursuant to Subsection 148(f) and the Subsection 148(f) Regulations, and the maintenance of all such records as may be required pursuant to Subsection 148(f) and the Subsection 148(f) Regulations.

(2) In order to effectuate the foregoing covenant, the Municipality hereby further covenants and certifies that: (A) prior to delivery of the Bonds, it shall have received written instructions from Nationally Recognized Bond Counsel with respect to actions which will, pursuant to Subsection 148(f) and such regulations as may have been promulgated prior to delivery of the Bonds, assure compliance with such covenants; and (B) the Municipality shall comply with such instructions until the Municipality shall have received from Nationally Recognized Bond Counsel written advice that continued compliance with such instructions is not necessary in order to avoid adversely affecting the tax-exempt status of the Bonds or alternative written instructions with respect to certain actions which will assure compliance with the covenants set forth above, in which event the Municipality shall thereafter comply with all such alternative instructions.

(c) The Municipality shall not intentionally use any portion of the proceeds (within the meaning of Subsection 148(a) of the Code and any regulations promulgated pursuant thereto) of the Bonds to acquire higher yielding investments (as defined in Subsection 148(a) of the Code and all regulations promulgated pursuant thereto) or to replace funds which were used directly or indirectly to acquire higher yielding investments, except to the extent specifically permitted pursuant to Section 148 of the Code and any regulations promulgated thereunder.

(d) The Municipality shall not purchase or acquire any investment property with proceeds (within the meaning of Section 148 of the Code) of the Bonds in a manner or for a price which would cause any of the Bonds to be or become an “arbitrage bond” within the meaning of Section 148 of the Code and all regulations promulgated thereunder, including, without limitation, to the extent prescribed by applicable regulations, investments (regardless of yield) which do not comply with the provisions of any regulations intended to assure that obligations are acquired at their “fair market value.”

(e) The Municipality will maintain all records required by Section 148(f) of the Code and the applicable regulations thereunder and shall furnish such data or information regarding compliance with Section 148(f) of the Code as the Paying Agent or any Bondholder shall reasonably request in writing.

SECTION 7.03. COVENANTS REGARDING PRIVATE USE PERTAINING TO BONDS; COVENANTS AND REPRESENTATIONS REGARDING TAX-EXEMPT STATUS.

(a) No party (other than a governmental unit) which shall use all or any part of the property with respect to which all or any part of the proceeds of the Bonds are expended shall make any payments to the Municipality (other than normal and customary taxes due and payable to the Municipality, or other than normal and customary utility user fees due and payable from use as members of the general public) which are in any way related to any property with respect to which the proceeds of the Bonds are expended or in any other way related to the Bonds, if the aggregate of all such payments from all such private parties shall in any year equal or exceed 10% of principal of or interest on the Bonds payable during such year, unless the Municipality shall have received an opinion of Nationally Recognized Bond Counsel to the effect that receipt of such payments will not adversely affect the exclusion of interest on the Bonds from gross income for federal income tax purposes.

(b) The Bonds are secured by and payable from the TIF Revenues. Such taxes are generally applicable taxes which are enforced contributions exacted pursuant to legislative authority in the exercise of the taxing power that are imposed and collected for the purpose of raising revenue to be used for governmental purposes. Such taxes also have a uniform tax rate that is applied to all Persons of the same classification in the appropriate jurisdiction and a generally applicable manner of determination and collection. No taxpayer has entered into an impermissible agreement with the Municipality relating to the payment of such taxes (e.g., an agreement to be personally liable on a tax that does not generally impose personal liability, to provide additional credit support such as a third party guarantee, or to pay unanticipated shortfalls; an agreement regarding the minimum market value of property subject to property tax; and an agreement not to challenge or seek deferral of the tax).

(c) None of the proceeds of the Bonds will be used to make or finance loans for Persons other than governmental units.

(d) The Municipality covenants and certifies that there are no other obligations heretofore issued or to be issued by or on behalf of any state, territory or possession of the United States of America, or political subdivision of any of the foregoing, or of the District of Columbia, by or for the benefit of the Municipality, which (i) were or are to be sold at substantially the same time as the Bonds, (ii) were or are to be sold pursuant to the same plan of financing as the financing plan for the Bonds, and (iii) are payable directly or indirectly by the Municipality or from the source from which the Bonds are payable. The Municipality further covenants and certifies that there are no additional facts or circumstances which may further evidence that the Bonds are part of any other issue of obligations.

(e) The Municipality covenants and certifies that no payment of principal of or interest on the Bonds is or will be guaranteed (in whole or in part, directly or indirectly) by the United States of America, or any agency or instrumentality thereof or any entity with statutory authority to borrow from the United States of America. The Municipality represents, warrants and covenants that none of the proceeds of the Bonds will be: (1) used to make loans, the payment of principal of or interest on which is or will be guaranteed (in whole or in part, directly or indirectly) by the United States of America or any agency or instrumentality thereof or any entity with statutory

authority to borrow from the United States of America; or (2) invested (directly or indirectly) in any deposit or account which is insured pursuant to federal law by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, the Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corporation, the National Credit Union Administration, or any similar federally chartered corporation other than: (A) the investment of the proceeds of the Bonds for an initial temporary period (within the meaning of subparagraph 3(B) of Subsection 149(b) of the Code) until such proceeds are needed for the purpose for which the Bonds are being issued; (B) investments of a bona fide debt service fund (within the meaning of Subparagraph 3(B) of Subsection 149(b) of the Code); (C) investments of a reserve which meets the requirements of Subsection 148(d) of the Code; (D) investments in bonds issued by the Department of the Treasury of the United States of America; or (E) other investments permitted pursuant to regulations promulgated by the Internal Revenue Service pursuant to Subsection 149(b) of the Code.

(f) The Municipality covenants and certifies that, notwithstanding any provision of the Bond Resolution or the rights of the Municipality hereunder, the Municipality will not take or permit to be taken on its behalf any action which would impair the exclusion of interest on the Bonds from gross income for purposes of federal income taxation, and it will take such actions as may be necessary to continue such exclusion, including, without limitation, the preparation and filing of any statements required to be filed by it in order to maintain such exclusion.

(g) The Mayor and/or City Clerk are hereby authorized to execute one or more certificates in connection with the sale and delivery of the Bonds, setting forth the reasonable expectations of the Municipality with respect to the investment and use of proceeds of the Bonds, and setting forth certain covenants, stipulations, and certifications with respect to the investment, use and expenditures of the proceeds of the Bonds, the use of property financed with proceeds of the Bonds, the sources of payment of the Bonds, and other similar matters. The Municipality hereby covenants to comply with all such covenants, stipulations and certifications. In addition, such officials are authorized to make such elections on behalf of the Municipality as are necessary or appropriate pursuant to the Code or Subsection 148(f) Regulations.

(h) In the event the Municipality receives an opinion of Nationally Recognized Bond Counsel to the effect that any of the computations, deposits or payments referenced in Section 7.02 and Section 7.03 hereof are not required to be made in order to avoid adversely affecting the tax-exempt status of interest on the Bonds, the Municipality need not make such computations, deposits or payments; or, to the effect that compliance with any of the covenants set forth in Section 7.02 and Section 7.03 hereof is not necessary in order to avoid adversely affecting the tax-exempt status of interest on the Bonds, the Municipality need not comply with such covenants except to the extent provided in such opinion.

(i) The Municipality reasonably expects that not less than 85% of the spendable proceeds of the Bonds will be used to carry out the governmental purposes of the Bonds within a three-year period beginning on the date of issuance of the Bonds, and no more than 50% of the proceeds of the Bonds will be invested in non-purpose investments (as defined in Section 148(f)(6)(A) of the Code) having a substantially guaranteed yield for four years or more.

**ARTICLE VIII.
DEFAULT**

SECTION 8.01. EVENT OF DEFAULT. An “Event of Default” as used in the Bond Resolution shall mean either of the following: (1) failure to pay the principal of, premium, if any, or interest on any of the Bonds when such payments shall become due; (2) failure to comply with any other of the covenants of the Municipality set out in the Bond Resolution and the continuation thereof for 30 days after written notice specifying such failure shall have been given to the Municipality by any Bondholder; or (3) filing by the Municipality of a petition pursuant to federal bankruptcy laws or a petition seeking composition of indebtedness pursuant to any other applicable federal or state laws.

The Bondholders of not less than 25% of the aggregate principal amount of the Outstanding Bonds may, upon an Event of Default, by suit, action, mandamus, or other proceedings at law or in equity enforce and compel performance by the appropriate official or officials of the Municipality of any or all of the acts or duties to be performed by the Municipality pursuant to the provisions of the Act and the Bond Resolution to the extent allowed by law. The Bondholders of not less than 51% in aggregate principal amount of the Bonds then Outstanding may appoint a trustee for the Bondholders of all Outstanding Bonds with authority to represent such Bondholders in any legal proceedings for the enforcement and protection of the rights of such Bondholders pursuant to the Bond Resolution.

Nothing contained in the Bond Resolution shall, however, affect or impair the right of any Bondholder to enforce the payment of the principal of and interest on any Bond at and after the maturity thereof, or the obligation of the Municipality to pay the principal of and interest on each of the Bonds issued hereunder to the respective Bondholders thereof at the time and place and in the manner expressed in the Bonds.

**ARTICLE IX.
ADDITIONAL BONDS; DEFEASANCE**

SECTION 9.01. ADDITIONAL BONDS. (a) No Additional Bonds shall be issued unless all of the following conditions are complied with:

(1) The Municipality must be current in all deposits into the Bond Fund, including the Reserve Account, and all payments theretofore required to have been deposited or made by it pursuant to the provisions of the Bond Resolution.

(2) (A) The consent of the Bondholders of 100% of the then Outstanding Bonds to the issuance of such Additional Bonds shall have been obtained, or (B) the amount of the TIF Revenues during any 12 consecutive months of the 18 months immediately preceding the delivery of the Additional Bonds will be at least equal to 120% of the Maximum Annual Debt Service Requirement, calculated by including the debt service on the Bonds and the proposed Additional Bonds.

(3) The Additional Bonds shall be issued for a purpose or purposes authorized by the Act and the TIF Plan.

(b) Such Additional Bonds:

(1) shall be dated, shall bear interest at a rate or rates not in excess of the rate then permitted by applicable law, and shall be payable as to principal and interest and shall mature on any Payment Date as shall be specified in the Additional Bonds Resolution;

(2) shall have such particular designations added to their title as the Municipality may determine, and may be in such denominations as shall be specified in the Additional Bonds Resolution; and

(3) may contain provisions for the redemption thereof at such prices, including principal and accrued interest, at such time or times, upon such notice, in such manner, and upon such other terms and conditions as shall be specified in the Additional Bonds Resolution.

(c) All of such Additional Bonds, regardless of the time or times of their issuance, shall rank equally with all other Bonds with respect to their lien on the TIF Revenues and their source of and security for payment therefrom without preference of any Bonds over any other.

(d) The Municipality shall not issue any obligations whatsoever payable from the TIF Revenues which rank equally as to lien and source and security for their payment from such TIF Revenues with the Bonds, except in the manner and pursuant to the conditions provided in this Section. Junior and subordinate bonds may be issued from time to time within the discretion of the Municipality.

SECTION 9.02. DEFEASANCE OF BONDS. If the Municipality shall pay or cause to be paid, or there shall otherwise be paid, to the Bondholders of all Bonds the principal of, premium, if any, and interest due or to become due thereon, at the times and in the manner stipulated therein and in the Bond Resolution, then the pledge of any TIF Revenues, and other moneys and securities pledged pursuant to the Bond Resolution and all covenants, agreements, and other obligations of the Municipality to the Bondholders, shall thereupon cease, terminate, become void, and be discharged and satisfied.

Bonds or interest installments for the payment or redemption of which moneys shall have been set aside and held in trust by the Paying Agent (through deposit by the Municipality of funds for such payment or redemption or otherwise) shall be deemed to have been paid within the meaning and with the effect expressed in the first paragraph of this Section. All Outstanding Bonds of a series shall, prior to the maturity or redemption date thereof, be deemed to have been paid within the meaning and with the effect expressed in the first paragraph of this Section if (a) in case any of the Bonds are to be redeemed on a date prior to their maturity, the Municipality shall have adopted a resolution or order directing the call and redemption of such Bonds on said date, (b) there shall have been deposited with the Paying Agent either moneys in an amount which shall be sufficient, or moneys which shall be invested in direct obligations of the United States of America, or obligations the principal of and interest on which is guaranteed by the United States of America, and which obligations are not redeemable prior to their maturity by the issuer or any other Person other than the holder thereof, the principal of and the interest on which when due will provide money which, together with the moneys, if any, deposited with the Paying Agent at the same time, shall be sufficient, without reinvestment, to pay when due the principal and accrued interest, if

applicable, and interest due and to become due on the Bonds on and prior to the redemption date or maturity date thereof, as the case may be, and (c) in the event the Bonds are not by their terms subject to redemption within the next succeeding 60 days, the Municipality shall have adopted a resolution or order directing the call and redemption of such Bonds on such date and notice to the Bondholders of such Bonds has been given that the deposit required by (b) above has been made with the Paying Agent and that the Bonds are deemed to have been paid in accordance with this Section and stating such maturity or redemption date upon which moneys are to be available for the payment of the principal and accrued interest, if applicable, on the Bonds. Neither investments nor moneys deposited with the Paying Agent pursuant to this Section nor principal or interest payments on any such investments shall be withdrawn or used for any purpose other than, and shall be held in trust for, the payment of the principal or interest payments on the Bonds; provided, that if the interest on such investments deposited with the Paying Agent, if not then needed for such purpose, may to the extent practicable and legally permissible, be reinvested in investments of the type allowed in Section 5.03 of the Bond Resolution maturing at times and in amounts sufficient to pay when due the principal and accrued interest, if applicable, and interest due or to become due on the Bonds to the redemption date or maturity date thereof, as the case may be, and interest earned from such reinvestments may be paid over to the Municipality, as received by the Paying Agent, free and clear of any trust, lien or pledge.

ARTICLE X. MISCELLANEOUS

SECTION 10.01. RESOLUTION CONSTITUTES CONTRACT. In consideration of the acceptance of the Bonds by those who shall hold the same from time to time, the Bond Resolution shall be deemed to be and shall constitute a contract between the Municipality and such Bondholders, and the covenants and agreements herein set forth to be performed by the Municipality shall be for the equal benefit, protection, and security of the Bondholders of any and all of the Bonds, all of which shall be of equal rank and without preference, priority, or distinction of any of the Bonds over any other thereof except as expressly provided therein and herein.

SECTION 10.02. MODIFICATION OR AMENDMENT. (a) No material modification or amendment of the Bond Resolution or of any resolution amendatory hereof or supplemental hereto, may be made without the consent in writing of the Bondholders of two-thirds or more in principal amount of the Bonds then Outstanding; provided, however, that no modification or amendment shall permit a change in the maturity of the Bonds or a reduction in the rate of interest thereon, or affect the unconditional promise of the Municipality to pay the interest and principal on the Bonds, as the same mature and become due, from the TIF Revenues, or reduce such percentage of Bondholders of the Bonds required above for such modification or amendment without the consent of the Bondholders of all of the Bonds.

(b) The foregoing shall not be construed to prohibit supplemental amendments of the Bond Resolution without the consent of Bondholders for the following purposes:

(1) to add to the covenants and agreements of the Municipality herein contained other covenants and agreements thereafter to be observed and performed by the Municipality, provided that such other covenants and agreements shall not either expressly or implicitly limit or restrict any of the obligations of the Municipality contained in the Bond Resolution;

(2) to cure any ambiguity or to cure, correct or supplement any defect or inconsistent provision contained in the Bond Resolution or in any supplemental resolution or to make any provisions with respect to matters arising pursuant to the Bond Resolution or any supplemental resolution for any other purpose if such provisions are necessary or desirable and are not inconsistent with the provisions of the Bond Resolution or any supplemental resolution and do not adversely affect the interests of the Bondholders of the Bonds; or

(3) to subject to the lien of the Bonds and the pledge herein contained additional revenues or receipts.

(c) Notwithstanding any provision herein to the contrary, the Bond Resolution may be amended by resolution of the Municipality prior to the delivery of the Bonds with the consent of the Purchaser.

SECTION 10.03. SEVERABILITY OF INVALID PROVISIONS. If any one or more of the covenants, agreements, or provisions of the Bond Resolution should be held contrary to any express provision of law or contrary to the policy of express law, though not expressly prohibited, or against public policy, or shall for any reason whatsoever be held invalid, then such covenants, agreements, or provisions shall be null and void and shall be deemed separate from the remaining covenants, agreements, or provisions, and shall in no way affect the validity of any of the other provisions of the Bond Resolution or of the Bonds or interest thereon.

SECTION 10.04. PAYMENTS DUE ON DAYS OTHER THAN BUSINESS DAYS. In any case where the date of maturity of interest on or principal of the Bonds or the date fixed for redemption of any Bonds, or the date on which any moneys are required to be deposited into any fund or account pursuant hereto, shall be in the city in which the principal office of the Paying Agent is located a day other than a Business Day, then paying of interest or principal, and premium, if any, or deposit into the Funds pursuant hereto, need not be made on such date but shall be made on the next succeeding Business Day with the same force and effect as if made on the date of maturity or the date fixed for redemption, or the date fixed for deposit into a Fund, and no interest shall accrue for the period after such date.

SECTION 10.05. ALLOCATION OF MONEYS. Whenever any amounts are required by the Bond Resolution to be on deposit in a specified fund or account pursuant hereto, it shall be sufficient if there is a clear allocation of such amounts in the records of the Municipality, notwithstanding that such amounts are combined with other moneys of the Municipality in a combined deposit or investment.

SECTION 10.06. BOND RESOLUTION FOR BENEFIT OF MUNICIPALITY, PAYING AGENT, AND REGISTERED OWNERS. Nothing in the Bond Resolution expressed or implied is intended or shall be construed to confer upon, or to give to, any Person or entity, other than the Municipality, the Paying Agent, and the Registered Owners of the Bonds, any right, remedy, or claim pursuant to or by reason of the Bond Resolution or any covenant, condition, or stipulation hereof, and all covenants, stipulations, promises, and agreements in the Bond Resolution contained shall be for the sole and exclusive benefit of the Municipality, the Paying Agent, and the Registered Owners of the Bonds.

SECTION 10.07. POST ISSUANCE COMPLIANCE PROCEDURES. The Municipality hereby approves and adopts the Post Issuance Compliance Procedures in substantially the form set out in **Exhibit C** hereto.

SECTION 10.08. CERTIFICATES OF TAX ASSESSOR OF THE COUNTY AND MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to request and deliver certificates each year from the Tax Assessor of the County and the Mississippi Department of Revenue while the TIF Plan is in effect certifying the Captured Assessed Value of the real and personal property of the Municipality and the County included in the TIF Plan and the diversion of Sales Tax Rebate TIF Revenues to the Municipality, in substantially the forms attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.

SECTION 10.09. BOOK-ENTRY ONLY SYSTEM. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary and unless specifically declined by the Purchaser of the Bonds, the Bonds shall be initially issued in the form of a separate, single, and fully registered Bond for each of the maturities thereof. In such case, upon initial issuance, the ownership of each such Bond shall be registered in the Bond Register in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of DTC, all of the Outstanding Bonds shall be registered in the Bond Register in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of DTC.

With respect to Bonds registered in the Bond Register in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of DTC, the Municipal and the Paying Agent shall have no responsibility or obligation to any participant for whom DTC is a security depository nominee (“DTC participants”) or to any Person on behalf of whom such a DTC participant holds an interest in the Bonds. Without limiting the immediately preceding sentence, the Municipality and the Paying Agent shall have no responsibility or obligation with respect to (a) the accuracy of the records of DTC, Cede & Co. or any DTC participant with respect to any ownership interest in the Bonds, (b) the delivery to any DTC participant or any other Person, other than a Registered Owner, as shown in the Bond Register, of any notice with respect to the Bonds, including any notice of redemption, or (c) the payment to any DTC participant or any other Person, other than a Registered Owner, as shown in the Bond Register, of any amount with respect to principal of, premium, if any, or interest on, the Bonds. Notwithstanding any other provision of the Bond Resolution to the contrary, the Municipal and the Paying Agent shall be entitled to treat and consider the Person in whose name each Bond is registered in the Bond Register as the absolute owner of such Bond for the purpose of payment of principal, premium, if any, and interest with respect to such Bond, for the purpose of giving notices of redemption and other matters with respect to such Bond, for the purpose of registering transfers with respect to such Bond, and for all other purposes whatsoever. The Paying Agent, shall pay all principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds only to or upon the order of the respective Registered Owners, as shown in the Bond Register as provided in the Bond Resolution, or their respective attorneys duly authorized in writing, and all such payments shall be valid and effective to fully satisfy and discharge the Municipality's obligations with respect to payment of principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds to the extent of the sum or sums so paid. No Person other than a Registered Owner, as shown in the Bond Register, shall receive a Bond certificate evidencing the obligation of the Municipality to make payments of principal, premium, if any, and interest pursuant to the Bond Resolution. Upon delivery by DTC to the Paying Agent of written notice to the effect that DTC has determined to substitute a new nominee in place of Cede & Co., and subject to the provisions in the Bond Resolution with respect to interest checks or drafts being mailed to the Registered Owner at the close of business on the

Record Date, the words “Cede & Co.” in the Bond Resolution shall refer to such new nominees of DTC.

In the event that the Municipality and the Paying Agent determine that DTC is incapable of discharging its responsibilities described herein and in the Representation Letter or that it is in the best interest of the beneficial owners of the Bonds that they be able to obtain certificated Bonds, the Municipality and the Paying Agent shall (a) appoint a successor securities depository, qualified to act as such under Section 17(a) of the Securities and Exchange Act of 1934, as amended, notify DTC and DTC participants of the appointment of such successor securities depository and transfer one or more separate Bond certificates to such successor securities depository or (b) notify DTC and DTC participants of the availability through DTC of Bond certificates and transfer one or more separate Bond certificates to DTC participants having Bonds credited to their DTC accounts. In such event, the Bonds shall no longer be restricted to being registered in the Bond Register in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of DTC, but may be registered in the name of the successor securities depository, or its nominee, or in whatever name or names Registered Owners transferring or exchanging Bonds shall designate, in accordance with the provisions of the Bond Resolution.

Notwithstanding any other provision of the Bond Resolution to the contrary, so long as any of the Bonds is registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of DTC, all payments with respect to principal of, premium, if any, and interest on such Bond and all notices with respect to such Bond shall be made and given, respectively, in the manner provided in the Representation Letter.

**ARTICLE XI.
FURTHER ACTION; REPEALING CLAUSE AND EFFECTIVE DATE;
DESIGNATION OF BONDS**

SECTION 11.01. FURTHER ACTION. The Mayor and the City Clerk are hereby authorized to execute such documents, instruments, certificates, and papers, and do such acts and things as may be necessary or appropriate in connection with the authorization, issuance, sale, validation, and delivery of the Bonds.

SECTION 11.02. REPEALING CLAUSE AND EFFECTIVE DATE. All ordinances, resolutions, or orders of the Governing Body in conflict with the provisions of the Bond Resolution shall be, and the same are hereby repealed, rescinded, and set aside, but only to the extent of such conflict. For cause, the Bond Resolution shall become effective immediately upon the adoption thereof.

SECTION 11.03. DEDICATION OF IMPROVEMENTS. If it is in the best interests of the Municipality, the provisions of the Act requiring dedication of the “redevelopment project” to the Municipality shall not apply to such improvements that are constructed on the privately-owned portion of the Project.

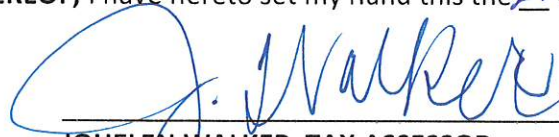

Basis for Award: The Bonds will be awarded to the Purchaser producing the lowest interest cost to the Municipality and with the terms most advantageous to the Municipality, including, but not limited to, Paying Agent fees, underwriting fees, bank counsel fees, and early redemption provisions.

Investment Letter: The Purchaser will be required to deliver an Institutional Investment Letter to the Municipality, the Municipal Advisor, and Bond Counsel, which also states, among other usual and customary matters, that it intends to hold the obligation until maturity, early redemption, or mandatory tender, and has performed its own due diligence, evaluation, and investment decision without reliance upon others.

PROCEDURES FOR POST-ISSUANCE COMPLIANCE
TAX-EXEMPT FINANCINGS

General

The purpose of these Procedures for Post-Issuance Compliance, Tax-Exempt Financings (the “Procedures”) is to ensure that the tax-exempt financings of the City of Starkville, Mississippi (the “Municipality” or the “Issuer”), remain in compliance with the following federal tax requirements:

- Record retention
- Arbitrage yield restriction and rebate
- Proper and timely use of bond proceeds and bond-financed property
- Timely return filings
- Corrective actions
- Other general requirements

These Procedures apply to any obligations to which Sections 103 and 141 through 150 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and any Treasury Regulations promulgated thereunder (together, as applicable, the “Code”) apply. The Issuer shall comply with any requirements set forth in the Code and subsequent rulings and other advice published by the Internal Revenue Service (the “Service” or the “IRS”), as such authorities may apply to the Issuer and its obligations.

The “Financing”

There are different types of obligations that can evidence a tax exempt loan including but not limited to bonds, notes, obligations, leases, or installment sales transactions. This document refers to “bonds” but applies to all of these types of transactions and all such debt instruments.

Responsible Parties

The Issuer designates the City Clerk of the Municipality and the Director of Finance of the Municipality (together, the “Responsible Party”) as the primary person responsible for compliance with this policy. The Responsible Party will coordinate efforts with the Board and parties working with the Issuer on financings and the operation of bond-financed facilities to ensure that any actions taken with respect to bond-financed facilities will be in compliance with the requirements of the Code and rulings of the IRS.

General Recordkeeping

The Issuer will maintain a copy of the following documents on file at all times:

- Audited Financial Statements for each of the years that tax-exempt bonds are outstanding

- Reports of any examinations by the IRS of the Issuer or its tax-exempt financings for, or in relation to conduit transactions with, the Issuer

With respect to each issue of tax-exempt bonds, the Issuer hereby requires, and each Issuer agrees to retain, the following for the life of the bonds plus three years:

- Financing transcript
- Minutes and resolution(s) authorizing the issue
- Certifications of issue price
- Any formal elections (e.g., election to employ an accounting methodology other than specific tracing)
- Appraisals, demand surveys, and/or feasibility studies for bond-financed property
- Government grant documentation related to construction, renovation, or purchase of bond-financed facilities
- Bond Trustee or bank statements regarding investment and expenditures of bond funds
- Any agreement listed in “Private Business Use” (below) that relates to a bond-financed facility

Separate Bank Account

Many of the Code provisions related to tax-exempt bonds pertain to how bond proceeds are invested, and when such bond proceeds are spent. The Issuer will establish a separate bank account or trust fund for bond proceeds and keep records for any such account showing:

- All expenditures on the bond-financed property
- Investment of bond proceeds

Investments and Arbitrage Compliance

Many of the Code provisions deal with restrictions if bond proceeds are invested at a yield higher than the yield on the bonds. The Responsible Party is responsible for monitoring such investments, and taking steps to ensure compliance with the yield restriction requirements of Section 148(a) of the Code and the rebate requirements of section 148(f) of the Code. Such monitoring includes, but is not limited to:

- tracking the allocation of bond proceeds to expenditures for compliance with any temporary period and spending exceptions, no less frequently than annually
- ensuring that any forms required to be filed with the IRS relating to arbitrage or rebate and any payments required pursuant thereto are filed in a timely manner
- ensuring that “fair market value” is used with respect to the purchase and sale of investments

Additionally, the Responsible Party shall monitor compliance with rebate and yield restriction rules on an annual basis.

With respect to each issue of tax-exempt bonds, the Issuer agrees to retain the following for the life of the bonds plus three years:

- Documentation of allocations of investments of bond proceeds and calculations of investment earnings
- Documentation for investments of bond proceeds related to:
 - a) Investment contracts (e.g., guaranteed investment contracts)
 - b) Credit enhancement transactions (e.g., bond insurance contracts)
 - c) Financial derivatives (e.g., swaps, caps, etc.)
 - d) Bidding of financial products
- Documentation regarding arbitrage compliance, including:
 - a) Computation of bond yield
 - b) Computation of rebate and yield reduction payments
 - c) Form 8038-T, *Arbitrage Rebate, Yield Reduction and Penalty in Lieu of Arbitrage Rebate*
 - d) Form 8038-R, *Request for Recovery of Overpayments Under Arbitrage Rebate Provisions*

Expenditures and Assets

The Code generally requires that at least 85% of bond proceeds are to be expended on the project within three years of the date the bonds are issued.

The Responsible Party is responsible for oversight of the expenditure of bond proceeds, including monitoring whether such expenditures are made in a timely manner for the purposes for which the bonds were authorized. The Responsible Party will ensure that all proceeds of a bond issue are allocated to expenditures by the later of 18 months after the expenditure was made or the date the project is placed in service (and in no event, later than 60 days after (i) the fifth anniversary of the issue date or (ii) retirement of the issue).

With respect to each issue of tax-exempt bonds, the Issuer shall retain the following for the life of the bonds plus three years:

- Documentation of allocations of bond proceeds to expenditures (e.g., allocation of bond proceeds for expenditures for the construction, renovation or purchase of facilities)
- Documentation of allocations of bond proceeds to bond issuance costs
- Copies of all requisitions, draw schedules, draw requests, invoices, bills, and cancelled checks related to bond proceeds spent during the construction period
- Copies of all contracts entered into for the construction, renovation or purchase of bond-financed facilities
- Records of expenditure reimbursements incurred prior to issuing bonds for bond-financed facilities
- List or schedule of all bond-financed facilities or equipment
- Depreciation schedules for bond-financed depreciable property
- Documentation of any purchase or sale of bond-financed assets

Private Business Use

The legal and tax restrictions on private use of tax-exempt bond-financed property are set forth in detail in the applicable federal tax certificate executed in connection with the issue of tax-exempt bonds.

Generally, private use results from the sale or lease of tax-exempt bond-financed property or the granting of special legal entitlements to a private business or the Federal government. Private business use can also result from contracts that permit private business activities to be conducted using bond-financed property or from research performed in a tax-exempt bond-financed facility for private parties or the Federal government.

Any material agreement that permits a private business or the Federal government to use tax-exempt bond-financed property should be reviewed by bond counsel prior to execution. Annually, a general review of the use of tax-exempt bond-financed facilities should be conducted. Tax-exempt bond-financed property should not be sold or leased without first consulting with bond counsel.

Corrective Action

A corrective action may be required if, for example, it is determined that bond proceeds were not properly expended, the Issuer is not in compliance with the arbitrage requirements imposed by the Code or the Issuer has taken a deliberate action that results in impermissible private business use (e.g., sale or lease of bond-financed property) or entering a management contract with a private company for that facility. If the Issuer determines or is advised that corrective action is necessary with respect to any issue of its tax-exempt obligations, the Issuer will in a timely manner:

- seek to enter into a closing agreement under the Tax-Exempt Bonds Voluntary Closing Agreement Program described in Notice 2001-60 (or any successor notice thereto)
- take remedial action described under Section 1.141-12 of the Code
- take such other action as recommended by bond counsel

Internal Revenue Service Examination of Bonds

In the event that bonds issued by the Issuer are selected for examination by the IRS, the Issuer shall retain qualified and experienced counsel to represent the Issuer and shall work with such counsel to provide such documents and information requested by the IRS as are in the possession of the Issuer.

Policy Supplemental to all Existing Policies

This Policy is supplemental to all existing policies of the Issuer.

Dear Berk:

This letter will confirm the selection by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen (the “Governing Body”) of the City of Starkville, Mississippi (the “Municipality”), of Watkins & Eager PLLC to act as Bond Counsel with respect to any issuance of the above captioned bonds for the above-captioned project (the “Bonds”). This letter will also set forth the role and responsibilities we propose to undertake as Bond Counsel to the Municipality and the terms upon which we understand we will undertake those responsibilities and be compensated by you for performing in such role.

Proceeds of the Bonds are expected to be used to provide funds to pay the costs of improvements to road and bridge infrastructure of the Municipality and to pay the related costs of the authorization, issuance, sale, validation, and delivery of the Bonds.

Scope of Engagement and Duties to Be Performed

As Bond Counsel, our chief function is to render an objective legal opinion with respect to the authorization and issuance of the Bonds, the validity and binding effect of the Bonds, the source of payment and security for the Bonds, and the excludability of interest on the Bonds from gross income for federal and State of Mississippi income tax purposes. Assuming that no legal impediments to the issuance of the Bonds become apparent, we would contemplate furnishing to the financial institution or other party purchasing the Bonds (the “Purchaser”) our approving opinion as to the validity of the Bonds, which opinion will be executed and delivered by us in written form on the date the Bonds are exchanged for their purchase price (the “Closing”), and will be based on facts and law existing as of its date. Upon delivery of the opinion with respect to the original issuance of the Bonds, our responsibilities as Bond Counsel will be concluded with respect to this financing.

In addition to rendering our approving opinion upon the issuance of the Bonds, we will draft or review the basic legal documents required for authorization, securing, issuance, and sale of the Bonds, and all related Municipality proceedings and resolutions which might be required. We will undertake or coordinate validation proceedings under Mississippi law. We will also prepare or furnish the incidental closing documents (excepting those customarily prepared or furnished by the Municipality or Purchaser or their respective counsel), including various certificates to be signed by the Municipality, and the form of opinion which will be required from the Municipality's counsel.

In addition, in connection with the delivery of our opinion, we may require that the proceedings for the issuance of such Bonds include other items, including the following:

- (a) certificates from the Municipality's officials dealing with incumbency, financial condition, litigation, regulatory approval, due authorization, and various factual matters;
- (b) certificates from other parties to the transaction and/or opinions of counsel to such parties, as applicable.

Although we ordinarily draft suggested forms for these and other customary closing papers, we do not assume responsibility for verifying the truth of facts certified as true by others, nor, except as necessary to our opinion, do we assume responsibility for examining legal questions on which other participating lawyers are asked to opine.

We assume that we will have the full cooperation of the Municipality, the Purchaser, and any others necessary to successfully complete this financing, including counsel to the parties. We cannot, of course, guarantee the timing or outcome of legislative or judicial processes or other actions necessary to complete the financing.

Compensation and Reimbursement

We propose that our fees as Bond Counsel for the issuance of the Bonds will be an amount to be negotiated, plus expenses.

Our fee will be based upon (i) our current understanding of the terms, structure, size, and schedule of the financings which may be represented by the Bonds, (ii) the duties we will undertake pursuant to this engagement letter, (iii) the time we anticipate devoting to the financings, and (iv) the responsibilities we will assume in connection therewith. If unusual or unforeseen circumstances arise which require a significant increase in our time or responsibility, we will consult with you regarding further handling and any possible adjustment to our fee amount. In addition to our fees for services, our bills will include expenses and costs normally associated with representations of this kind.

You have the right to discharge us, and we have the right to withdraw, for any reason at any time upon reasonable notice. If we elect to withdraw, you will take all steps necessary to free us of any obligation to perform further, including the execution of any documents necessary to

complete our withdrawal. In the event of our withdrawal or discharge, we will be entitled to retain any fees for services provided before the date of our withdrawal or discharge, as well as to compensation for the reasonable value of our services actually rendered. We also will be entitled to reimbursement of any costs and expenses paid or incurred on your behalf up to the effective date of withdrawal or discharge.

Documents and Files

Subsequent to the Closing, we will provide you with a copy of the Closing transcript relating to the issuance of the Bonds. In addition, any documents or related materials which you have provided to us in connection with our participation in the transaction will be returned to you at your request. All other documents, materials, and work product of any kind shall constitute our own files and property and will be retained or discarded at any time at our sole discretion.

Waiver of Conflicts

From time to time this firm represents clients, including in connection with a variety of unrelated matters in which the Municipality is involved. These matters may include, but are not limited to, proceedings before the various federal, state, and local governing bodies and boards, agencies, and commissions in which the interest of our client is adverse to the Municipality.

We have reviewed the relationship between our responsibilities as Bond Counsel (which will primarily consist of drafting documents, consulting as to debt options and responsibilities, and rendering one or more opinions with respect to the Bonds) and our representation of other clients, in unrelated matters as described above, and we have concluded that the performance of our responsibilities as Bond Counsel will not be affected by our representation of other clients.

It is our understanding that the Municipality consents to or waives any conflict of interest which may arise as a result of any current representations in unrelated matters. Your acceptance of this engagement letter will evidence that consent.

Miscellaneous

Once the Bonds are issued, our engagement as Bond Counsel will be completed. Except the completion and distribution of the transcripts, we will have no further obligations as Bond Counsel with regard to the Bonds.

Our willingness to undertake the functions described herein is based upon the facts available to us at this time. Nothing has come to our attention which would lead us to conclude that there are any legal obstacles to delivery of the Bonds. We will proceed with the understanding that should anything come to our attention prior to the issuance of the Bonds which would, in our opinion, cast doubt upon the legality of transaction, we will not be obligated to render our approving legal opinion.

If the foregoing terms are satisfactory to you, please indicate by returning the enclosed copy of this letter signed by an authorized person, retaining the original for your files.

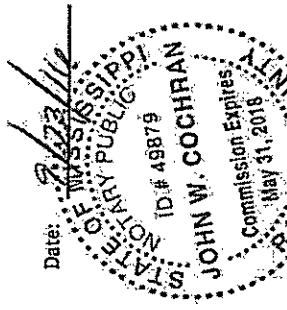

SUMMARY:

This is a request for Preliminary Plat approval for a 163-lot single dwelling unit subdivision. The property is located at the southwest corner of the intersection of Mockingbird Road and MS Hwy 182. The property is zoned TN-N (Traditional Neighborhood New). The gross acreage is +/- 51.09 with a proposed total of 163 lots. The proposed gross density is 3.19 units per acre. Electrical service will be provided by 4 County. Water and sewer service will be provided by Starkville Utilities.

On May 1, 2026 the Development Review Committee approved the Preliminary Plat with five recommended conditions of approval. The recommended conditions are considered necessary by staff for the long-term maintenance of subdivision infrastructure. On May 12, 2026, the Planning and Zoning Commission unanimously recommended approval with the five staff recommended conditions of approval. The following conditions of approval are recommended by Starkville Utilities, the Engineering Department, and the Planning and Zoning Commission:

1. All lots shown on this Preliminary Plat are subject to an all-encompassing 5-foot utility easement.
2. The Hydrologic & Hydraulic study must be updated to reflect proposed conditions accounting for all fill, final grading, site layout, conveyance and hydraulic structures, and detention systems. The study must model and display the 2, 10, 25, and 100-year inundation lines based on the proposed conditions. The study should include Josey Creek and the two internal tributaries traversing the property. The H&H should identify the floodway boundary.
3. Any proposed buildings located within the 100-year inundation area shall have Finished Floor Elevations (FFE) no less than 2' above the 100-year water surface elevation.
4. The proposed development shall not increase the water surface elevation or inundation footprint on any existing properties south of Josey Creek, as evidenced with a City-approved Hydrologic & Hydraulic study.
5. All streets within the development are required to install a minimum of a twenty-four inch non-expansive buffer below the soil cement or crushed stone subbase.

If approved, the next step would be review of the infrastructure plans by the Development Review Committee. Once plans are approved, work of the subdivision can begin. After the infrastructure has been inspected and approved by city staff, the applicant can apply for final plat approval.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This is a request for Preliminary Plat approval for a 163-lot single dwelling unit subdivision. The property is located at the southwest corner of the intersection of Mockingbird Road and MS Hwy 182. The lot is zoned TN-N with the property number 103B-00-003.01. Previously the applicant had applied for a Special Exception for the use of townhomes on the property. That request was ultimately denied and has no bearing on the current request.

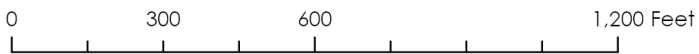
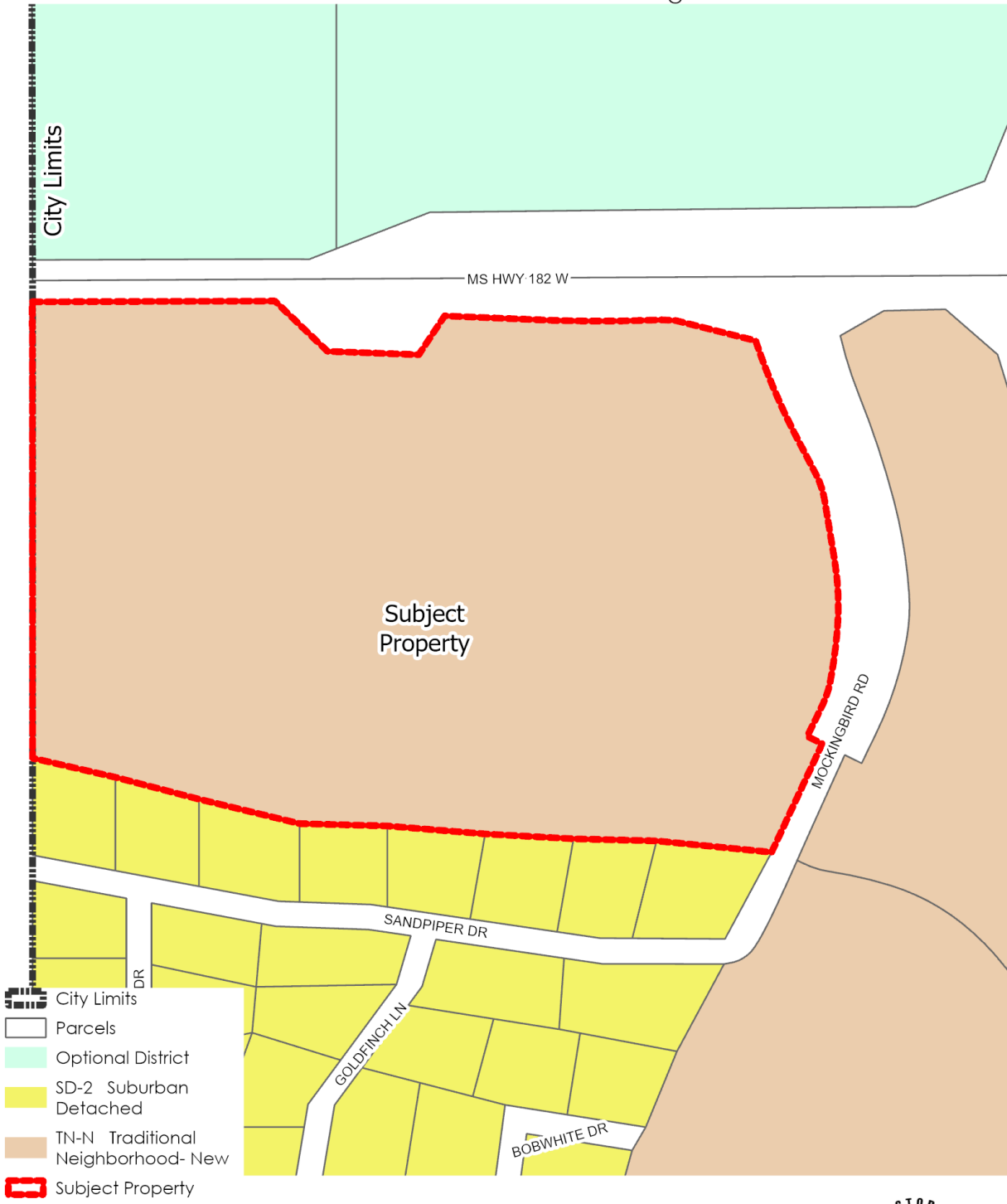
Attachment 1- PP 25-01 Aerial

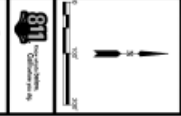


Attachment 2- PP 25-01 Zoning



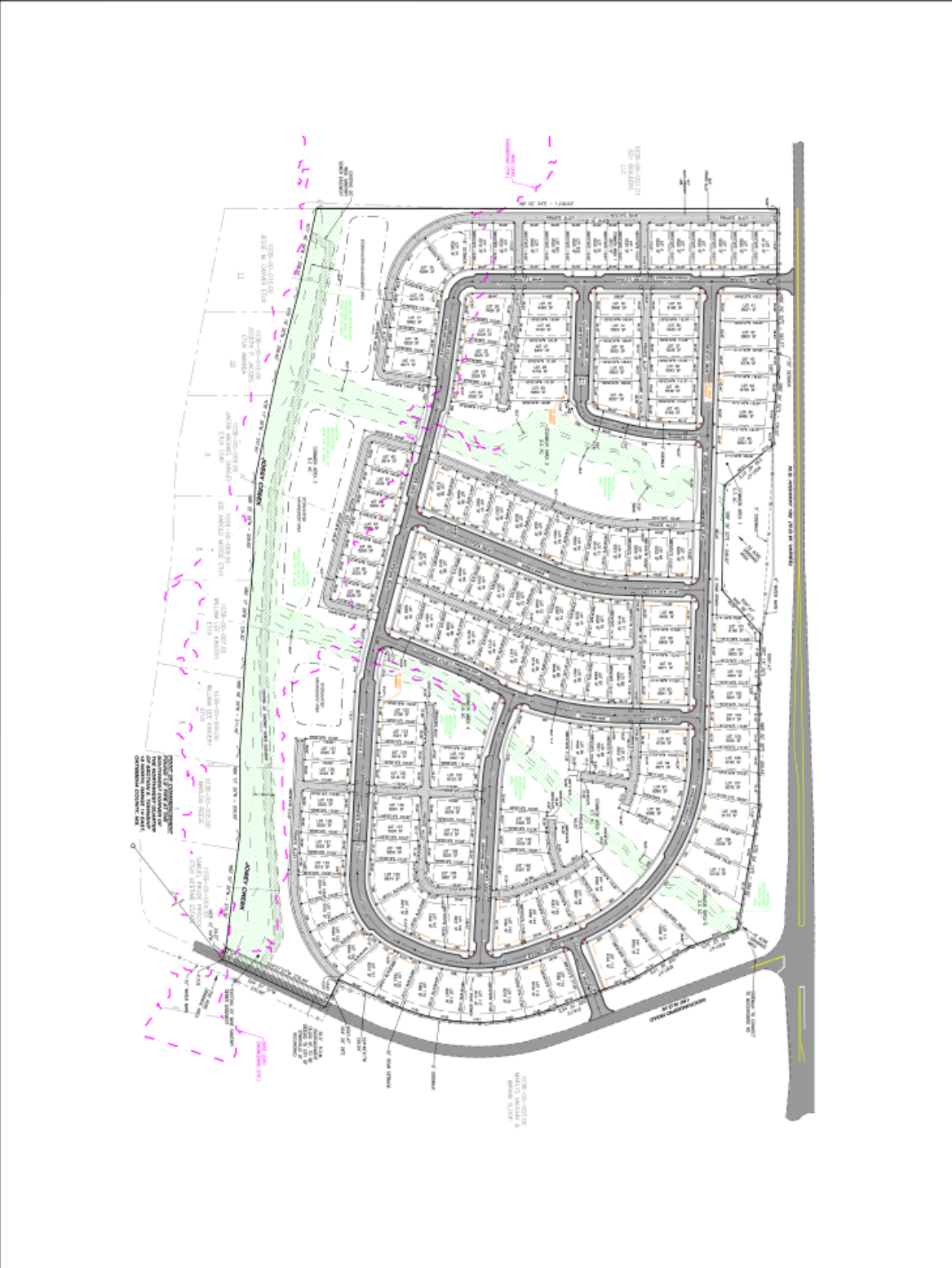

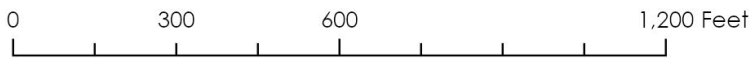

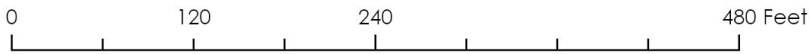

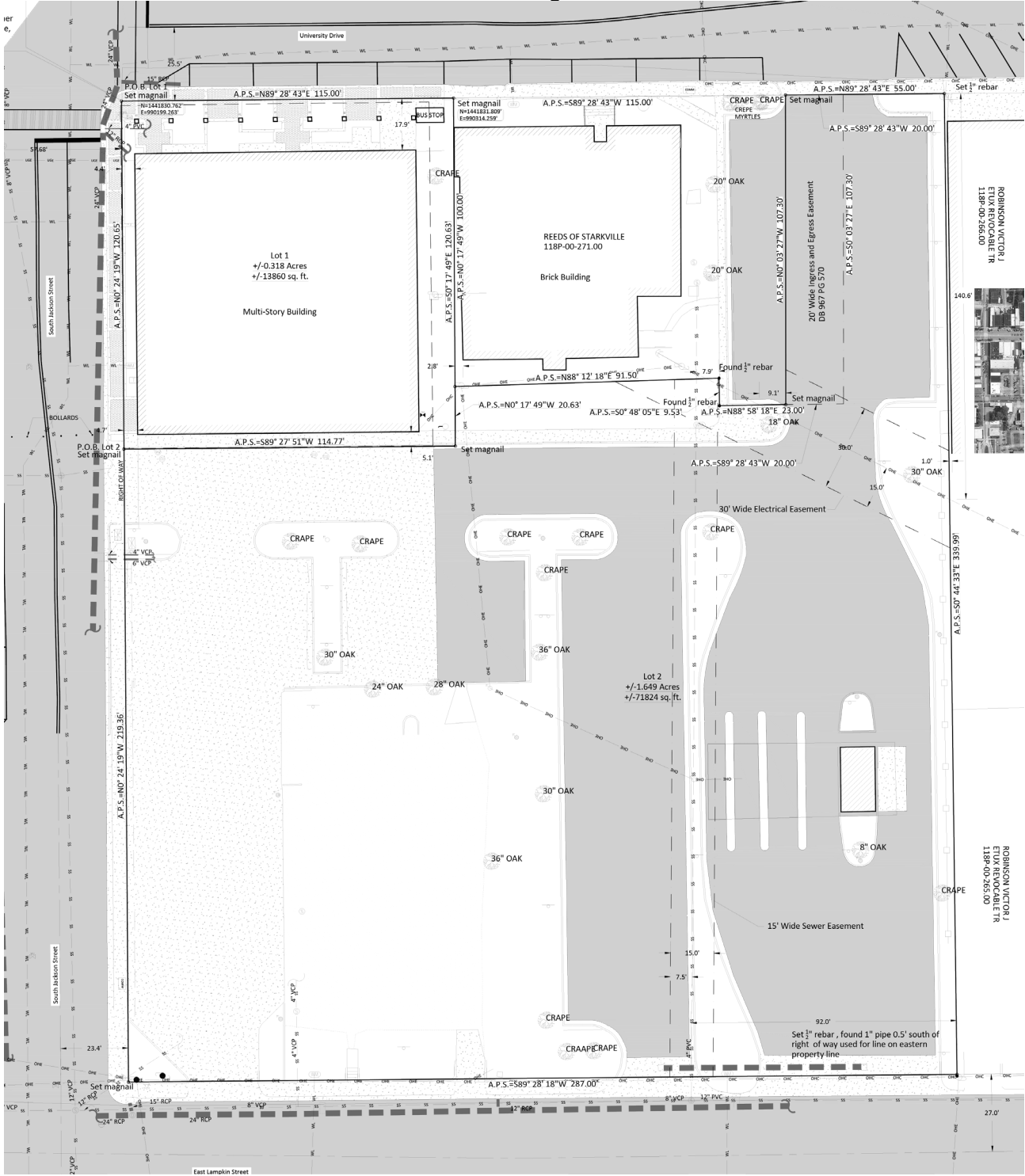
Attachment 2- FP 26-05 Zoning

The Grantor and Grantee are sometimes hereinafter referred to individually as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

Preliminary Statement

Grantor is the owner in fee of certain real property located in Oktibbeha County, Mississippi consisting of approximately 0.184 acres more particularly described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein (the "Subject Property").

The Subject Property is depicted in Exhibit "B". Grantor intends herein to grant to Grantee certain easements for pedestrian and vehicular ingress and egress over the roadways, curb cuts, driveways, aisles, walkways, and sidewalks now or hereafter located on the Subject Property for access and for delivery, together with the utility easements described herein. The Grantor and Grantee also intend herein to provide for certain obligations and restrictions with respect to the operation and maintenance of the Subject Property and improvements constructed thereon. Such easements, obligations, and restrictions shall run to the benefit of, and bind, the Subject Property and the owners from time to time of the Subject Property or any portion thereof. The purpose of the easement noted above and described below is for construction and maintenance of a Multi-Use Path through the Subject Property.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, the parties hereby grant, covenant and agree as follows:

1. Easements and Ways. Grantor hereby grants and conveys to Grantee, a permanent and perpetual non-exclusive easement on, over and across and rights to use the curb cuts, roadways, access areas, driveways, aisles, parking areas, walkways and sidewalks (the "Ways") now or hereafter located on the Subject Property for purposes of constructing the Multi-Use Path depicted in Exhibit B, maintaining the Subject Property, and for ingress, egress, passage and delivery, by vehicles and pedestrians.
2. Benefit and Use. The easements and other rights granted hereby shall be dedicated as a permanent, perpetual easement for the public, for pedestrian and other use, to be maintained by the City of Starkville.
3. Construction. Grantee, at its sole expense, shall initially construct, pave, stripe, and place all improvements and markings on the surface of the Subject Property as necessary and provide for the orderly traffic control and ingress and egress of automobiles and pedestrians and shall place adequate exit and entrance and other traffic control signs to direct traffic in and out of said areas during construction.
4. Maintenance and Repair. Grantee, at Grantee's sole expense, shall have the sole responsibility for the maintenance and repair of the Subject Property and the Multi-Use Path located thereon, including, without limitation, the obligation to repave and replace improvements and markings on the surface of the Subject Property from time to time as and when necessary so as to provide for the orderly pedestrian control and ingress and egress of pedestrians and, to the extent necessary, place and maintain adequate exit and entrance and other traffic control signs to direct traffic in and out of said areas. Grantee, at its sole expense, will maintain the Subject Property and the Multi-Use Path located thereon in a neat, clean, and orderly condition consistent with its maintenance and upkeep of other dedicated areas and pathways in the City.

5. Utility Easements: Grantor grants to Grantee a perpetual, non-exclusive utility easement over, under and across the Subject Property for the purpose of installing, maintaining, repairing and replacing the following utilities: underground water, underground sewer, above or underground electrical, above or underground telephone and above or underground fiber or cable; provided, however, that the following terms and conditions are met: (i) any damages to the encumbered estate caused by the Grantee in relation to the utility easement shall be repaired immediately by such Grantee; and (ii) all work related to the installation, maintaining, repair, and replacement of the utilities installed pursuant hereto in a manner and at a time that has the least impact to the Grantor.
6. Indemnification. To the fullest extent authorized by applicable law, Grantee shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless Grantor against any and claims, suits, causes of action, regulatory proceedings, or damages arising from or related to Grantee's use of the Subject Property or Grantee's acts or omissions related to the Subject Property.
7. Non-waiver. No delay or omission of either Party in the exercise of any right accruing upon any default of any other Party shall impair such right or be construed to be a waiver thereof, and every such right may be exercised at any time during the continuance of such default. A waiver by either Party of a breach of, or a default in, any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement by the other Party shall not be construed to be a waiver of any subsequent breach of, or default in the same or any other provision of this Agreement. Except as otherwise specifically provided in this Agreement, (i) no remedy provided in this Agreement shall be exclusive but each shall be cumulative with all other remedies provided in this Agreement and (ii) all remedies at law or in equity shall be available.
8. Relationship of Parties. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to make the Parties partners or joint venturers or render the parties liable for the debts or obligations of the other.
9. Grantor's Reservation. Grantor expressly reserves for itself, its successors and assigns, the right to use the easement areas, so long as such use does not unreasonably interfere with the rights herein granted. Grantee shall be responsible for any damage to Grantor's adjacent property or that of third parties resulting from exercise of Grantee's rights herein granted, including but not limited to soil erosion, subsidence, or damage resulting therefrom. Grantee shall promptly repair and restore to its original condition any of Grantor's adjacent property that may be altered, damaged, or destroyed in connection with the exercise of the easement or use of the easement area.
10. Grantee's Non-Use. Grantor shall have the right to terminate this easement and all the rights granted herein any time after one year of continuous non-use of the easement area by the Grantee for its intended purpose. In the event of such termination, the easement shall be quitclaimed from the Grantee to the Grantor, without expense to the Grantor, and any and all interest in Grantor's property conveyed in this easement shall automatically revert to Grantor or its successors or assigns, without the necessity of any further action to effect said reversion. On demand by Grantor, Grantee shall promptly remove any and all materials it installed in, on, under or above the easement area.

11. Subordination. This conveyance is subject to all liens, encumbrances, covenants, conditions, restrictions, reservations, contracts, leases, licenses, easements and rights of way of record pertaining to Grantor's property of which the easement is a portion, thereof, whether or not of record. The use of the word "grant" shall not imply any warranty on the part of the Grantor with respect to the easement or easement area.

12. Compensation. Grantor understands that it has the right to receive just compensation for the permanent easement described herein support by an appraisal of the Subject Property. Grantor waives its right to just compensation and donates the Subject Property for the purposes of construction of a Multi-Use Path that will benefit MSU students and all parties to this Agreement.

Grantee shall be responsible for any damage to Grantor's adjacent property or that of third parties resulting from exercise of Grantee's rights herein granted, including but not limited to soil erosion, subsidence, or damage resulting therefrom. Grantee shall promptly repair and restore to its original condition any of Grantor's adjacent property that may be altered, damaged, or destroyed in connection with the exercise of the easement or use of the easement area.
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12. Compensation. Grantor understands that it has the right to receive just compensation for the permanent easement described herein support by an appraisal of the Subject Property. Grantor waives its right to just compensation and donates the Subject Property for the purposes of construction of a Multi-Use Path that will benefit MSU students and all parties to this Agreement.

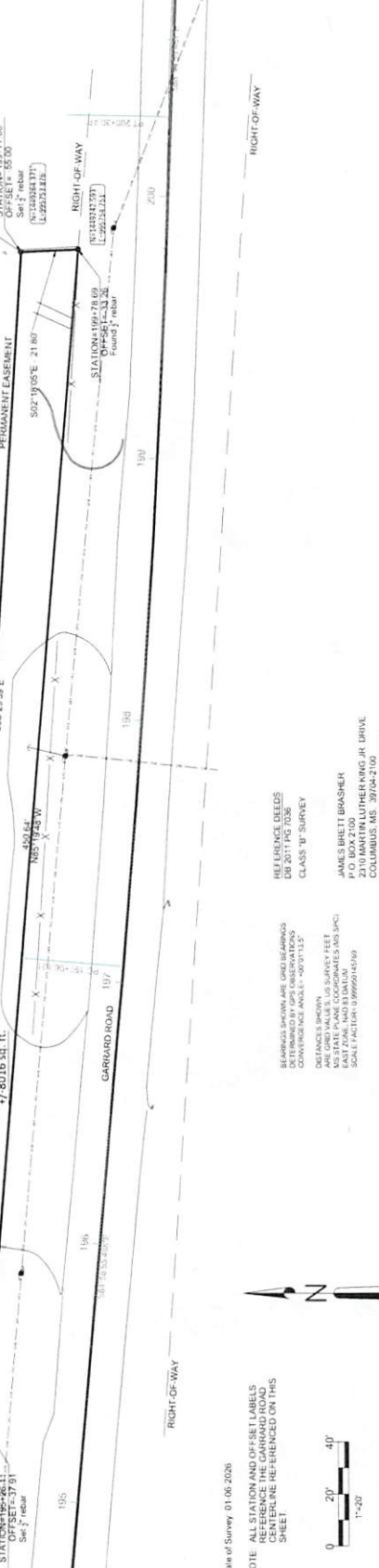

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This agreement made and entered into by and between the town of/city of/County of Starkville, Mississippi, hereinafter referred to as “town/city/County” and the Starkville Main Street Association, hereinafter referred to as “Program Applicant” is as follows:

WHEREAS, the town/city/County is applying for a Mississippi Main Street Revitalization Grant (MMSRG) for and on behalf of the Program Applicant;

WHEREAS, the town/city/County and Program Applicant are required to enter into a written agreement specifying the terms and conditions of the relationship of the town/city/County and Program Applicant;

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and adequacy of which are acknowledged, the town/city/County and Program Applicant agrees as follows:

1. The town/city/County’s responsibilities shall be the following:
 - a) The town/city/County agrees to abide by all rules, regulations, terms, and conditions of the MMSRG Program.
 - b) The town/city/County will maintain files and adequate bookkeeping records related to the project.
 - c) Maintain accurate financial records, including invoices, receipts, and disbursement documentation, in accordance with audit requirements.
 - d) Process payments and reimbursements in a timely manner, contingent upon receipt of proper documentation from the Program Applicant.
 - e) Provide oversight of the project to ensure activities are completed in accordance with the approved scope of work and budget developed by the Program Applicant.
 - f) Designate a primary point of contact for coordination with the Program Applicant.

2. The Program Applicant’s responsibilities shall be the following:
 - a) The Program Applicant agrees to abide by all rules, regulations, terms, and conditions of the MMSRG Program.
 - b) The Program Applicant will maintain files and adequate bookkeeping records related to the project.
 - c) Serve as the lead entity for project development, including defining the project scope, budget, and supporting documentation for the grant application.
 - d) Carry out the day-to-day implementation and management of the project in accordance with the approved scope, timeline, and budget.
 - e) Comply with all MMSRG program requirements, including procurement standards, documentation, and reporting.
 - f) Maintain complete and organized project records, including contracts, invoices, proof of payment, and other required documentation, and submit these to the City/County as requested.

- g) Provide regular progress updates (at minimum monthly or as otherwise agreed) to the City/County.
- h) Ensure all project activities are completed within the grant period and meet all required deadlines.
- i) Be responsible for the ongoing maintenance and sustainability of any project improvements, if applicable.
- j) Designate a primary point of contact to coordinate with the City/County.

Both parties agree to:

- a) Maintain regular communication throughout the project.
 - b) Participate in scheduled check-ins or meetings as needed.
 - c) Promptly notify the other party of any issues that may impact project timelines, budget, or compliance.
3. Terms of this agreement shall be effective and binding upon approval and award of a grant to the town/city/County by the Mississippi Development Authority of the State of Mississippi and remain in effect until project completion and closeout.

Either party may terminate this Agreement with written notice, provided that all financial obligations and compliance requirements are satisfied. This Agreement represents the full understanding between the parties and may only be amended in writing and signed by both parties.

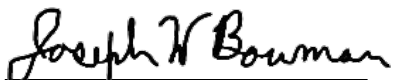
